# California Preps Race in China

Every year, for many years, Interna-tional Sports Exchange has taken a group of high school runners for a trip to Hong Kong and Mainland China to compete in a 13K (8.1 miles) road race on New Year's day in Guangzhou (Canton), China. This year more than 300 high school runners from all over the United States participated.

Coach Bill Sumner (Corona Del Mar HS.

Newport Beach) placed 11th in 46:39. Sean Pyorre (Fort Bragg HS) was the leading Northern California finisher among ISE finishers in 32nd at 49.52. Mark Slocum (Homestead HS, Sunnyvale) finished 38th in 51:00 followed by his leammate Ted Barram 39th in 51:12.

Kris Rouse (Rim of the World HS, Running Springs) was the leading California female finisher. She placed fourth in

Robin Constantinides (Clayton Valley HS. Concord) was the leading Northern California female placing 16th in 60:08. Her roommate on the trip Tammy Foley (Mission Sar Jose HS. Fremont), who turned in a 10:46 postal two-mile last fall

at Los Gatos, placed 17th in 60:49. Before the race we were handed a two page information sheet for the runners, who planned to participate in the 1987 Guangzhou New Year's Grand City Run. The following is quoted from that sheet: The Guangzhou New Year's City Run is a grand long-distance running meet rich of tradictional folk features. It has been held for many years with ever strong momen-tum. Every time it attracts thousands of Guangzhou citizens and friendly per sonages from abroad and other parts of China, It is so large in scale and so splen-did an occasion that it is said to be the No. 1 Race in South China'. More than ten thousand Guangzhou citizens have enthusiastically entered their names for the coming run. Among them are workers, cadres, students, soldiers, inhabitants and peasants.

A Tribute to John Frank

(Editor: The following tribute appeared in the program for the Northern Athletic League Championships in cross country last fall.)

This meet, the 1986 NAL Cross Country championships, is being dedicated to John Frank-a standout runner and human being-who graduated from Centrai Valley High School in 1980.

John began his running career in the spring of 1977 at Nova High School, under the training of Mr. Bruce Makinson, as a miler and two miler. John went to Central Valley High School for the next three years training under the watchful eye of Jim Hayes who guided John to one of the most outstanding running careers in the history of the Northern Section.

John was All-League a total of three times in track and twice in Cross Country, breaking records wherever he ran. As a senior in cross country he went undefeated for the year and climaxed his cross country career as NAL champion, NSCIF champion, NOR-CAL champion, AAU National Champion and was named California co-runner of the year in 1979. In track he ran a 4:21.0 mile, 9:05.7 in the two mile (still the fastest two mile in the history of the North Section) was NAL champion, NSCIF champion and 7th in the State track meet in 1980 in the two mile. John then continued his exploits to Oregon State where he further excelled as a runner until his graduation in 1985.

As outstanding as John was as a run-

ner, his most precious assets were demonstrated as a sensative, intelligent, and very caring human being. He set his goals high and never waived from achiev-ing them-either for himself or for others.

His values were his guide and his heart was his yardstick-and with those John Frank was truly a motivation to us all.
