St. Paly boys; Mills, St. Francis girls qualify for the state meet

St. Ignatius High received come-through performances from all its scoring runners to defeat Palo Alto in a hotly-contested team battle at the Central Coast Section Division III cross country championships Wednesday at Crystal Springs.

St. Ignatius, led by individual champion Mark McManus, scored 49 points. Palo Alto (62 points) beat third-place St. Francis (76) to take the second and final qualifying spot for the state meet in Fresno on Dec. 1.

Five individuals qualified for the state meet — St. Francis' Tyson Thomas and Will Clark; San Lorenzo Valley's Aaron Kamp; Santa Cruz's Nate Johnson and Soquel's Robert Spencer.

Palo Alto was led by Jon Hammar, who finished seventh in a life-best 15:52 on the 2.96-mile course. Hammar's previous best was 16:17.

"We do our training for the end of the season," Hammar said. "We do high base mileage at the start and use high-intensity training and more rest at the end of the season. The best way to race is to be satisfied with the coaching you have. We're very satisfied with our coaching."

The rest of Palo Alto's scoring runners were Gabe Kugler (10th, 16:03), Erik McMichael (15th, 16:10), Rafi Kugler (17th, 16:15) and Brian Weissman (20th, 16:21).

"We're very happy with how we ran today," Hammar said. "We gave it our all. SI ran great, but we have another shot at them next week."

Weissman is the Palo Alto runner showing the most improvement. He ran 17:49 in his first race at Crystal Springs this season.

While St. Francis fell short in the team competition, Thomas (fifth, 15:37) and Clark (sixth, 15:50) will enjoy competing at the state meet as individuals.

"It's not as good as if our whole team made it," Clark said. "But all those guys are juniors. I'm the only senior, so they should be back next year."

Girls

As expected, Mills (66) won the team championship. The real competition was between St. Francis and Gunn for the second qualifying spot. The Lancers nosed out the Titans, 84-89.

"I'm ecstatic," St. Francis coach Roberta Chisam said. "I had tears in my eyes before the race was finished. It was nice to see that yellow wave coming through the pack."

Michelle Ruiz, Laura Shellooe, Kathy Kelly, Linda Keeler and Monica Shelley placed from eighth to 24th.

Gunn actually had the faster team time by 35 seconds. But the team race is determined by cumulative place, not cumulative time.

Tenaya Soderman will be the only Gunn runner to advance. Soderman placed third in a life-best 18:32.

"I pushed myself like I hadn't before because of the intensity of the meet," Soderman said. "I'll just try to improve on my place (35th) at the state meet last year."

Leigh's Kate Sweeney won by a large margin in 18:03. Other individuals qualifying for the state meet were Seaside's Becky Kaiser (second, 18:28), Aptos' Lisa Crouch (fifth, 18:48) and St. Ignatius' Ann Baldelli (sixth, 18:52).

Carlimont's Suzy Jones placed seventh in a personal-best 19:05 and yet wasn't able to qualify. Only one runner who finished ahead of her was on a team that qualified. Had Gunn took second, Jones would have advanced as the fifth individual qualifier.

Gilroy's Solorio raises eyebrows at CCS meet

After placing 95th in last season's Central Coast Section cross-country finals, Ernesto Solorio wanted to prove he belonged among the elite.

"I wasn't favored or ranked or anything," said Solorio, a Gilroy High junior. "No one knows who I am. No one knows I was undefeated this season. And I'm still undefeated."

After Solorio registered a time of 15 minutes, 37.5 seconds in Saturday's Division II boys' championship, there were a lot of people at Crystal Springs Park near Belmont who knew who he was. Solorio ran the day's fastest time on the 2.95-mile course.

He edged out Leigh's Scott Downens, who came in at 15:40.7. Solorio kicked so hard down the stretch in holding off Downens that he momentarily collapsed in the arms of Gilroy Coach Joe Amelio after crossing the finish line.

"The last half-mile or so I kept hearing, 'Let's go Scott,'" Solorio said. "I know my name isn't Scott, so I figured he was close. Maybe I pushed a little too much. But it doesn't matter. I had to push hard to win."

Solorio's Gilroy team placed fourth in the team standings and Leigh placed second. Gunderson's boys took the Division II title.

First- and second-place squads in each division qualify as a team for the state meet Nov. 24 in Fresno. The top five finishers from teams not among the first two also qualify.

In the Division I boys' final, Bellarmine unseated Watsonville for the team title. Watsonville junior Nacho Flores, who led his team to second place, won the individual title in 15:46.5 to beat Bellarmine's Kyle Dando, who finished in 15:55.1.

Overfelt repeated as girls' team champion in Division I. The Royals

were led by individual champion Maria Solorio (no relation to Ernesto), who ran 19:15.5 to beat teammate Javiera Trigos by 40 seconds. Santa Teresa finished second in the team standings.

"There was no way I was going to give up the lead," said Maria Solorio, who finished second last season at CCS. "I looked back once and didn't see anyone, so I figured I was OK."

In the Division II girls' final, Keri Raybould of Leland won the individual title in 19:24.1, but sophomore Tara Tate, who finished 22nd, ended up being the reason the Chargers won the team title.

Leland, Los Gatos and Gunderson all had 54 points to tie for the team title, in which the top five finishers' scores are added to determine the champion. With the three schools tied, officials checked the times of the sixth-place finishers to determine first and second place.

Tate was 22nd overall with a time of 22:42.4. Carolyn Dueck of Los Gatos was 23rd (22:51.7) and Gunderson's Stephanie Detata was 24th at 23:01.2.

"I have never seen something like that happen at CCS," Bellarmine Coach Terry Ward said. "That was unbelievable."

David Arnold of York in Monterey won the individual Division IV title in 16:20.4. San Jose Academy won the boys' team title, followed by Half Moon Bay, whose girls' team easily won its division. Presentation was second, 57 points back. Liz Leigh (20:22.1) of Santa Catalina of Monterey took individual honors in Division IV.

The Division III championship is scheduled for Wednesday at 2:30 also at Crystal Springs Park.
