## Woodside Varsity, Freshman Harriers top M-A Meet.

Woodside High had winners in all three classifications — Varsity, Junior Varsity and Freshman — in last Monday's four-team cross-country meet at Menlo-Atherton.

Woodside's John Marks topped the Varsity race with Menlo-Atherton's junior John Barbour finishing second. Marks' 10:53.5 time for the 2.2 mile course is one of the best ever at M—A, for a junior, but it doesn't beat a 10:49.5 which Barbour ran last week.

M—A took the lead at the start of the race with Barbour and senior Doug Yost, who finally finished fourth, pacing the pack. But near the three quarter mark, Marks passed up both the M—A early leaders while other Woodside Harriers followed suit over other slower runners.

Coach Bob Poole of Woodside had all five of his runners placing in the first 12 finishers to capture the meet with 34 points.

"We thought we would

win, and we did," said the Woodside coach.

M—A finished second with 45 points to set their season's record at 7 wins and 10 losses, the worst ever in the school's five years of cross-country.

While Menlo-Atherton coach Plato Yanicks was disappointed with the Varsity, he couldn't have asked for more from the Junior Varsity.

Even though they didn't take first or second positions, the JV's won their race with a

low 25 points. The M—A runners finished all together from third to seventh, with the last four within seven seconds of each other.

Poole was pleased with Damon Wood's first place finish, which guided the 'Cat freshman squad to a 23-51 victory over M—A.

"It has to be the best first year cross-country team we have ever had at Woodside," commented Poole.

Unlike previous M-A home meets, the freshmen ran the entire course like everyone else, not the 1.9 miles as before. Wood's 11:51.5 clocking is among the top freshman times at M-A.

Yanicks also liked his freshmen's showing as he said, "They really looked good and ran well as a team."
