Standard Quality to a Standard Policy.

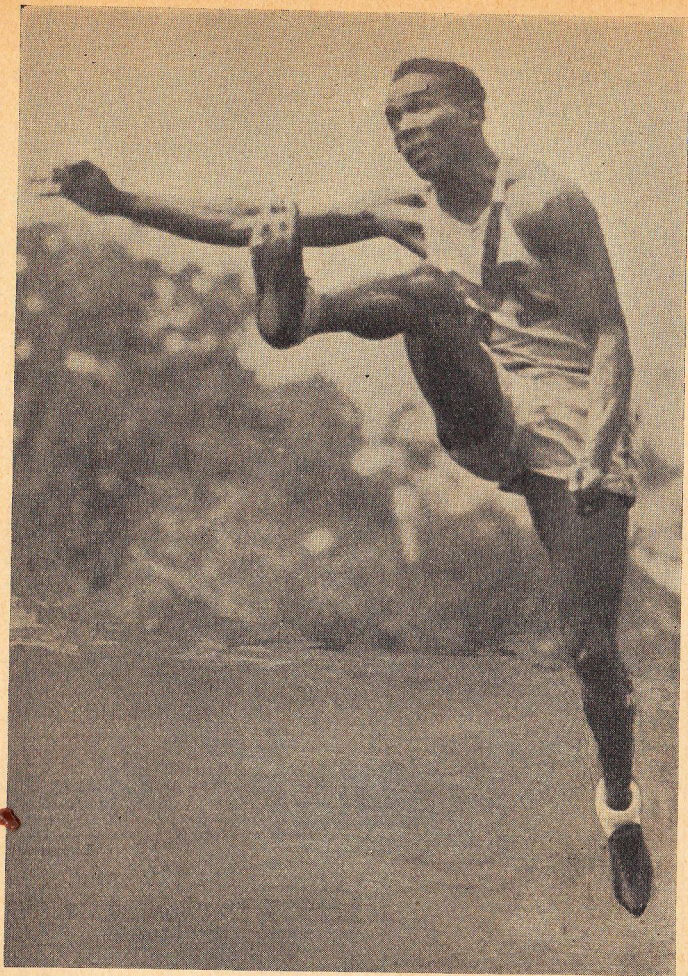

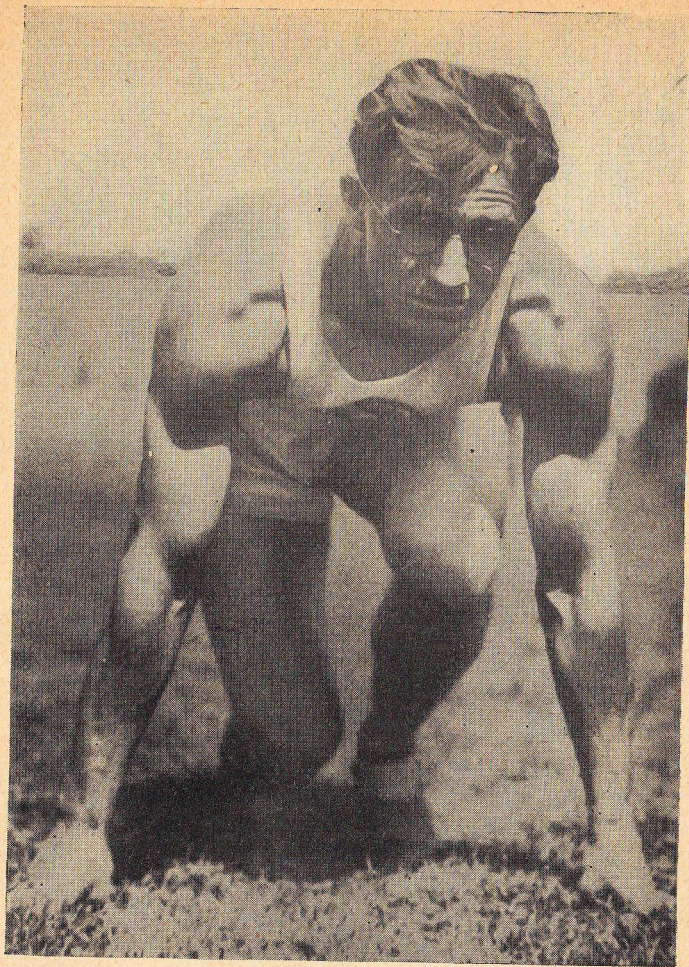

DE HART HUBBARD,
University of Michigan.

