

Templeman sparks Carlmont to victory

SAN FRANCISCO — Hans Templeman and his Carlmont High cross country team remained undefeated Thursday by running away with a high school center meet at Golden Gate Park in San Francisco.

Templeman scored his sixth straight triumph of the young season, breaking the new Golden Gate course record with a time of 1:49.

Carlmont mates Steve Miller (12:04) and Scott Harvey (12:08) finished second and third while another Scot, Russ Black (12:22) checked in sixth in a field of 140 runners.

Coach Loren Lansberry's Scots compiled a low team score of 25 compared to runnerup Awalts 54 and third-place Los Altos' 122. San Carlos was the second best SPAL entry, coming in fourth at 128.

Carlmont has won all six of its meets this year, outscoring 31 teams in the process.

The Scot junior varsity also remained undefeated Thursday, with Roark Mulligan's winning clocking of 13:07 pacing a run-away victory.

Carlmont also won the freshman race, edging Los Altos 57-62, but Gunn prevented a Scot sweep by edging Carlmont 65-69 in the sophomore run.
