Region IV Cross Country

Area Teams Run Record Sweep

BELMONT — Santa Cruz County distance runners swept firsts in all three divisions of the Region IV Cross Country Championship Meet, with Soquel and Watsonville High taking the top team honors as well Wednesday at Chrystal Springs Park.

Both the boys' and girls' varsity course records were shattered. Watsonville junior Angel Vasquez covered the 3.4-mile course in 15:08, breaking the old mark by 14 seconds. Kristi Jacobson of Soquel won the girls' race in 18:33 on the same course, 31 seconds under the previous course best.

In both varsity divisions, the top three finishers ran under the course record. Seaside's Jeff Magallanes and Watsonville's Sammy Barazza each were under the 15:22 of San Jose High's Fernando Valderos (set Oct. 13 in the Redwood Invitational). Betty Wilson of Watsonville and Tiffany Choy of Salinas also got in below Choy's old record of 19:04. And Aptos freshman Beth Hampton, who won the

Santa Cruz County Athletic League individual title last week, ran fourth in 19:05.

In the team competition, Watsonville won the boys' varsity title in a satisfying fashion over Hollister. The Cats had 32 points, Hollister was second with 65, Seaside was next at 80 and Soquel was fourth with 116.

"We weren't really favored," Watsonville Coach Len Davies said. "Last year they got us at the regionals by four points. So we were waiting for them. They had their whole team back, but so did we."

In the girls' meet, Soquel had three runners in the top 10, winning the team title with 40 points. San Lorenzo Valley took second at 85, Aptos was third with 105 and Watsonville was fourth with 111.

"It was a surprise that Kristi came back to win the region," Soquel Coach Ken Thomas said. "It was the same course as the

league meet, against tougher competition. But she had something to prove to herself," he said, after she ran fourth last week.

In the boys' frosh-soph, Santa Cruz High's Stephan Ruiz was the individual winner in 16:14, with Hollister taking the team title. Soquel placed fourth as a team, and with the top four teams of each division qualifying for Monday's Central Coast Section meet, the entire Soquel team advances on.

"It will be kind of fun, in that the whole team is going," said Thomas, as the Knights were the only school from the region to pull off that feat (Watsonville and Hollister each qualified in two divisions). "It's got to be the high point of our season. If you qualify one team, it's good, two is better, but three is the best you can do. Everybody who could qualify yesterday did."

He said that the boys' varsity qualifying was unexpected.

"They ran fourth in the league meet and I didn't even know if they would run after that. But they said, 'Let's at least make a better effort,' and they did."

Davies said his Wildcat boys' varsity is "coming along. We try to peak at the right times. We're probably one of six teams considered to win the CCS, so we're going for it."