Hubbard holds the world's record for the running broad jump at 25ft. 10 7/8-in. He established this mark on his final appearance in competition as a representative of the University of Michigan, and at the same meet sprinted 100 yards in 9.8s., a new record for the National Collegiate Athletic Association Championships. Just one week before he had run the "100" in 9.74s. at the Western Conference Championships, a new record for the Big Ten. Hubbard is the A.A.U. National Broad Jump Champion and the outstanding athlete at this specialty, as he has bettered 25 feet on several occasions.

Illinois A.C.

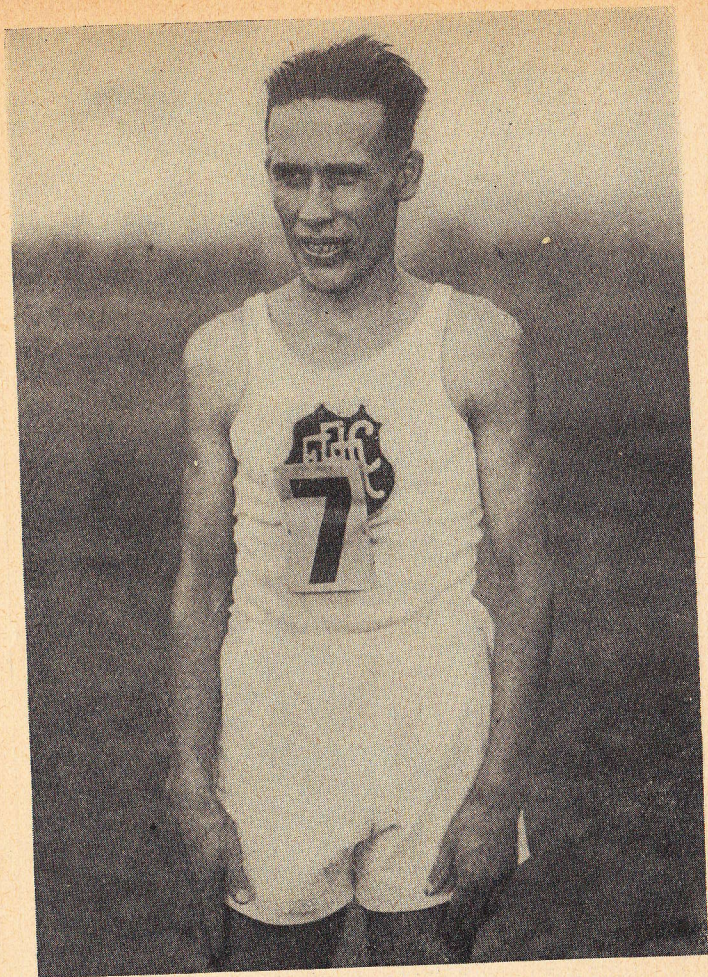
Osborn undoubtedly is the greatest all-round athlete of the present era. He holds the world's record for the Decathlon, made at the Olympic Games of 1924, and as a high jumper he has outclassed most of his contemporaries. His mark of 6ft. 8 1-4in. is the world's outdoor record for the running high jump, and he also holds the indoor records with a running jump of 6ft. 6 1-4in. and a standing jump of 5ft. 5 3-4in. He is the A.A.U. National Champion for the outdoor Decathlon and running high jump, and for the indoor standing and running high jumps, standing broad jump and 70 yards high hurdles. P.&A., Photo.



PAAVO NURMI,
Finland.

Nurmi has been acclaimed the greatest runner of modern times, and judged by his remarkable achievements in the United States the distinction is well merited. Great crowds turned out to see the phenomenal Finn in action, and in many cases thousands of would-be spectators were turned away for lack of accommodation. Of the many new records established by Nurmi, the outstanding performance was his mark of 8m. 58 1-5s. for two miles, as no human being was conceded a chance to run the distance under nine minutes. Nurmi's visit has been a great boon to distance running in this country, and it is hoped that the interest aroused will result in the development of more high class distance runners.

WILLIE RITOLA,

Finnish-American A.C., New York.

