STANFORD GOLF COURSE: THE COURSE OF CHAMPIONS

Henry Rono, Gerry Lindgren, Alberto Salazar, Duncan Macdonald, Steve Prefontaine . . .

The list goes on and on of top runners that have performed at one time or another on the beautiful Stanford Golf Course facility. The NCAA District 8/Pac-10 Conference meet has been held on this course the past two years, with former Washington State superstar Rono carving a new record (29:07.4) last season.

It is a record that likely won't be touched for a long time. But that's not going to stop today's field from going out after the mark. And there are some runners who are quite capable of breaking through.

The history of good distance running at Stanford is a rich one. Names like the ones above, together with others like Washington State's Joel Cheruyiot, Oregon's Rudy Chapa, Stanford's Dyrol Burleson and Don Kardong and UCLA ace Steve Ortiz (who's the favorite in today's race) have collaborated to help deepen the tremendous tradition that has been established at Stanford's course.

"The Pacific-10 Conference, no matter what happens, is always represented in the NCAA's top five each year," says Stanford head cross country coach Mike Tomasello, "and the same will hold true this year. In the past, teams like Oregon and Washington State have been consistent champions and high placers in the national event, and it looks as though the tide may be shifting toward some other schools now--like UCLA and Arizona.

"The fact is, they all have run this course at one time or another, and it's a great place--a great challenge--to run."

It will be a strong, experienced UCLA team leading the way today, but there are some other powerful teams as well. A young but potentially-tough Stanford team has been gearing toward this meet for some time, and has the advantage of running a very familiar course. Washington State and Oregon must never be counted out due to each team's strong distance-running tradition.

And Arizona, Arizona State and defending PCAA champion UC Santa Barbara also have the tools to pull off an upset. It all adds to the greatness of the meet--which is held on a great 10,000-meter course.

Stanford's Tony Sandoval, the 1980 Olympic Trials marathon champion, honed his skills right here on this spectacular course. Duncan Macdonald, a 1976 Olympian, also ran this course daily--and still works out here on occasion. Burleson, the first Pac-8 3:40-four minute miler, also trained on this course while attending Stanford. Steve Prefontaine, the late great runner from Oregon, performed here on occasion.

When one puts its all together, it means a great tradition of distance running at Stanford. And it continues to grow in stature and respect as time goes on.

THE STANFORD ATHLETIC PROGRAM

Along with a reputation nearly unmatched in education, Stanford holds a similarly high distinction in the realm of athletics.

Annually, some 400 students compete in intercollegiate athletics, while participation in intramurals has reached 13,000 persons this year. The University intercollegiate program boasts 24 men's and women's varsity sports, with excellence represented in accomplishments on the national and international levels of competition. The University has claimed 24 national team championships and 123 individual national titles. Cardinal Olympians are numerous, with the likes of two-time decathlon gold medalist Bob Mathias, gold medal swimmers Kim Peyton and John Hencken and silver medalist Linda Jezek among them.

"Stanford is proud of a program that appeals to every aspect of the University," says Athletic Director Andy Geiger. "Whether a student possesses extraordinary skills or is learning a lifetime activity at the beginner level, we are able to provide proper staff and facilities for optimum development and enjoyment."

Annually, Stanford enrolls upwards of 12,000 students, of whom approximately 6,500 are undergraduates. About 48 percent are from California and the rest from the other 49 states and some 80 other countries.
