

season outlook

Mark Conover leads the defending Division II men's cross country championship team in its quest for two titles in a row.

Conover, an NR senior, won the Western Regionals at Cal Poly last year in 30:56 and led all American runners at Division II Nationals, placing second in 30:04.

Humboldt State is one step up on last year's defending champs, Cal Poly, HSU coach Jim Hunt says.

"Last year we always had winning the national title in the back of our mind," Hunt said. "But we felt that Cal Poly had superior manpower. They had 14 outstanding runners. They were like Who's Who of young distance runners."

Since the Far Western Conference is not particularly strong, Hunt had a simple strategy for last year.

"Our only chance was to come along slowly and then put a lot of emphasis on nationals," Hunt said. "We didn't think we'd have any trouble winning the conference, so that wasn't a psychological factor."

Humboldt won the conference easily, then, after qualifying in the regionals, sharpened up during the two weeks before nationals.

Two of last year's top five runners are back — Conover and fifth-man Roger Innes. Other top runners include senior Wayne Arrison, freshman Arnulfo

Morales, sophomore Mike Williams and junior Pat Brady. Freshman Octavio Morales and sophomore Mike Baca should also be among the top runners.


The reason Cal Poly could not win backto-back championships, Hunt says, is because the team had too much competition within its own team. The team members would expend much of its energy jockeying for the top spots.

That won't be the case with Humboldt State, Hunt says.

"Our top runners won't have to look for an eighth or ninth man breathing down their necks all the time, trying to take their place," he said. "Our runners will able to run conservatively in the early meets and come on strong in the end. At least, that's our plan."



In recent years women's cross country in the Golden State Conference has been dominated by two of the nation's best teams, Hayward State and Sacramento State.

Because of that dominance, Humboldt State had the nation's tenth best women's cross country team in Divison III of the AIAW last year without winning a conference meet.

Things are different this year, however, as HSU won a meet for the first time ever in the conference meet at Sonoma State University.

"Sonoma's flat course made a big difference," Coach Dave Wells said. "We run on a lot of hills up here (at Humboldt). With the flat course we were able to go out fast.


