Longhorns win three of four divisions

Leigh steals spotlight in Milpitas invitational

IT WAS THE FIRST annual Milpitas high invitational cross country meet on the Patriot's local grounds recently but they had to give up the spotlight to the Leigh Longhorns. Leigh outclassed all of the Mt. Hamilton Athletic League power teams by winning the varsity, junior varsity and frosh-soph team titles and finishing third in the frosh division.

Lincoln high was the only other local team to turn in a strong show, placing eighth in the varsity class and third in

the frosh-soph racing.

Longhorn runners nabbed the fifth, sixth and seventh places in the varsity class. Dave Stock was fifth at 16:58, Matt Sommer sixth at 17:08 and Bruce Orr seventh at 17:15 to lead Leigh to the title.

Steve Niedrauer ended 12th at 17:31 and Ed Hawkins rounded out the list with a 15th at 17:45.

TOP LINCOLN FINISHERS in the class were Greg Alvarez, 17th at 17:47, and Tony Balsa, 24th at 17:58.

In the junior varsity class the Leigh runners walked away with top honors. Keith Maurer was first at 18:21. Following him to the line were Peter Maurer, third at 18:24,

Vic Smart, fourth at 18:27, and Ed Wilmont, eighth at 18:50. Leigh had little trouble in the frosh-soph class behind a first place performance by Ron Fritske, 17:14. Bob Melnychuk nabbed a fourth and Steve Sullivan and George Hoffschmidt ended 13th and 14th.

Lincoln's Rumaldo Montenegro, Geraro Alaana and Mike Mulligan topped the show for their school in the division.

Matt Sullivan's second place effort in the frosh division led Leigh to a team third in the class. Richard Ballard and Mark Denniston supported in the third place effort.

Lincoln was sparked by the performances of Arthur Carpio, Ted Deharo and Junior Montelogo in the frosh category.

Longhorn runners mop up at Soquel, four teams hold unblemished slates

BOASTING ONE UNBEATEN team in a season at a given high school is quite a feat. But to have four in a single season is simply great. And when all four teams are from the same sport, it seems almost impossible.

But that's what's going on at Leigh high school on the cross country scene. The Longhorn varsity, junior varsity, sophomore and freshmen teams are all 8-0 in West Valley Athletic League competition and obviously lead in all classes.

The Leigh runners whipped Del Mar and Branham on all levels last Thursday in WVAL competition. Matt Sommers, varsity, Keith Maurer, jr, Ron Fritske, sophomore, and Phil Melicker, freshman, all won in their respective divisions.

The first place efforts of Sommers, Melicker and Fritske maintained their unscratched league records in their divisions.

The Longhorns will put those unblemished records on the line this Thursday when they meet rival Camden at West Valley College's Saratoga campus.

"The sophomore race could be close," said Leigh coach R. Horner Lattimer. "And it should be a good race for first place in the freshman class."

In their match-ups last week, Leigh shut-out both Branham and DM on all levels except the soph and frosh plateaus.

The Leigh sophs dropped Branham 21-37 and the Longhorn frosh beat the Dons 18-40.

SUPPORTING THE WINNERS were Dave Stock, Bruce Orr, Ed Hawkins, Steve Niedrauer and Mike Hansen in the varsity event. Pete Maurer, Larry Towner, Vic Smart, Ed Wilmoth, Tom Shepard, Paul Kinsey, Dave Bogart and Steve Brison led the junior varsity shut-out.

Richard Ballard, Bob Melnychuk, Dutch Perez, Greg Evans and Dave Cook turned in strong sophomore showings and C. Vander Veen, Mike Lambert, Richard Antel, Matt Sullivan and Greg Galaski helped the freshmen to victory.

The previous weekend Leigh turned in a rather unreal effort at the Soquel Invitational. Running in the championship division the varsity nabbed a second place. The number two varsity team, ~~the varsity~~ grabbed a fifth in the large varsity class and the number two jr team took the junior varsity title.

The Longhorn frosh also nailed a team title and the sophomores picked up a fourth without the use of Fritske, up on the ~~varsity~~.

"It was really an outstanding achievement," said Lattimer. "It was a fantastic team performance for us."
