Palo Alto boys sixth In state Division III; Lancer girls 10th in II

Led by its strong corps of runners, Palo Alto High's boys cross country team posted a sixth-place finish among Division III teams at the California state meet at Woodward Park in Fresno on Saturday.

Leading the Vikings was Erik McMichael, who was 25th over the 3.1-mile course in 16:25.

The Division III competition was supposed to be one of the most hotly contested of the meet, but San Marino ran away with the team title with a score of 77 — well ahead of runner-up La Jolla (129). Palo Alto's team score of 157 was a tad less than fourth-place Palos Verdes (149) and fifth-place Lemoore (154).

St. Ignatius, which was ranked No. 1 in the Central Coast Section for much of the season, was third with 135 points. Mark McManus, one of the top runners in the section, finished ninth in 15:57.

Behind McMichael for Palo Alto were Rafi Kugler (29th in 16:28), Jon Hammar (37th in 16:38), Gabe Kugler (74th in 17:10), Brian Weissman (81st in 17:16) and Phil Dolan (83rd in 17:20).

St. Francis' Will Clark was 68th in 17:05.

Sweeney was one of five Central Coast Section girls placing in the top 17 in Division III. The others were Becky Kaiser of Seaside (eighth), Diana Harlick of Mills (13th), Tenya Soderman of Gunn (16th) and Lisa Crouch of Aptos (17th).

St. Francis' depth allowed the Lancers to finish 10th, the highest finish for a Santa Clara County team in Division III. Mills of Millbrae, with four girls in the top 50, took fourth.
