Castro Valley made a shambles of the HAAL Finals, putting five men in the first six and seven in the first twelve. The team score of 17 breaks Tennyson's 13-year-old record by 10 points! Ken Romiguere ran off and hid from everybody in recording his second straight HAAL championship, but he had plenty of support: junior Charlie Harb was All-League for the second year in a row, and Scott Flagg, Dave Fisher and Tom Jensen were all-leaguers for the first time. The first five runners picked up PR's for the course: Ken Romiguere by 5 seconds, Charlie Harb by 9, Scott Flagg by 23, Dave Fisher by 38 and Tom Jensen by 35.

The team goes on to the NCS 3A Southern Area meet a week from Saturday at Joaquin Miller Park in Oakland. The competition there will be much stiffer, as Mission San Jose will be the favorite. Other teams which are expected to be in the fight for the four spots for North Coast are Alameda, DeLaSalle, Bishop O'Dowd, Tennyson and Newark.

Castro Valley's frosh-soph team finished an illustrious season by demolishing the rest of the league in the HAAL Finals. The Trojans placed all seven of their runners in the first twelve, and five in the first six. Larry Guinee led the way, as he has all year, becoming one of the first runners ever to win two consecutive frosh-soph championships. In the process, he shattered the course record of 10:33, set by Dennis McDonald earlier this year. Doug Rodgers battled McDonald all the way to the hill, then pulled away strongly to finish second. Then came the three amazing freshmen, Steve Stevenson, Dave Anderson and Dave Shea, finishing 4-5-6 to assure the slaughter. Rick Leizgold also ran a strong race, hanging on for ninth.
