# 1976 STANFORD CROSS COUNTRY

## 1976 OUTLOOK

Coach Marshall Clark looks for 1976 to be a proving year for his Stanford cross country team. Sophomore Jerry Emory has the top returning time on the Cardinal squad, which is minus a pair of Stanford's most outstanding distance runners.

"We know we'll have to prove ourselves this season," says the ninth-year Stanford coach. "We have a balanced array of capable runners, but we will miss Tony Sandoval and Jack Bellah. The loss of Roy Kissin due to an injury will also hurt.

"We're in a situation which could find competition for the top position on the team wide open from race to race."

Returning for his sophomore season is Emory, who completed his freshman campaign with the fourth best six-mile mark in the Stanford frosh record book at 29:53.

"Jerry could do quite well this season," says Clark. "He's shown he can compete under pressure. His performance in the Pac-8 Championships last year was an indication of his potential."

In the six-mile league race at Stanford last fall, Emory was the top Cardinal finisher.

Kissin, who will redshirt due to a strained thigh muscle in his right leg, had the third best frosh time last season, six seconds ahead of Emory at 29:47. He hopes to be back in shape for the track season in the spring.

Also missing from last year's fifth place Pac-8 team will be Sandoval, who won the conference track 10,000-meter run, and Bellah, who set a school record in the 3,000-meter steeplechase last spring. Other losses include Chris Berka, Art Brown, Alan Cummings and Doug McLean. Harold Celms will miss fall competition while studying at a Stanford overseas campus.

Vying for top positions on the team in addition to Emory will be seniors Jeff Parietti, voted the most improved runner on the track team last season, Steve Crowley, Frank Boutin and Jeff Norton.

Of his seniors, Clark says, "Parietti had a great year in track, and should continue to improve. He'll be a team leader this fall. Boutin adds the experience of three varsity years to the squad. And Norton is a proven runner who could do well this fall."

Junior Stacy Geiken, plagued by injuries the past two years, is overdue for a great season, according to Clark. Another top prospect is freshman Craig Corey, who Clark feels is a definite threat to break into the starting line-up.

Providing depth will be junior college transfers Greg Eger (DeAnza) and David Wells (College of the Redwoods), both of whom will push for spots among the top seven.

Clark rates Pac-8 Southern Division rivals California and UCLA much stronger than in the past. Of the overall

### Head Coach

Considered one of the nation's outstanding coaches of distance runners, Marshall Clark is in his ninth season at Stanford. In addition to coaching cross country, Clark serves as an assistant to track coach Payton Jordan and instructs physical education classes.

Clark enjoyed instant success upon joining the Stanford staff in 1968. That fall his cross country team completed the season undefeated and placed second in the NCAA Championships. The past seven seasons, his teams have finished in the upper division of the Pac-8 four times.

Over the past eight years, Clark has developed a number of the top distance runners in Stanford history, including Greg Brock, Duncan Macdonald, Don Kardong, Brook Thomas and Tony Sandoval.

A 1957 graduate of USC, Clark was a member of the Trojans' 1955 NCAA Championship track team. He lettered in both track and cross country at USC in 1955-56-57.

Upon receiving his Master's Degree from USC in 1958, Clark began his coaching career as head of the cross country team at Los Altos High School in La Puente. After nine years at Los Altos, he moved to Monterey's Seaside High for one year. During ten years of prep coaching, Clark directed his teams to six conference championships and one CIF Southern Section title.

Clark remains active in competition himself, having participated in Masters' events the past three years. Prior to that, he ran the 440 and 880 for the Southern California Striders in 1960.

In February, 1972, Clark was chosen to lead a team of U.S. athletes to Moscow for three days of international competition.

The 43-year-old Clark and his wife Beverly are the parents of three children—Richard, 11, and seven-year-old twins Stacy and Shannon. They reside in San Jose.

## FRANK BOUTIN SENIOR SACRAMENTO

Three-time varsity letterman...best times are 30:42 over six miles and 20:28 for 4.2 miles...was Stanford's top runner in the Bay-to-Breakers race last spring..."Frank is much stronger and is ready for a big senior year," says Coach Marshall Clark...has improved his time in the mile...majoring in pre-med.

## CRAIG COREY FRESHMAN HILLSBOROUGH

Termed "an aggressive competitor" by Coach Clark...was the top distance runner on the Peninsula in '76...finished fourth in the Central Coast Section cross country run...was second in the CCS 2-mile with a time of 9:14.4...qualified for the California state meet...a definite threat to make the Card top seven this fall...prepped at San Mateo High.

## STEVE CROWLEY SENIOR STANFORD

Stanford's top miler last year who finished sixth in the Pac-8 Championships...missed cross country competition and part of the track season last year while studying at Stanford's campus in Cliveden, England...has been working hard to prepare for the '76 season, says Coach Clark...finished second in the California state prep finals mile run as a senior at Palo Alto's Gunn High...should be among Stanford's top seven this fall...majoring in pre-med.

## GREG EGER JUNIOR SUNNYVALE

Transfer from De Anza College was one of the top Junior College runners in Northern California last year...placed fifth in the 10,000-meter run last year in the State JC Championships...has run 14:16 for three miles in track...looks to be a strong contender for the top seven this fall.

## JERRY EMORY SOPHOMORE PALO ALTO

Ran in Stanford's top four most of last season, enjoying an outstanding freshman year...was the Cards' top finisher in the Pac-8 Championships in November..."Jerry is a proven competitor under pressure," says coach Marshall Clark...his best six-mile time of 29:53 ranks second on the Stanford squad behind fellow sophomore Roy Kissin, and fourth on the all-time Cardinal frosh list...prepped at Palo Alto's Gunn High...majoring in human biology.

## STACY GEIKEN JUNIOR PALO ALTO

"A healthy Geiken is a dangerous runner," says Coach Clark...has been plagued by injuries the past two years...recovered from surgery last year to run 9:08.4 in the steeplechase before losing a split decision to a barrier at the West Coast Relays...if able to avoid injuries, should have a great season...majoring in photo-journalism.

## JEFF NORTON SENIOR LOS ALTOS

Called a "quality runner" by Coach Clark...has missed competition the past two seasons...trained hard during the summer to earn a spot on the Card varsity...best times include a 4:14 mile and a 9:11 2-mile...majoring in human biology.

## JEFF PARIETTI SENIOR MERCER ISLAND, WASH.

Voted the most improved runner on the Stanford track team last spring..."Jeff could be one of the outstanding runners in the conference," says Coach Clark...a three-year letterman who appears ready for a leadership role on the team...a sports writer for the *Stanford Daily*, served as the campus paper's sports editor last spring...his father, Walt, is a sportswriter for the *Seattle Times*...graduate of Seattle Prep, the same school that produced Stanford 2-mile record-holder Don Kardong...majoring in communication.
