Owing to the graduation of Mr. H. Hunt Bradley, Cornell, President of the Association, it became necessary to select a new president under the provision of Article IX of the Constitution, and at a meeting of the Association held October 10, 1926, Mr. G. Norman Scott, Cornell, was duly elected president.

The Executive Committee, pursuant to Article XVII of the Constitution, appointed Mr. Gustavus T. Kirby, Columbia, to be Referee and Mr. Robert E. Rosenberg, Columbia, Manager of the Seventeenth Annual Cross-Country Runs. The Committee thereafter approved the report of Mr. Rosenberg showing receipts of \$341.20, expenditures of \$286.05 and a net profit of \$55.15.

The Executive Committee, pursuant to Article XIX of the Constitution, selected Mr. Gustavus T. Kirby, Columbia, as Referee and Mr. Robert E. Rosenberg, Columbia, as Manager of the Sixth Annual Indoor Championship Athletic Meeting.

The Executive Committee recommends to the Association the admission of Michigan State College and that the applications of Marquette, St. Bonaventure and Alfred to membership in the Association be laid on the table.

The Executive Committee approved the report of Mr. Stanley deJ. Osborne, Harvard, as Manager of the 1926 Track and Field Championship Meeting, showing receipts of \$27,829.15, expenditures of \$4,908.55 and net profits of \$22,920.60.

The Executive Committee appointed as delegates to the A.A.U. Convention, held November 14-16, 1926, at Baltimore, Messrs. Gustavus T. Kirby, Columbia; A. Jocelyn H. Magrath, N.Y.U.; Rupert B. Thomas Jr., Princeton; Robert Garrett, Princeton, and James A. Taylor, Columbia, alternate.

The report of the treasurer for the fiscal year, March 6, 1926, to March 5, 1927, showed: Balance in the bank of \$10,990.80 on March 6, 1926; receipts of \$28,307.53; expenditures of \$18,256.80, and a balance in the treasury of \$21,041.53.

Under the direction of the Committee there has been published the Souvenir Volume of the championship games, which is now on sale at \$5. This volume covers the years 1923, 1924, 1925 and 1926 and is a very fine memento of these championships.

There was also published the annual Handbook of the Association.

In connection with the Fiftieth Games the Association held a noteworthy banquet and celebration to commemorate the founding of the Association. The report of this banquet and celebration is fully covered in the Souvenir Volume.

The Executive Committee submits to this convention and recommends for adoption a budget calling for the expenditure of \$14,850.00 and expected revenue of \$18,550.

The Executive Committee recommends to the convention that the invitation of the University of Pennsylvania to hold the Fifty-first Track and Field Meeting be accepted.

FIFTY-FIRST ANNUAL TRACK AND FIELD CHAMPIONSHIP MEETING.

The Fifty-first Annual Track and Field Championship Meeting was held at Franklin Field, Philadelphia, on May 27 and 28, 1927. From the point of view of competition and the conduct of the Meet, this year's championships showed an improvement over even the remarkable Meet of last year.

The championship was won by Stanford University with a total of 36½ points; Penn State was second with 27 points; Yale third with 23½, and Southern California fourth with 23 points.

After nearly a month of rain both days were almost ideal save for a strong wind on Friday. Unfortunate experiences of the past proved to those conducting the meet that the field must be kept clear of inactive officials and competitors. For this reason solely inactive officials were required to sit in the stands and it is believed that the inner field presented very nearly the minimum of crowding.

The competition was uniformly excellent. Four records were broken.

Sabin W. Carr of Yale accomplished the remarkable feat of breaking the world's record in the pole vault at 14 feet after a thrilling competition with Lee S. Barnes of Southern California, who vaulted 13 feet 9½ inches. W. P. Edmonds of Stanford, who was third with 13 feet 6¼ inches, was 4¼ inches above the former intercollegiate record. The fifth man in this competition did 13 feet.

Saturday witnessed the breaking of the record in the 220-yard dash. The last track event to be broken was the 100 yards in 1922. Previous to that the 120 yards hurdle had fallen in 1920, the two-mile in 1919, the quarter and the half in 1916, the mile in 1913, the 220 yards hurdle in 1898, and the 220 in 1896. This year's meet saw the breaking of the oldest track record on the books in the performance of Charles E. Borah of Southern California in running the 220 in 20.9-10 seconds. The old record was made by Bernard J. Wefers of Georgetown and afterwards was equaled by R. C. Craig of Michigan in 1910 and Donald Lippincott of Pennsylvania in 1913.

The record in the broad jump fell to Alfred H. Bates of Penn State with a jump of 24 feet 8½ inches. It is noteworthy that each of the five point winners jumped over 24 feet.

The record in the javelin throw fell to Creth B. Hines of Georgetown with a throw of 205 feet 7½ inches. Vincent Moroney, also of Georgetown, who was second, equaled the previous record of 199 feet 1 inch.

THE CROSS-COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS, 1926.

The Eighteenth Annual 'Varsity and Seventh Annual Freshman Cross-Country Runs of the Association were held over the I.C.A.A.A. Cross-Country Course at Van Cortlandt Park on Monday afternoon, November 22, 1926. The events were favored with unusually fine weather which brought out one of the largest crowds of spectators in the history of the runs.

The result of the 'Varsity Run was extremely close and was not known until the score sheets were carefully digested. Penn State emerged the winner with 65 points, beating Syracuse, whose score was 68. Yale was third with 95 and Harvard fourth with 102. William J. Cox of Penn State, a sophomore, was the winner of the 'Varsity Run by approximately 25 yards from Macauley L. Smith, Yale '27, champion in 1924. His time was 30m. 4s. While the Association has never recognized cross-country records, due to the necessity of changing the layout of the course somewhat each year, the fact remains that this is the fastest time for the six miles in the history of the run and was 30 seconds faster than the previous year's performance, which in turn had been 50 seconds better than its predecessor. It is interesting to compare this time with the time of Willie Ritola, 30m. 3-5s. in winning the National A.A.U. Cross Country Championship over the same course. While the latter race was run in the face of a wind it was not run over hurdles, as in the I.C.A.A.A. Run, which are in themselves a substantial handicap.

James C. Loucks, Syracuse, '27, who failed to attain the championship in 1925 by a yard from Willard L. Tibbetts of Harvard, was third, a similar distance behind Smith.

Horace H. Benson, Cornell, '29, winner of the freshman race last year, was fourth in 30m. 37s.

The 'Varsity Cup has been won four times by both Cornell and Syracuse. Pennsylvania, Maine, Pittsburgh and Penn State have each won the cup once. To remain in the permanent possession of any college the cup must be won five times.
