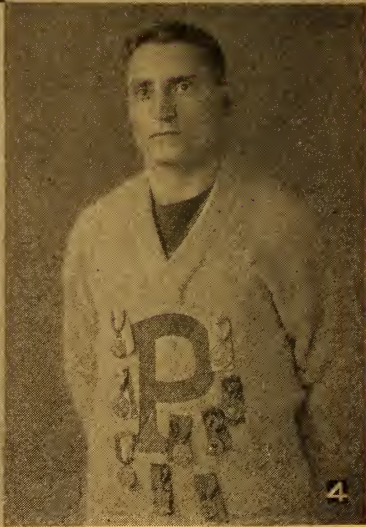

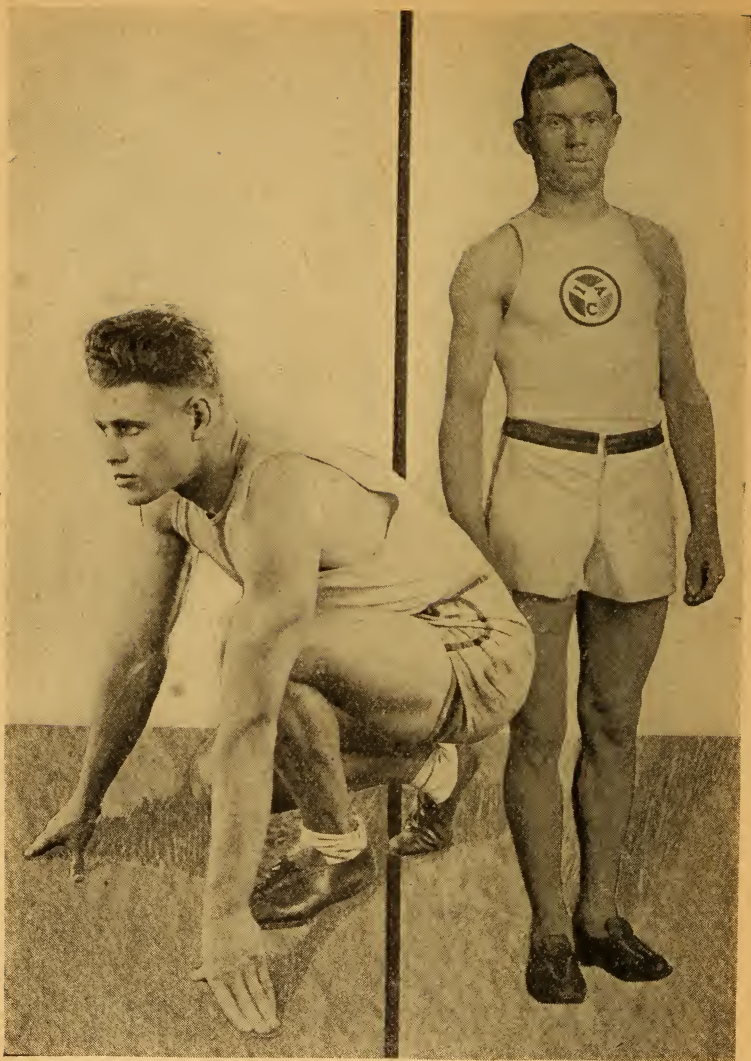

WOMEN'S ATHLETIC RECORDS

By HARRY EATON STEWART, M.D.

The year 1920 was the best in the history of track athletics for women in this country. More new schools instituted the sport and more records were broken than in any previous single year. It also marked the beginning of organized track work for the women of several European countries. The National Committee has been enlarged to give proper recognition to the South and West, where the interest in this form of women's athletics is growing rapidly.

RULES FOR 1921.

By vote of the committee, the following rules and suggestions were adopted for this year:

1. RULES FOR COMPETITION.

(a) Standard Events—The following events only shall be considered standard, and records in them classified for comparison between schools: Runs—30, 50, 75, 100 and 220 yds. Hurdles—60 yds., four 2ft.; 60 yds., four 2 1-2ft.; 65 yds., six 2 1-2ft.; 100 yds., eight 2ft.; 100 yds., eight 2 1-2ft. Relay races, 4 runners—220 yds. and 440 yds. Jumps—Standing high and broad, running high, broad, and hop-step. Pole vault. Throws—Base ball, basket ball, hurl ball (6 lb.), javelin (Olympic Official), discus (Youth's Official). Shot put—6, 8 and 12 lbs.

