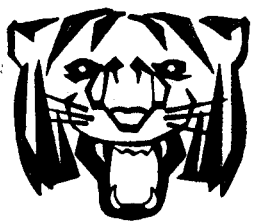

HAYS, Kan.--Defending national champion Fort Hays State tuned up for the Nov. 22 NAIA finals with a first-place finish in the first annual Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference cross country championships Nov. 8 at the Fort Hays Country Club.

The Tigers totaled only 33 points to runnerup Adams (Colo.) State College's 45.

Emporia State Teacher's College, favored with the Tigers for the title, finished third with 60 points, followed by Kansas State College at Pittsburg, 106; Western State (Colo.) College, 129; University of Nebraska at Omaha, 161; Colorado State College, 178, and Southern Colorado State College, 217.

FHS sophomores Larbi Oukada and Alvin Penka paced the Tigers with a one-two finish. Oukada won the five-mile race in 24:36, trailed by Penka's 24:52.

Emporia State's Dennis Delmott was third in 25:03, followed by Adams State's Bob Montoya, fourth, 25:13, and KSC's Mike Nixson, fifth, 25:17.
