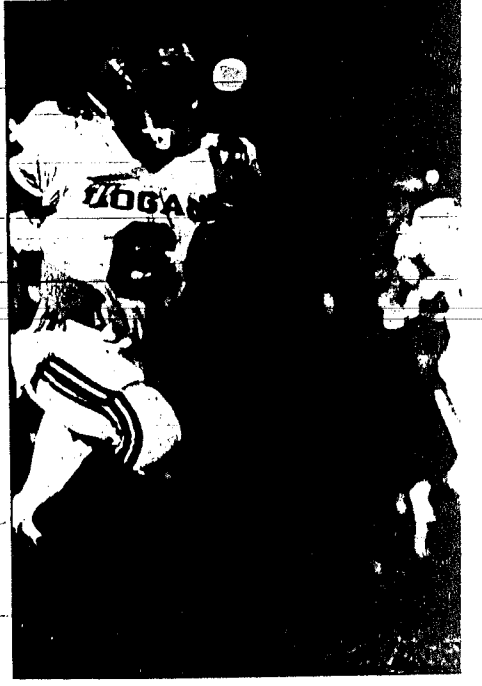

NCS 3A FOOTBALL

SAN RAMON — After 48 minutes of shootout football Saturday night, it was appropriate that Monte Vista High School had to dodge a final bullet in a 26-20 win over James Logan in the first round of the North Coast Section 3A playoffs at California High.



The Colts, who shot themselves in the foot throughout the second half, had a final chance to win it in the last 1:55 of the fourth quarter. Logan, the Mission Valley Athletic League runner-up, drove from its own 37-yard line to the Monte Vista 26 on five plays, giving the team first down with 31 seconds left.
