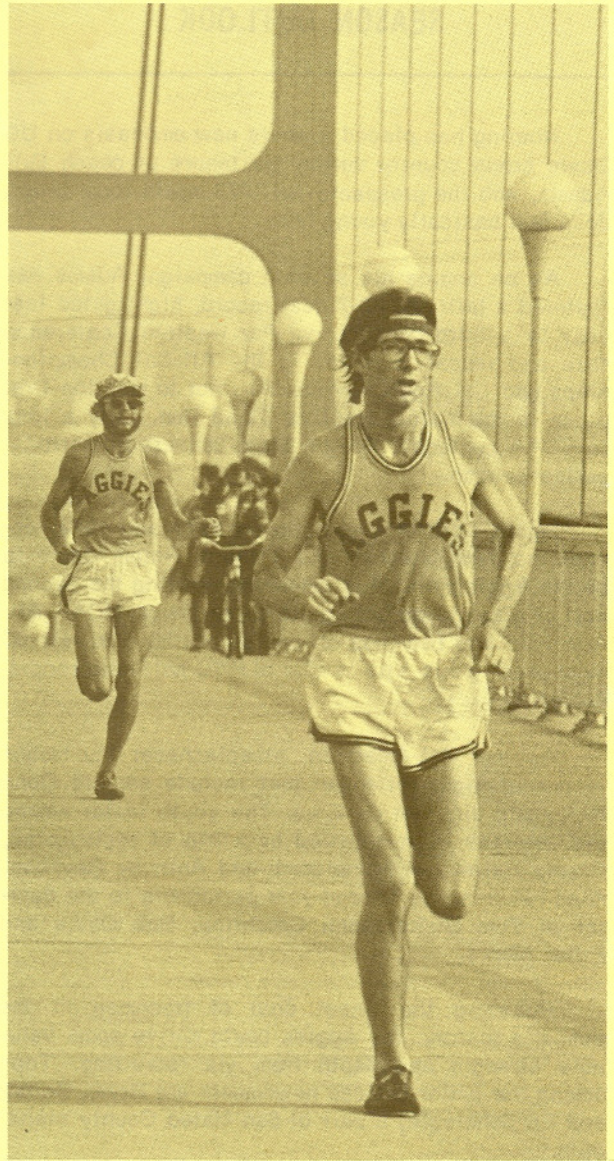

SEASON OUTLOOK

Winning has placed a whole new emphasis on UC Davis cross country during the tenure of coach Bill Adams, and the prospects for 1973 again loom bright despite a basically young team.

As he begins his seventh campaign, Adams has fostered a brilliant 37-7 dual record, highlighted last year by a third consecutive Far Western Conference title and repeat victories in the All-Cal Championships and Cal Aggie Invitational, not to mention first place in the Walnut Festival Road Run. Only a loss to NCAA contender Oregon State University marred a perfect season.

Again this fall, just like in 1971 and 1972, co-captains John Sheehan and 'Peanut' Harms figure to be the Aggie mainstays. Sheehan, starting the second half of a sparkling collegiate career, is an NCAA All-American and two-time all-conference harrier. Harms' most prestigious title is that of FWC half-mile record-holder.

Another All-American, steeplechaser Stu Hobbs is one of eight lettermen that include seniors Donn Wells and Jim van de Erve. The youth factor among the veterans is personified by a trio of sophomores, Clarke Bailey, John Holcomb and Anthony Reynoso. Also returning as second-year performers is the quartet of Tom Blake, John Crechriou, Rob Davis and Peter Marks.

Boasting the finest crop of freshmen in the school's history, the Aggies could derive some valuable strength and depth from via recruiting. Tops among the junior college newcomers are Bryan Geiser and Ed Schelegle, a pair of San Mateo County stand-outs.

At least four rookie runners have the potential of cracking the "top seven" at some point in the season. From up north there is Angelo Martinez and Matt Yeo, while from down San Diego way come prep teammates Mike McGrath and Tom Wendt.

Other promising freshmen include the likes of Rich Chitwood, Garth Janke, Dave Lopez and John Reilly.
