Joe Taxiera Sets Mark For Course

On the way to the defense of the ACAL cross country championship, the Alameda Hornets completly dominated the south division race yesterday over the Joaquin Miller course in the Oakland foothills.

Coach Bill Thompson's Hornets won the varsity, the junior varsity, the frosh-soph and reserve races to demonstrate both speed and depth in the distance running sports.

Alameda won the varsity by sweeping the first seven places, the junior varsity 1-2-3-4-5-6-and 9, the soph-frosh 1-2-3-4-5-6-and 8, and in the reserves went 1-2-3-6-8-9-16-17.

Challenging Alameda in the field was Encinal from the other end of the city and in all races it was either the Jets and Hornets filling all places before an outside school came in 12th.

Joe Taxiera broke the Alameda high school record for the Joaquin Miller corse when he was clocked in 17:32.3, bettering the mark of 17:41.5 set earlier this year by Pat Ortez before he was injured.

Bob Immethun, second placer for Alameda, also broke the ASH record for a junior

with a time of 17:38.
