

Trojan girls going to state as Division II runners-up

meet on 11-20-93

OAKLAND — In the wildly competitive North Coast Section Meet of Champions Division II Cross Country races Saturday, Castro Valley High emerged with a glowing team victory and one near-miss.

The Trojans' girls squad earned a trip to the state meet with a second-place finish on the tough 3.1-mile course at Mills College.

Only the top two teams, plus the additional five-best individuals in each division, qualified for the CIF State Championships next Saturday at Woodward Park, Fresno.

Castro Valley's girls had 56 points in a race dominated by Mission San Jose, which took the top three individual positions. The Trojans' boys team just missed qualifying, however, finishing third with 67 points, four behind runner-up De La Salle and 10 behind Mission.

Nevertheless, the Trojans' John Atwood qualified for State with a strong third-place finish in a time of 16:50. San Leandro's Keith Kennedy (16:44) placed second and Eureka's Matt Creason (16:23) took his third consecutive Meet of Champions title.

James Logan's girls team (50 points) took the Division I title, and Logan's Aaron Richberg placed third in the Division I boys race.

With a late surge, Bishop O'Dowd's Anjelica Randall (19:36) finished second in Division III girls, finishing just three seconds behind Heather Wallace of Clayton Valley. The Dragons finished second in the team standings with 67 points.

Backing Atwood in Division II, Castro Valley's Kevin Strkarsky was 11th and Shane Dulaney was 16th.

Randall, O'Dowd sprint to 2nd

OAKLAND — Bishop O'Dowd High senior Anjelica Randall's heart was pumping fast and her spirits were soaring Saturday at Mills College.

Randall had just closed strongly to finish in second place in the 3.1-mile North Coast Section Cross Country Meet of Champions Division III girls race.

The clutch effort helped the Dragons earn a trip to the CIF State Championships next Saturday at Woodward Park in Fresno. Only the top two teams in each of four divisions qualified for state, and O'Dowd took second place with 67 points.

Piedmont's Steve Brown, the defending state champion, romped to win the Division IV race in a time of 16:59. Piedmont also took the boys team title with 64 points, 22 ahead of runner-up Arcata.

"It really helped me when a lot of people were cheering and saying 'I could do it,'" Randall said proudly. "I know that I can sprint, so I tried it and I feel so happy."

She finished in a time of 19:36, just three seconds behind winner Heather Wallace of Clayton Valley.

"We are just really thrilled that we got second," she continued, breathing hard. "All we can think about is we're so happy we made it. We had a good attitude and it worked."

Now Randall is eyeing a third consecutive trip to the state meet — with her teammate, that is.

"Oh my God, we've worked so hard for this race," she said. "We had faith in each other, and we were really ready for this."

Bishop O'Dowd's Alison Purcell finished in 10th place and Candace Miles-Threat was 11th. O'Dowd's Rosa Terrazos took 27th and Crystal Mikes Threat was 29th.

Mission San Jose-Fremont's girls runners turned the Division II race into their own personal showcase by finishing 1-2-3 at picturesque Mills.

The Warriors' Elissa Riedy won in a time of 19:46.6. Her twin sister Lori (19:50.2) was a close second and long-striding Jennifer Knowlden (20:14.6) took third.

James Logan's girls team won the Division I title, and the Colts' Aaron Richberg placed third in the Division I boys race.

Empire will send 23 runners to state cross-country championship

OAKLAND — Two local teams and a total of 23 local runners will advance and represent the Redwood Empire at next week's state cross-country championship in Fresno, after qualifying at the North Coast Section Meet of Champions Saturday at Mills College.

The top two teams (only one team in Div. I) and the top five individuals, not on a qualifying team, advance.

Montgomery's boys' team advanced after winning Division I with 44 points.

The Vikings' David Toomey, best known for his eccentric hair styles, won the 3.1-mile race in 16 minutes, 54 seconds, 23 seconds faster than the second-place finisher. His teammate, Scott Story, aided in the Vikings' victory with a strong fifth-place finish (17:33).

Toomey was 21 seconds faster than his time last year.

Santa Rosa, which finished second with 62 points, will send Zach Barrett (2nd, 17:17) and Peter Egerton (4th, 17:30); Rancho Colate's Jeff Flanders (6th, 17:37) will also advance.

Ursuline, thanks to a strong ninth-place finish by Brenna Nurmi, edged Campolindo for second in Division IV. The Bears had 86 points to Campolindo's 87. Clear Lake's Melody Haas, who won last week's NCS qualifier at Spring Lake, placed fourth in 20:57.

Santa Rosa's Michelle McConnico was a surprise winner in the Division I girls' race (21:27) and became the fourth different Panther girl to win the race over the last four years. Rhonda Mazza won in 1990, Nika Horn in 1991 and Megan Reeder last year.

Healdsburg's Hector Delgado, this year's top Sonoma County League runner, missed qualifying by one spot, after finishing 10th (17:28) in Division III. Delgado qualified last year for state and placed 28th.

Middletown's Justin Cude, who dominated the Coastal Mountain Conference this year, qualified with his eighth-place finish (17:40) in Division IV. According to his coach, the sophomore was just hoping to break the top 20.
