on Crystal Springs Course

"Scott LaForce is the man to beat," said his cross country coach, Willie Harmatz, who should know. "Bellarmine is the favorite for the team championship, but individually, Scott is the hottest guy in the section right now. He doesn't like me saying stuff like that. It makes him nervous. But I guess he won't read this 'til after the meet anyway."

The meet in question is the CCS finals, which took place Tuesday on

the Crystal Springs course.

Scott certainly figures to be (pardon the pun) LaForce to be reckoned with at Crystal Springs. His 14:51 in the regional meet there last week was the fastest time recorded this year over that hilly route, and it was more than a minute faster than his personal record there, which was set earlier in the year. To record another record there Tuesday, however, would be asking an awful lot.

"This ought to slow the times down," said Harmatz, pointing out the window at the rainy conditions that prevailed two days before the CCS

meet. "Crystal Springs is fast if you catch it on a good day, but it's going to be a little muddy on Tuesday."

If the rain rendered the course unfit for running, the College of San Mateo was ready as a backup course. Harmatz was hoping that wouldn't happen, however, since both his boys and girls teams were busy last week gaining experience and easy victories in the regional meet at Crystal Springs.

The girls' varsity, characteristically, used its depth, placing its top six runners among the first 13 finishers. A lot of schools don't do that in dual meets. "The girls are really coming on," said Harmatz.

Monica Daley finished third behind Leigh's Rebecca Chamberlain and Silver Creek's Angela Stearns with a time of 18:06, breaking her own two-year old school record. Darcy Parker was fifth in 19:16, Sara Hartman finished seventh in 19:25, Ann Wimmer was eighth in 19:31, Stephanie Hartman was 12th in 19:41, Jennifer Joslin was 13th in 19:45, and Stacy Harmer's 20:26 was good enough for

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the property leafing test.

In order for Los Gatos to be a force in the league, Lallemand said that his two championships, finished second twice and fifth once. Lallemand is assisted by Robert Balcomb.

Sara and Stephanie Hartman both broke Darcy Parker's school frosh record on the course. The girls' combined time of 95:59 shattered the CCS record of 96:21, which was set by the 1981 St. Francis team.

The boys' varsity was weakened by the absense of Phil Cox and Dave Hastings, who were out with the flu. But, to paraphrase Luke Skywalker, LaForce was with them, and that was enough.

After LaForce's 14:51 first place finish came Eric Wendling with a 15:54 in ninth place. Pat More ran a 16:08 and finished 13th, and Kevin Baiko was 14th in 16:09.

Tom Hoover was 19th in 16:25, and William Moore and Keith Diesner, who replaced Cox and Hastings for the meet, ran 16:37 and 18:07 respectively, finishing 25th and 60th.
