

# Alameda's Harriers Win With Ease

Joe Taxiera of Alameda came in first in the unbeaten Hornets' 15th cross-country win of the season over a three-mile course yesterday at Alvarado Park in Richmond.

Jerry Oliver — also of Alameda — was second, as both were timed in 16:06, a course record.

This was Alameda's 28th win in a row. The school has won 40 out of its last 42 cross-country meets.

# Joe Taxiera Sets Record For Course

Alameda high school cross country runners finished the round robin part of their season on a high note, and are ready to defend their ACAL championship.

Coach Bill Thompson's Hornets won over El Cerrito, Berkeley and Kennedy, established a new course record, and now have a 15-0 record for the 1970 season.

The Hornets won their 28 meet in a row and have won 40 out of 42 events extending back over a three year period.

Alameda JVs also won their events also finish the season with an 11-0 mark, and are unbeaten over a three year period with 34 victories in a row.

Joe Taxiera of Alameda broke the record over the Albarado course with a time of 16:16 as he edged his teammate, Jerry Oliver by inches. Oliver had set the record at 16:14 a week ago. Taxiera, Oliver and Bob Immethun, who finished third were all under the old record.

Pat Ortez, ACAL defending champion, who is recovering from a strained knee ligament tested himself in the reserve race yesterday. He won the event in record time 8:37.6, breaking the mark of another Alamedan, Rich Wooten set in 1968 at 9:03.

Besides Ortez, Alameda was without the services of two of its varsity runners — Dale Cadwallader and Doug Kreiss — out with "flue" attacks.
