Mills High's girls win the CCS Division II cross-country title

BELMONT - Jill Kurz and Alva Dancel led the Mills High girls' cross country team to its firstever Central Coast Section Division II championship Saturday at the Crystal Springs 2.9-mile course in Belmont.

In boys' Division II competition, Paul Eley of Mills won the individual championship, edging out defending CCS champion Andy Bupp of Woodside.

The Viking girls scored an overwhelming victory in the championships, tallying 43 points to sec-

ond-place Los Gatos with 95.

"Winning with 43 points is an incredible feat," Viking coach Ed Parker said. "A good part of the time the first-place team wins with 80 to 90 points. For us to have won with 43 shows just how good this team really is."

The Lady Vikes beat the top 12 teams in the CCS, which included 97 runners. Kurz, who won the Peninsula Athletic League trials, finished second

in the race.

'(Becky Kaiser of Seaside) beat us in the regionals, so we decided for this race just to worry about ourselves and the team, and not worry about who was in front of us," Kurz said. "We have a great team to back us up, so if we didn't win individually it wasn't that big of a deal."

Kurz was running under two handicaps. The first was a general handicap for all the runners; the day was too hot for everyone's comfort. The second

was personal.

"I got stung on my shoulder by a bee at the beginning of the third mile," Kurz said. "I don't think I would have been able to catch (Kaiser) even if I hadn't been stung, but it was a distraction."

Dancel was running a disappointing third place. The winner of the race last year, Dancel finished almost a minute behind last year's time.

"It was a lot hotter than I expected," Dancel said. "I felt like I drank a lot before the race started, and during the race I could feel the water moving in my stomach. I'm disappointed with my personal finish, but I'm excited about the entire team winning the title. When we go to state this year I won't be the only runner from Mills this time.

The seven-girl Viking team included: Kurz, Dancel, Jeanne Harlick, Erin Brightwell, Cass Cun-

ningham, Diana Harlick and Yadi Taylor.

Aragon High of San Mateo had a good showing, finishing sixth in team scoring. Half Moon Bay finished 10th.

The boys Division II race was the closest, and most exciting, race seen at Crystal Springs this year. The top three finishers, all from San Mateo County, led the race at least once, and the top two runners were neck-and-neck for almost the entire race

The winning runner won the race in 15:12.0,

and second place was 15:13.4.

Eley from Mills, Bupp from Woodside and Derrick Waxman from San Mateo finished in that

John Hannon from Woodside finished fourth to round out all the county qualifiers for the state

"I'm happy I won the CCS, but I'm still disappointed I couldn't break the 15-minute mark," Eley. said of his 15:12.0 time. "This was the best race we've had so far. Andy went out in front to begin with, and then Derrick took the lead for a while. I thought that was rare strategy for Andy, because that's not the way he runs."

Bupp's usual race is to run a little back at his own pace, and then overtake and win the race. With Bupp out front, Eley was happy to coast along

behind him.

"I thought that was great," Eley said. "With Andy or Derrick out front I could pace off them, instead of them off me. That may have stopped me from breaking 15 minutes, but that's all right."

The state meet will be held next week in Fresno. The course is relatively flat, and is 5 kilometers, just a little over three miles long. Eley, a newcomer to California, isn't used to a flat course, but's

looking forward to the race.

I haven't trained on too much flat terrain, so I expect the race to be a little faster," Eley said. "I'm excited about the race though. Bupp is supposed to be the big gun in this race, and I've beaten him three times now. I raced a lot of 5Ks in Colorado, so I'm familiar with the distance."

Palo Alto won the team competition, with Los Gatos in second place. County team finishers included Half Moon Bay in seventh place, San Mateo in 11th place, Jefferson in 12th place and

Aragon in 13th place.

In Division I competition, Serra of San Mateo was expected to finish high enough to qualify. Phil Kilbridge placed second to do his part in the race, but his teammates broke down.

"I can't seem to get us out of fifth place," Padre coach Rick Fambrini said. "We go to invitationals and do very well, but when we get to the races that really count, we didn't do what we had to, to place. It drives me crazy."

Kilbridge is the only county runner from Divi-

sion I to qualify for the state meet.

"This will be my first time in the state meet," Kilbridge said. "Last year I missed placing by four runners, and I was really disappointed. I thought I had a chance at winning today, but I got boxed in at the start, and by the time I got out of the crowd, we were already starting the second mile."

In Division III, boys competition, Menlo School of Atherton placed sixth with 147 points. In the girls division Menlo finished fifth with 121

points.

Gloria Martinez of Sacred Heart Prep in Atherton qualified individually for the state meet, the only Division III runner from the county to qualify.
