BURLINGAME — Unbeaten San Jose City College strengthened its reputation as the top junior college cross country team in Northern California, if not the State, Saturday by breezing to the College of San Mateo Invitational title.

Led by Steve Brooks, who took individual honors with a 20:51.2 clocking over the four-mile distance at Crystal Springs Golf Course, the unbeaten Jaguars placed five runners among the top 17 finishers in a field of over 100 runners for 41 points.

West Valley, sparked by Matt Sommer's second place, finished a distant runnerup to San Jose with 101 points. Foothill was seventh and De Anza 13th in the 14-team field.
