SUBJECT: INTERSCHOLASTIC ATHLETICS AND THE ENERGY CRISIS

It has been suggested that one of the things that CIF might do to assist schools in conserving energy would be to modify CIF rules regarding invitational athletic events by reducing the amount of travel involved when schools participate in invitational meets and tournaments during the regular season.

Two years ago the State CIF Federated Council liberalized the travel rule (CIF No. 702-703) and now permits a high school athletic team to travel anywhere in California for dual and triangular competition without CIF sanction of any kind. If the activity involves four or more schools, CIF sanction is required.

It has been suggested that during the energy crisis it would be reasonable for school athletic teams to compete in their own local and regional competition, perhaps within a radius of 50 to 75 miles for most competition; perhaps within a radius of 100 miles for an athletic event once in a while if necessary. This modification would apply to the regular season competition --- not to the CIF Section championship playoffs, nor to the State CIF championship events.

If such an energy crisis rule were to be applied as of March 15, some schools would need to reschedule some of their 1974 spring sports schedules. CIF would encourage schools to host invitational meets for schools in their own immediate area as a replacement for an invitational meet or tournament where distant travel would have been involved. CIF would hope that the application of such an energy crisis rule would not materially reduce the opportunity for competition, but that it would result in providing competition without distant travel. Again, the suggestion is that such an energy conservation measure would be applicable for the duration of the energy crisis only.

The State CIF Federated Council will meet in South Laguna on January 25th and 26th, 1974. Interscholastic athletics and the energy crisis will be a major item on the agenda. The State CIF Federated Council would very much appreciate hearing from each CIF member school regarding this subject. The Federated Council would like to receive your school's reaction to the proposal, and to receive any suggestions which you would care to submit. Please see that your response is postmarked not later than Monday, January 14, in order that the State CIF Office might have time to tabulate the responses and present the tabulation to the Federated Council.

CIF recognizes that because of the wide diversity in high school athletic travel required because of the concentration of population in some areas as contrasted with other areas where schools may be 40, 50, or more miles apart, that a single uniform statewide travel rule might not be practical or equitable. What is a reasonable travel limitation under energy conservation conditions? Your suggestions for energy conservation without undue hardship to your school's interscholastic athletic program are requested.

A questionnaire is enclosed for your convenience in responding. The questionnaire provides space for your school's suggestions, which are most welcome. Thank you for your reply, postmarked not later than January 14th.

Dear Mr. Rye:

The State CIF Federated Council has approved sanction for your invitational athletic activity named on the enclosed application blank which you have forwarded to us previously. The application blank is signed as approved.

We ask that you be certain that State CIF rules, Sections 260 to 269 inclusive, dealing with the subject of sanctioned events, are fully upheld. In addition all CIF rules dealing with an individual sport will govern the competition.

Your application blank indicates the CIF Sections from which you wish to invite schools to participate. The sanction which is granted does not permit you to extend invitations to schools from other CIF Sections, without State CIF Office approval.

This sanction is granted to your high school to conduct this invitational athletic activity, on the basis that your high school must maintain an active hand in the direction and management of the invitational meet, and be fully responsible for the maintenance of all CIF rules. It is permissible for the host high school to secure assistance from outside organizations, but it is not permissible for the high school to turn over full responsibility for the meet to a cooperating agency.

It is recommended that all high school entries, signed by a school representative, be sent to the host high school, not to the outside agency that is assisting the high school in the management of the meet. The entry blanks used and the publication of the results of the meet should properly indicate that the meet was conducted by the host high school--not by an outside organization or college.

Would you please see that your printed program indicates that the event is sanctioned by the State CIF.

(Attach separate listing if desired.)

Rule 268. Assistance from outside organizations may be secured by the sponsoring high school, but the high school must maintain an active hand in the direction and management of the invitational meet and be fully responsible.

- A. Information bulletins, invitations, and entry blanks must be distributed by the sponsoring high school.
- B. Completed entry blanks and entry fees must be returned to the sponsoring high school. All communications concerning the event should be directed to the management of the sponsoring high school.
- C. Any program published in connection with a CIF-sanctioned activity must indicate the name of the host high school and that CIF sanction has been issued.
- D. Management and control of all finances connected with the activity shall remain with the host high school. A financial statement indicating all high school revenues and expenditures must be filed with the State CIF Office whenever the activity requires State CIF sanction.
- E. If the title of the event includes the name of an outside organization, the title must be preceded by the name of the sponsoring high school.

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES

1. Invitations should be mailed to a CIF member school, not to an individual's home address.
2. Official invitations should be mailed after CIF sanction has been granted, and the invitations should indicate that sanction has been granted.
3. Colleges and service organizations may not conduct high school competition; they may assist high schools in the administration of interscholastic competition.
