Since I started coaching in 1949, I have been involved in only one clean sweep in X Country...and that wasn't by one of my teams but by an opponent in a very well balanced lea gue championship. Not counting duals or three way meets (where anything is possible)...perfect scores of 15 are a real rarity and so today's outcome had to be a real EYE OPENER.....Not just because we finished

1-2-3-4-5 but mostly because of the manner in which it occurred.

MICHELE AUBUCHON led through the first mile with FRANNIE CASTRO and a closely pursuing STEFANI STOUTT about 20 to 30 yards behind. Right after that due was a tough looking KAREY ROBINSON. An ailing CONNIE HESTER ( who was not scheduled to compete today due to strained rib musceles) was involved in a three-way battle with Scannel of Sac and Humboldt's great freshman Bergsohn. By the time that the runners had circumscribed the picturesque eastern loop with its golden hues of autumn ripened grasses and grains, and had emerged from the thicket of valley oaks just a hundred yards from the two mile mark, it was obvious that the Pioneers were attempting something special. AUBUCHON was still in the lead but Stoutt had closed the gap to 10 yards. CASTRO was running under control with HESTER and ROBINSON running together as if one. The runners tucked Into the wood enshrounded portion to the northwest and when they again emerged with but 600 meters remaining, the leader was the Oregon transplant. STOUTT raced across the concrete bridge which served to herald the "final surge" in this demanding run. AUBUCHON was still mainting a tough tempo with CASTRO now th trouble ROBINSON and H.STER coming up to challange but at the same time serve as encouragement and an additional and well needed target for concentration. It was indeed an ominous sight to see Hayward runner after Hayward runner streak across the final 200 meters of grass to record a seldom seen finish (STEFANI STOUTLimproved on her course record, set on 9/20, by 40 seconds 3311)

What will transpire in the next few weeks of competition, only time will tell....but for this day....for all of our team ....who performed so well...for the MORANS and BIGELOWS and FRASERS....but especially for those 5 veteran runners...who just a year ago had brought us the National title.....for those 5 this had to be an experience!...an@accomplishment....that they would never forget and that they could relish for the rest of their lives...it was "THEIRS".
