

# Local sports teams tops in classroom

All of the competition wasn't on the field, in the pool and on the court for the Central Coast Section's athletic teams last fall. It was also quite competitive in the classroom for the students who made up the CCS's sports teams.

Lynbrook, Saratoga and Cupertino proved to be as competitive as the rest by placing among the leaders in the CCS fall season scholastic championship competition.

Three teams from each school finished with competitive grade-point averages in the scholastic race, and Cupertino and Saratoga each had teams win championships.

The Cupertino girls' cross country team won a CCS title with a 3.86 GPA. Not only was that the best mark among cross country teams, it was the best GPA for any sports team in the section.

Cupertino placed second to Leland in boys' cross country, the

Chargers at 3.70 and the Pioneers at 3.61, and Cupertino also took third place in girls' tennis at 3.67.

The Saratoga girls' field hockey team won a CCS title with a 3.43 GPA. The Falcons were also fourth in both football (3.10) and girls' volleyball (3.54).

Lynbrook placed second in field hockey (3.41), fourth in boys' cross country (3.52) and fifth in girls' tennis (3.65).
