## Avila, Fremont win in DAAL x-country

Junior Dave Avila of Cupertino captured individual honors but it was Fremont grabbing the team title at the De Anza Athletic League cross country championships Wednesday at the Crystal Spring course in Belmont.

Avila toured the 3.3-mile course in 15:26 to defeat runnerup Mike Sapp of Fremont, who clocked 16:00.

Sapp was one of three Fremont runners among the top 10 finishers, carrying the Indians to their first-ever cross country title since the sport was first contested in 1954.

Homestead captured the girls' team title while Fremont took the sophomore crown and Sunnyvale the freshman diadem.
