College of San Mateo's cross country team surprised its own coach Saturday, forcing him to reassess the Bulldogs' chances in the Golden Gate Conference title chase.

"I didn't think we were that strong," coach Bob Rush said after CSM won its fifth annual Beach Run, "but now I think we're going to be a con-tender."

The Bulldogs scored 58 points (low score wins) to West Valley's 72 in the fourmile run that starts on the sand at El Granada, goes two miles up the beach and then returns.

Allan Hancock was third with 93, Monterey fourth with 105, with College of Marin (108), Skyline (116), DeAnza (164) and Foothill (173) completing the pack.

Top individual was Monterey's Tom Pelton, timed in 21:20, while San Mateo's Larry Lieu was second in 21:34.

Meanwhile, Cañada College had somewhat less success in the Alum Rock Invitational Saturday, placing third in a three-team pack with 79 points to San Jose City College's 15 and Ohlone's 76. Bob Cooper in 9th place, Mark Parsons in 12th and Leroy Rosing in 17th were the top Colt finishers.

Bulldogs 5050 CC Champs

SANTA BARBARA (UPI) — First place finisher Guy Artherhold of Fresno State led the Bulldogs past fourtime champion Long Beach State Saturday in the finals of the Pacific Coast Athletic Association cross country meet. 7/11/13

Artherhold ran the six-mile course at UC Santa Barbara in 30 minutes, 26.6 seconds. He was followed by James Sweeney, Long Beach State, 30.28, Dan Gruber, San Jose State, 30.41, Dave Garcia, Fresho State, 30.45, and Robert Ebert, San Jose State, 30.53.

Fresno State finished first in team scoring with 39 points, Long Beach State was second with 46, San Jose State third, 41, UC Santa Barbara Fourth, 88, and San Diego State, 133.

In capturing his fourth Pac-8 individual title, Prefontaine broke away from challenging John Ngeno of Washington State on the final hill and went on to win by almost 100 yards with a stunning 28:05.4 clocking.

Prefontaine and Jerry Lindgren shared the previous course record of 28:32.4, set in 1969.

Oregon edged Washington State for the team title 32-36 in a duel that some observers feel matched the two strongest teams in the country. The Ducks also edged WSU by four points in th' Pac-8's Northern Division meet two weeks ago.

Each team had four finishers among the top 10, and the fifth Oregon runner finished 11th overall to decide the title.
