

Carlmont, SC runners romp

The SPAL's time-honored reputation in cross country didn't suffer much yesterday after San Carlos and Carlmont high schools trotted off with Bay Area-wide center meet titles.

It was pretty much the same story for both the Dons and Scots: their swiftest runners beat everybody to lead them past everybody. Carlmont's Carl Cattarian won the race at Mt. Madonna Park near Watsonville as the Scots outran 11 teams, while San Carlos' dynamic duo of Matt Yeo and Mitch Kingery virtually deadlocked for first as SC beat out 16 schools at Crystal Springs.

Both teams easily won their meet with the same score, 48 points.

Cattarin's winning time of 12:41 set a record for the scenic 2.4-mile course, breaking the old mark, set by Mt. Pleasant's George Manriquez last week, by 25 seconds. Dana Carvey finished seventh and Bruce Sayre was 10th.

Yeo, a senior, led Kingery by several yards near the race's end, but opted to slow up and wait for his sophomore mate before finishing. Both were clocked in 15:15 on the shorter but improved over last year 2.9-mile route, but Yeo

was given the nod over Kingery by a yard.

"I was pleased they both beat out (Gunn's Steve) Crowley (who was third in 15:21)," said Don coach Jim Luttrell. "Their time was good, probably around the course record if they ran the three mile course of last year.

"Lee Shoop (20th place) ran well coming off an injury, Mike Barnett (14th) improved like I thought he would and Ron Cartmell (12th) and his consistent self," added Luttrell, whose Dons are now 33-1 in four meets.