A.A.U. National 10-Mile, Cross-Country and Indoor Steeplechase Champion.

Ritola was Nurmi's chief rival while the latter was competing in the United States and the two Finns drew great throngs of spectators whenever they opposed each other. During the 1925 indoor season Ritola established new world's records for three, four and five miles and for 5000 meters, and he won several outdoor championships. At the Olympic Games of 1924 Ritola competed for Finland and won two events—the 10000 meters run and 3000 meters steeplechase—in both of which he bettered the existing Olympic records.

A.A.U. National 100-Yard Run Champion.

Hussey first came into prominence as a star of the Stuyvesant High School track team. He was a member of the 1924 Olympic team and in February, 1925, entered Boston College. He won his first national title at San Francisco in the A.A.U. National Championships of 1925, when he sprinted 100 yards in 9 4-5s. to win by a few inches from Jackson V. Scholz and DeHart Hubbard.

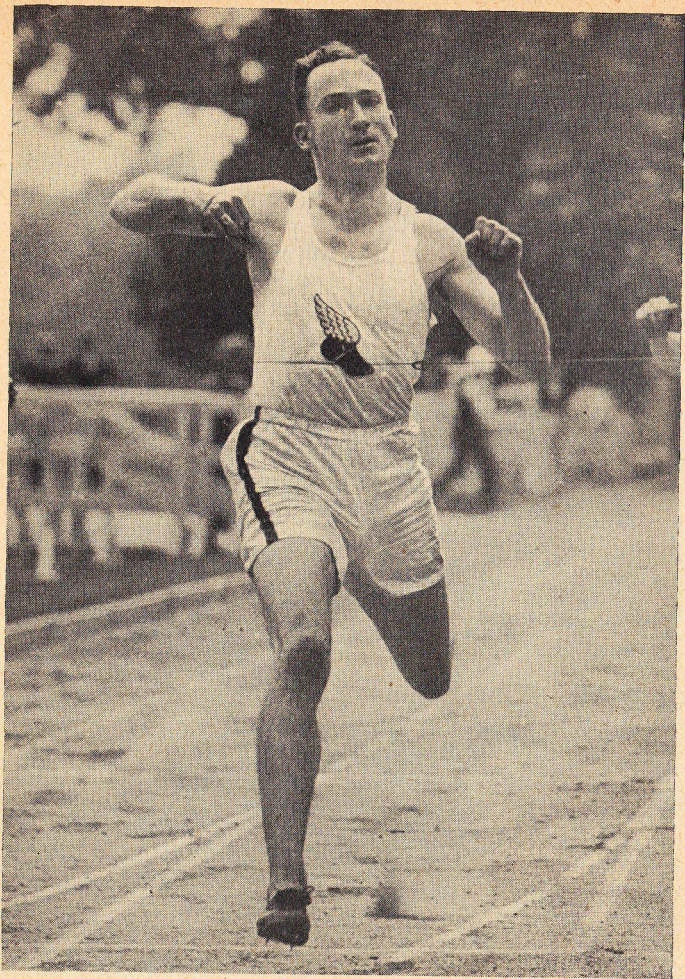

Paddock holds the world's record for 220 yards run in 20.8s and is a coholder of the world's record for 100 yards in 9.6s. Murchison holds American indoor records of 6 1-5s. for 60 yards run and 22 2-5s. for 220 yards, and is a coholder of the 300-yard record in 31 1-5s.