(b) The "Amateur Athletic Union Track and Field Rules" shall be official for all events covered by them.

(c) The base ball, basket ball, hurl ball and discus shall all be thrown from an eight-foot circle and measured in the same way as the shot put.

(d) Claims for New Records—Track competition is now so keen and the records of such a high order that it is necessary for the committee to weigh very carefully all new claims for records. Several such claims were set aside in 1920 because the proper conditions were not fulfilled. In order to obviate the necessity of such action in the future, coaches are reminded that:

1. All records must be made in a regular meet.
2. The officials of the meet must sign and file a statement with the committee covering specifically the following points:
 - (a) Three watches used.
 - (b) Start fair and timed by flash of gun.
 - (c) All hurdles remained standing.
 - (d) No wind at back and track level.
 - (e) All distances measured by steel tape.
 - (f) That regulations for each event were complied with.

2. SAFEGUARDS.

The committee earnestly recommends medical examination and close supervision of all track athletes, and the necessity for using extreme care in the construction of jumping pits and hurdles. The following two groups of events are suggestive of the types best suited to beginners and to the trained athlete.

Beginners' Group—30 and 75 yds. run, 60 yds. hurdles (four hurdles, 2ft. high), standing and running broad jumps, running hop, step and jump, base ball throw, basket ball throw.

Advanced Group—50 and 100 yds. run, 100 yds. hurdles (eight hurdles, 2ft. high), running high jump, 8-lb. shot put, discus, javelin or hurl ball throw (in addition to the above group).

The committee does not recommend the use of more strenuous events for women than those listed in the "advanced group."

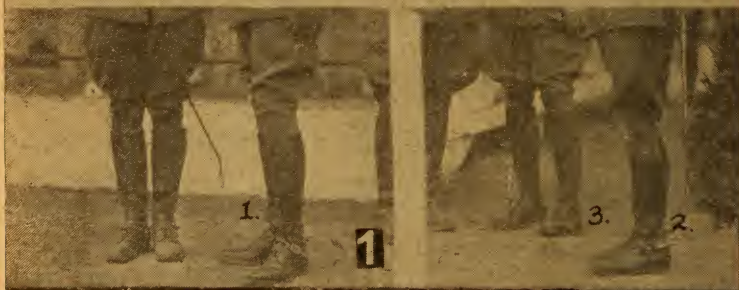

OLYMPIC TRYOUTS, AMERICAN FORCES IN GERMANY.

AMERICAN FORCES IN GERMANY

INTER-ALLIED GAMES AND OLYMPIC TRYOUTS.

While a band played stirring strains on a field gaily bedecked with flags of every Allied nation, the sturdy track and field athletes of the American Forces in Germany showed a clean pair of heels to their British and French opponents in the finals of the Inter-Allied competitions, held Monday, May 24, 1920, on Carnival Island. The final score was: A.F.G., 140 points; British, 59 points; French, 21 points. Incidentally, the meet was also for the purpose of selecting American soldiers from the Coblenz area to go to the United States to engage in tryouts for the final choosing of Army athletes. Eight Yanks bettered marks fixed by the authorities for the States tryouts.

A black-haired, modest young Englishman—Lieut. Royle—proved the star performer of the afternoon. This son of Britain gleaned no less than 20 points for his country. He cantered home first in the 100 meters run, 110 meters high hurdles and 200 meters run, took second place in the hop, step and jump, and topped off his afternoon's work by taking third place in both the 200 meters low hurdles and the running broad jump.

Pvt. Paul of the Eighth Infantry, who hails from Fort Smith, Ark., pressed Royle closely for individual honors. His best work was in the broad jump, which he won easily with the good leap of 20 feet 10 1-2 inches. This was 10 1-2 inches better than the mark set for him to equal in order to journey to the United States for further competition. He also placed first in the 200 meters low hurdles and the running hop, step and jump, and took second in the 110 meters high hurdles. He then entered the 200 meters run and got third in that event, scoring 19 points for the Yanks.

