

Carlmont Best In Nation

SAN JOSE — Carlmont High ended its 1970 cross country season doing what it does best — breaking records and winning.

In the final postal meet of the season Saturday, the Scots traveled to San Jose State and broke the state prep record for a three-mile flat course, won the meet and took the nationwide lead in the three-mile race to go along with the No. 1 two-mile ranking they claimed earlier in the year.

The Scotties took the first nine places in the race, and, in a slight surprise, sophomore Steve Miller beat out Hans Templeman for the individual title. Miller and Templeman each covered the distance in 14:52.2.

Carlmont's overall team time was 75:45.1.

In a two-mile race also run Saturday, freshman Stacy Geiken of Wilbur Junior High ran the extremely fast time of 9:56 to win top honors.
