Carlmont, San Carlos Harriers Score Wins

A meet that didn't quite live up to its billing and two first place finishes in the varsity division by runners who had never run competitively before this year both occurred unexpectedly yesterday to highlight three local high school cross country meets.

Carlmont was scheduled to host a five-way meet in what appeared, on paper anyway, to be the undefeated Scots' stiffest test of the season. The only problem is that the teams foreseen to be the most troublesome for the Scots, Mt. Pleasant of the Mount Hamilton Athletic League and St. Ignatius of the West Catholic Athletic League, failed to come. Both squads are favored to take their league championship, and Mt. Pleasant is rated No. 1 in the Central Coast Section.

So, Carlmont faced a considerably weaker encounter against the two teams that did show, San Mateo of the Mid Peninsula League and Homestead of the Santa Clara Valley Athletic League.

And, though the meet wasn't supposed to be a Scot walkaway since both San Mateo and Homestead are also favored in their league, Carlmont literally ran away with it. Led by winner Steve Miller, Carlmont placed seven runners in the top nine finishers to top the field with 17 points (low score wins), followed by San Mateo (55) and Homestead (64).

In a five-way meet at San Carlos yesterday, the Dons may have found themselves a runner with the time and potential to become a superstar in freshman Mitch Kingery. Kingery was a convincing winner in the varsity race as the Dons captured the meet with 23 points, followed by Wood-

San Carlos won the JV race, as well as the sophomore con-

test, despite a first place finish by St. Francis' Mike Kasser of Redwood City. Kasser's time was an excellent 13:41. Mills won the freshman race.

Last Saturday, Carlmont captured all three divisional titles at the Susanville In-vitational for the second straight year.

Miller, only a junior, estab-lished a course record as he sauntered around the hilly, 2.9 mile route in 16:46.

In the Sacramento Invitational Saturday, San Carlos finished poorly in the varsity race, but Kingery didn't let the Dons come home emptyhanded as he took first in the sophomore run to lead SC to a fourth place tie with Mt. Pleasant.