Corp. Jackson of Headquarters Troops trotted away from the field in both the 800 and 1,500 meters. His time in the 1,500 meters, 4 minutes 28 seconds, was two seconds better than that required for entry in the final Army tryouts. Other Army athletes who earned places on the team going to the States were: Lieut. Bill Powell, pole vaulter; Capt. Maulsby, high jumper; Pvt. Cook, who finished second in the 1,500 meters run, just three-fifths of a second behind Jackson; and Lieut. Vogel and Pvt. Soldnen, first and second placers, respectively, in the javelin throw. Lieut. Powell when at college was a star pole vaulter in Missouri Valley Conference meets. He proved that he can still climb over the cross-bar at a good altitude when he won the event at 10 feet. Later he cleared 10 feet 6 inches, this without any practice.

Medals were awarded to all the contestants who had won points in the meet by the Athletic Department of the Y.M.C.A.; Lieut.-Col. Wainwright acting as master of ceremonies. Two thousand people witnessed the meet, including General and Mrs. Allen, the General's staff, and many British and French officers and men. The summary:

THE MARATHON.

Covered with dust, his track suit which had once been white, smeared and streaked, Courttnall, 6th Innerskilling Dragoons of the British Army of the Rhine, crossed the finish line winner of the 42-kilometer Marathon, one of the feature events of the Inter-Allied games and Olympic tryouts. The winner was traveling with a steady stride and showed little effects of the gruelling run. His time for the distance, which is twenty-six and one-fourth miles, was 3 hours 43 minutes 40 seconds.

As Courttnall was drawing into the finish, McNamara of the Provost Marshal Department, A.F. in G., the only other entry to finish the Marathon, was four or five kilometers back on the hot and dusty road, fighting cramps in his legs in a grim determination to finish. The race was notable as being the first Marathon staged by Americans on the Rhine. The qualifying time for the U.S. Olympic trials is three hours flat.

BOXING CONCLUDES THE PROGRAMME.

The meet was concluded at night with a rattling good boxing show. Americans, as usual in Army games, were triumphant, and the meet was a big success. The British and French contestants proved to be good sports and that caused the local entries to really enjoy the competitions.

Among the men responsible for the success of the games are the members of the Athletic Department of the Y.M.C.A. Pat Brannon, the head of that section; Charles Tooze, promoter of swimming, boxing and the Marathon; Al Haddleton, in charge of track and field; Bill Hefelfinger, who did hard work in connection with the tennis tournament, and Lew Riess and Bob Baker, general all-around utility athletic promoter, all are worthy of commendation for their untiring efforts in behalf of the meet.

BRITISH EMPIRE-UNITED STATES INVITATION MEET.

Under the auspices of the Achilles Club, a dual meet was arranged for September 4, at London, with representatives from the United States Olympic team and British athletes. The purpose of the meeting being to promote amateur athletic interest in Great Britain, the programme was made up largely of relay events, this latter form of racing not being as well known in England as in the United States. Experts familiar with the ability of the contestants figured that each country would have an opportunity to win five events, and each country did—but not the five that were figured. Great Britain won the running high jump and the 400 yards relay, which the United States was confident of winning, and, on the contrary, the Britons lost the four-mile relay and the three-mile team race, which they had hoped to carry off. Thirty thousand persons witnessed the contests. In the evening a banquet was given by the London Field to the two teams, at which the speakers all expressed their gratifica-

tion at the success of the dual competition and hoped that it would be the forerunner of many more similar international events.

UNITED STATES-FRANCE-SWEDEN TRIPLE MEET.

At the conclusion of the Olympic Games a very cordial invitation was extended to the Swedish and United States teams to participate in a triple meet under the auspices of the French Amateur Athletic Union, to be held in the Pershing Stadium, at Colombes, near Paris, August 28 and 29. The team selected to represent the United States scored 134 points to 123 for Sweden and 78 for France. Each country was allotted two representatives in each event and the scoring was on the basis of 7 points for first, 5 for second, 4 for third, and 1 for fourth. On the second and last day of the meet, 25,000 spectators filled the athletic grounds showing by their presence and enthusiasm the keen interest the French nation is taking in competitive athletics. On the evening of the 28th a banquet was tendered to the visiting athletes. M. Gaston Vidal, president of the French A.A.U., thanked the foreign athletes on behalf of the French Sports Association, which sponsored the triple meet, for their participation, and urged frequent international competition in the future.