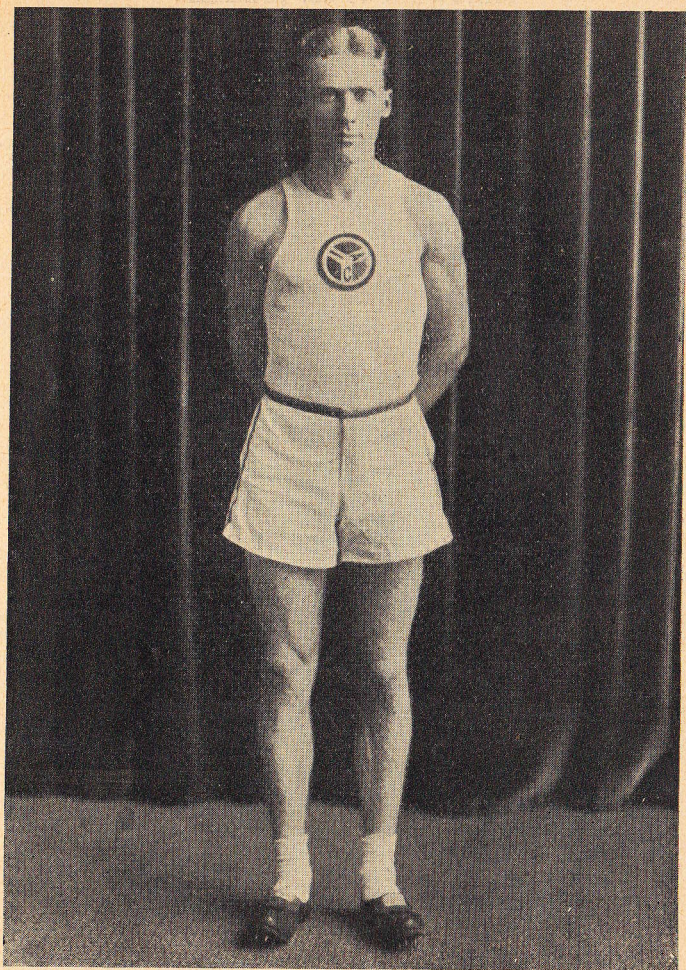

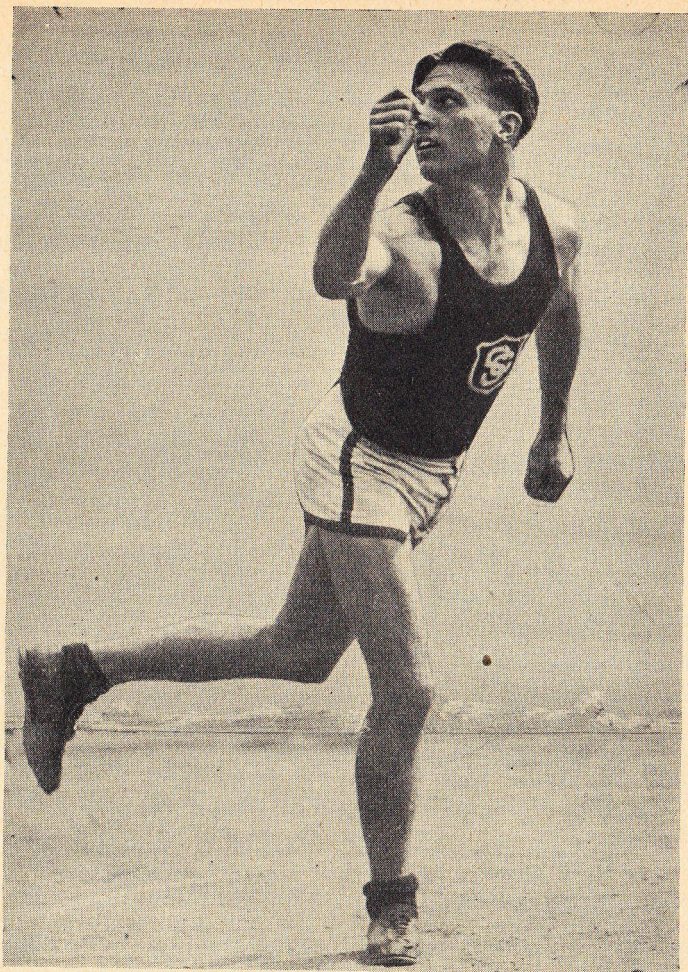

"The photograph illustrates the value of a combined pushaway and shoot. This effort tends to throw the vaulter well into the middle of the pit and eliminates any danger of striking the cross-bar during the descent. In this instance the athlete has properly thrown his hands upward to guard against this tendency. His body angle shows that the clearance was preceded by the recommended foot elevation and that his high point was correctly estimated. The position of the pole proves that the pushaway was of a vigorous order and also points toward a well balanced clearance

position. This type of form is in line with the style that has been recommended most frequently, although it must be understood that each vaulter must have an individual style. Lacking the ability to generate sufficient momentum during the rise, or to combine the shoot with the pushaway, the athlete must work out a form that is more in accordance with the jackknife or the arch style."
