President Amateur Athletic Union of the United States.

Mr. Hulbert always has been active in the promotion of athletics and for years was Chairman of the Amateur Athletic Union Committee on Public Parks, Playgrounds, Municipal Gymnasias and Baths. He has held public office for a number of years, having served three terms in Congress from the 21st District, New York, and later became Commissioner of Docks and Ferries of the City of New York. While a Member of Congress Mr. Hulbert introduced a bill for the improvement of East Potomac Park, Washington, D. C., as a public recreation ground with facilities for all pastimes, including a stadium, and his project was adopted and is rapidly nearing completion. Mr. Hulbert at present is President of the Board of Aldermen of the City of New York, a Member of the Finger Lakes State Park Commission by appointment of Governor Alfred E. Smith, and President of the Waterway League of America.

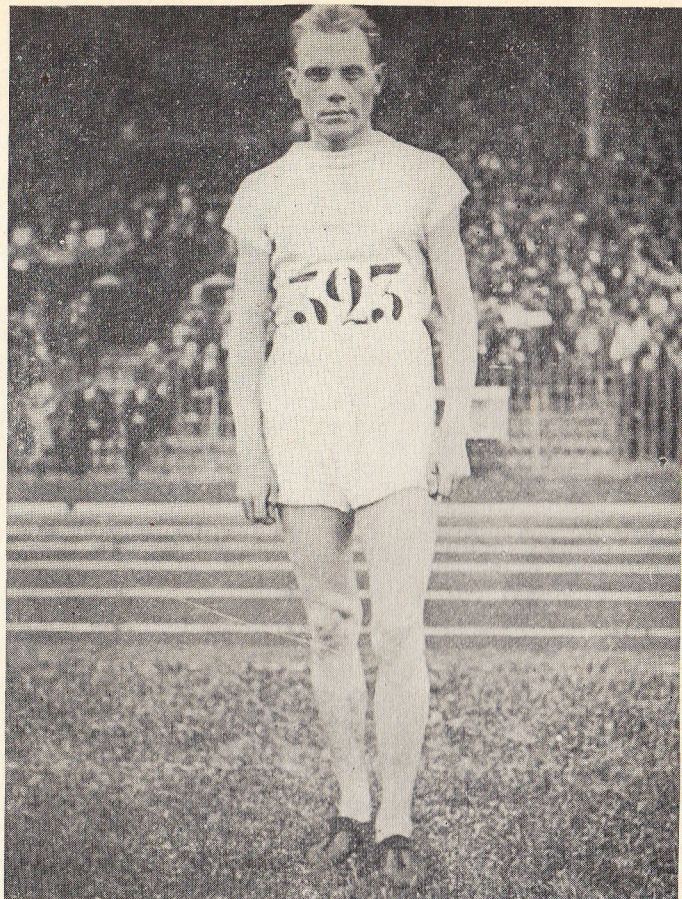

PAAVO NURMI,

Nurmi was the outstanding athlete in the Olympic track competition with four victories to his credit, in three of which he bettered the existing Olympic records. He won the 1500 Meters Run in 3m.53.6s., the 5000 Meters Run in 14m.31.2s., and finished first in the 3000 Meters Team Race in 8m.32s. His time for winning the 10,000 Meters Cross-Country Run was 32m.54.8s. Nurmi came to the United States late in 1924 and made his first public appearance at the Finnish-American A.C. Games at Madison Square Garden, New York, January 6, where he lowered three world's indoor records by winning the Mile Run in 4m.13 3-5s. and the 5000 Meters Race in 14m.44 3-5s. His time for 1500 Meters was 3m.56 1-5s., made in the Mile Run. The famous old Garden was crowded with spectators eager to see the Finnish marvel in action, and thousands were turned away. Nurmi's masterful style and his wonderful speed were so impressive as to exceed even the greatest enthusiasm. Day after day records have fallen and the wonderful runner from the North has kindled the interest in track in America in a way that no other performer has ever equaled.

HAROLD M. OSBORN,
Illinois A.C.

Osborn won both the Running High Jump and the Decathlon at the Olympic Games, creating a new world's record of 7,710.775 points for the Decathlon. He competed for the United States against the British Empire at Stamford Bridge, London, and in this meet tied with Leroy T. Brown, a compatriot, for leading honors in the Running High Jump. At the Tailteam Games in Dublin he won both Running and Standing High Jumps. Osborn's outstanding performance of the year was a leap of 6 feet 8 1/4 inches, made at Urbana, Ill., May 27, 1924, which broke a world's record of ten years' standing.

Winner of the Olympic 200 Meters Run in 21.6s., which equals the best time made at any previous Olympiad. At the Final Olympic Tryouts held at Cambridge, Mass., June 14, Scholz ran the 200 meters in 20.9s., breaking by three-tenths of a second the world's record made by Charlie Paddock in 1921.

Each of the winners in the trial heats improved on the record for this event, which was run only once before in the Olympics. P. Hodge of Great Britain won it in 1920 at Antwerp in 10m.2.4s., finishing a hundred meters in front of P. J. Flynn, who ran second. In his first trial Willie Ritola won his heat in 9m.59s., and in the final established a new Olympic record of 9m.33.6s.

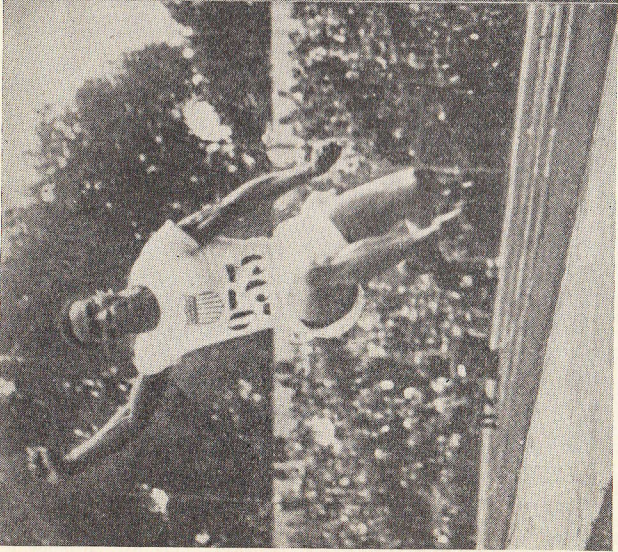
