Alameda's varsity team finished 1-2-3-4-6-8 to win the varsity with 16 points, easily placing ahead of El Cerrito in second with 69 markers.

Joe Taxiera was clocked in 17.02 to break the course record of 17.21.7 set a year ago by Pat Ortez, also of Alameda, who has been able to see only limited action this year due to a sprained ligament.

Alameda was nosed out in the JVs by El Cerrito, 27 to 29, but Donald Kreiss of Alameda also broke a record when he finished in 17.56. The old mark was set in 1969 by Rich Wooten at 18.52.

The Hornets might have had another mark if Jim Ortez in the frosh-soph race had not missed a turn and was forced to re-run part of the course. Jim came within seven seconds of the mark held by Manuel Ecans of El Cerrito.

Alameda has now won two out of three titles in the varsity, JVs and frosh-soph in the last three years for a real dominance in the sport.

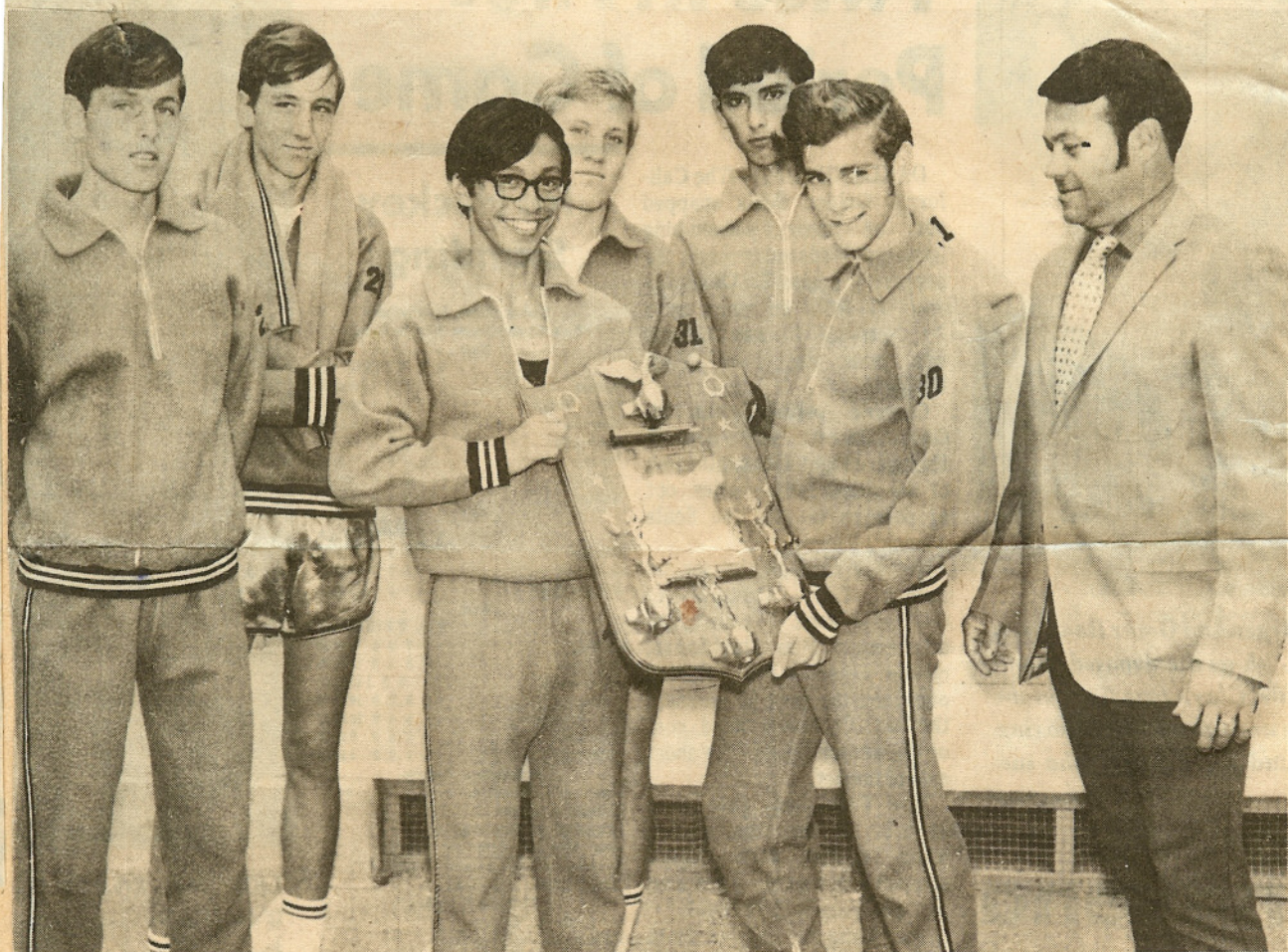
