Gerry didn't fall, but said he had to stop three or four times to keep from it.


So... Maybe it isn't quite the end of an era, for there are rematches oming up. But Prefontaine's first big six-mile and/or cross country are effort was a dandy.

Prefontaine 2 NOU 69 victorious Eugene Reg-Guard in 1st start

CORVALLIS - As a high school track man, Steve Prefontaine left few stones unturned: national two mile record holder, state record holder in the mile and the two mile, and a member of the U.S. track team which toured Europe this sum-

That's not a bad career. Saturday, he showed that he is ready for the top college competitors also, leading the University of Oregon to a convincing victory in the NCAA District 8 cross country meet at Avery Park.

Little Gerry Lindgren of Washington State found out the hard way, finishing in second place some 150 yards behind the Coos Bay freshman.

"Pre" was timed in a record 29:13.8 (the old mark was 29:47.5 set by OSU's Tracy Smith in 1966), while Lindgren hit the tape in 29:41.0.

Duck runners took six of the top eight places: Steve Savage in third, Mike McClendon fourth, Norm Trerise fifth, Tom Morrow sixth and Terry Dooley eighth.

The Ducks, the only team to wear spikes over the course, finished with 19 points, Washington State with 44, Oregon State with 83, and Washington


