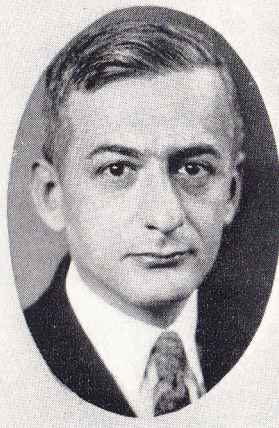

OLYMPIC TOPICS

AN EXPRESSION.

BY BARON PIERRE DE COUBERTIN, FOUNDER OF MODERN OLYMPIANISM.

The main issue in life is not the victory, but the fight; the essential is not to have won, but to have fought well. To spread these precepts is to pave the way for a more valiant humanity, stronger, and consequently more scrupulous and more generous. These words extend across whole domains and form the basis of a healthy and happy philosophy.

The Olympic movement gives the world an ideal which reckons with the reality of life, and includes a possibility to guide this reality toward the great Olympic Idea: "*Joie des muscles, culte de la beauté, travail pour le service de la famille et de la société; ces trois éléments unis en un faisceau indissoluble.*"

May joy and good fellowship reign, and, in this manner, may the Olympic Torch pursue its way through the ages, increasing friendly understanding among nations for the good of a humanity always more enthusiastic, more courageous, and more pure.

QUADRENNIAL MEETING OF THE ASSOCIATION.

Sport governing bodies of the United States to the number of fifty-three were represented at the quadrennial meeting of the American Olympic Association, held at the Chamber of Commerce Building, Washington, D. C., November 19, 1930. In an atmosphere of harmony and concerted effort that augurs well for the success of the United States in the 1932 Olympic Games, all the groundwork for America's participation in the Third Olympic Winter Games at Lake Placid and the Tenth Olympic Games at Los Angeles was laid. A new constitution and by-laws, framed with the co-operation of the presidents of the Amateur Athletic Union and National Collegiate Athletic Association, was adopted without a dissenting vote.

The following officers were unanimously elected: Avery Brundage, Chicago, Ill., president; Dr. Charles W. Kennedy, Princeton, N. J., vice-president; Frederick W. Rubien, New York, secretary; George W. Graves, Detroit, Mich., treasurer; Dr. Graeme M. Hammond, president emeritus.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE ORGANIZED.

The Executive Committee of the American Olympic Association has been formed in accordance with the amended constitution and by-laws as adopted at the quadrennial meeting at Washington last November. 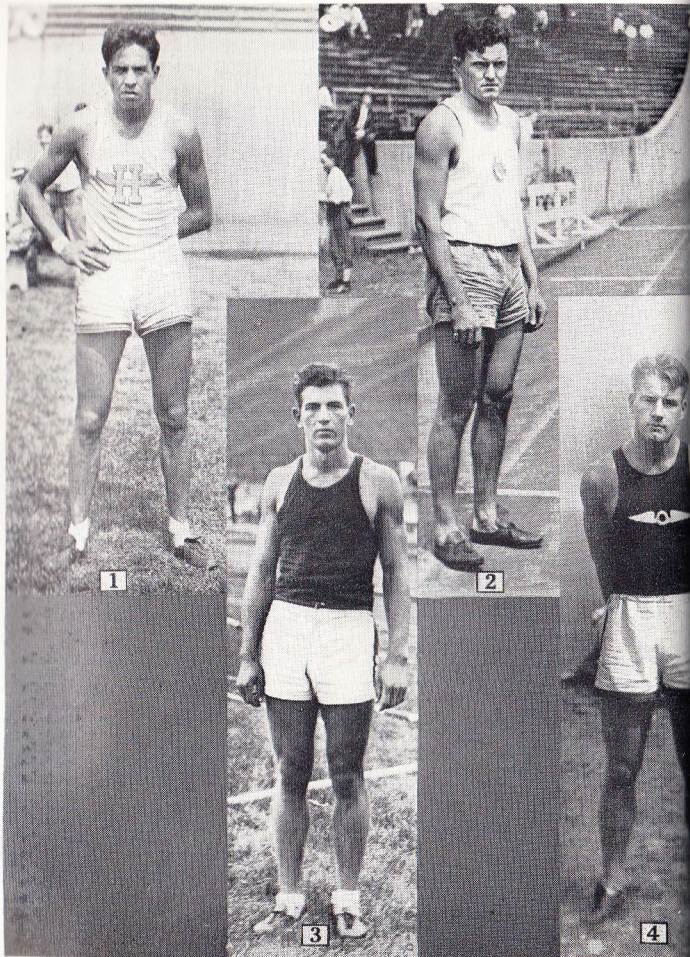

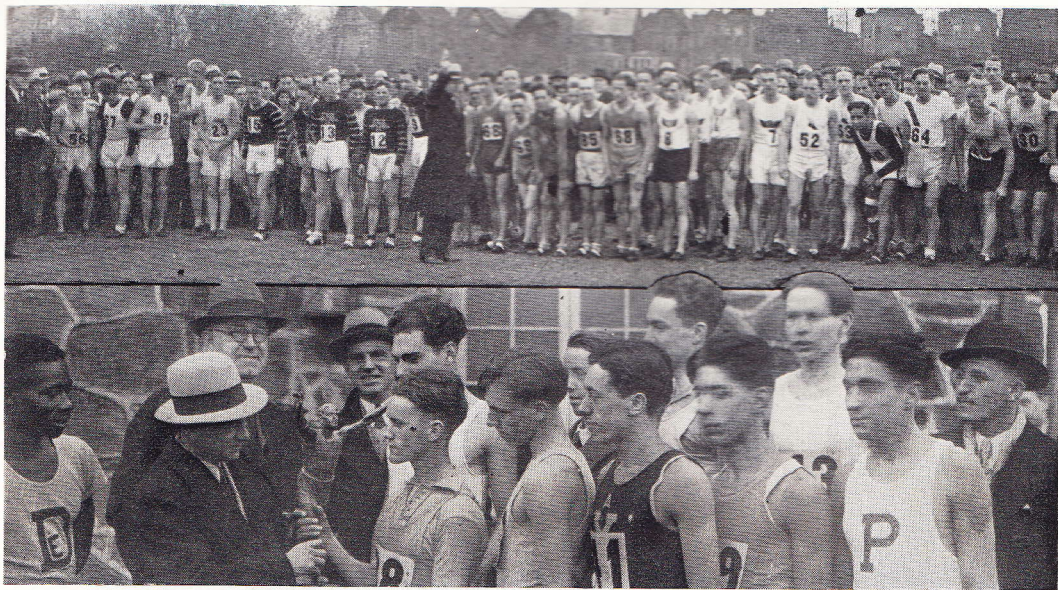

SPEED SKATING.

The Amateur Skating Union of the United States, through its president, Joseph K. Savage, has reiterated its wish to the Internationale Eislauf Vereinigung that the speed skating races at the Third Olympic Games, at Lake Placid, be skated in a modified American style. If the I.E.V. grants this request, the races will be skated in heats consisting of a reasonable number of men rather than the European style against time. The European style of racing not only will draw no spectators in this country, but, as was shown in the last Olympiad, is not nearly so fair to the competitors because of change in ice and weather conditions.

At the meeting of the I.E.V. held last spring, a committee was appointed to consider the adoption of the American style of racing for the Third Olympic Winter Games.

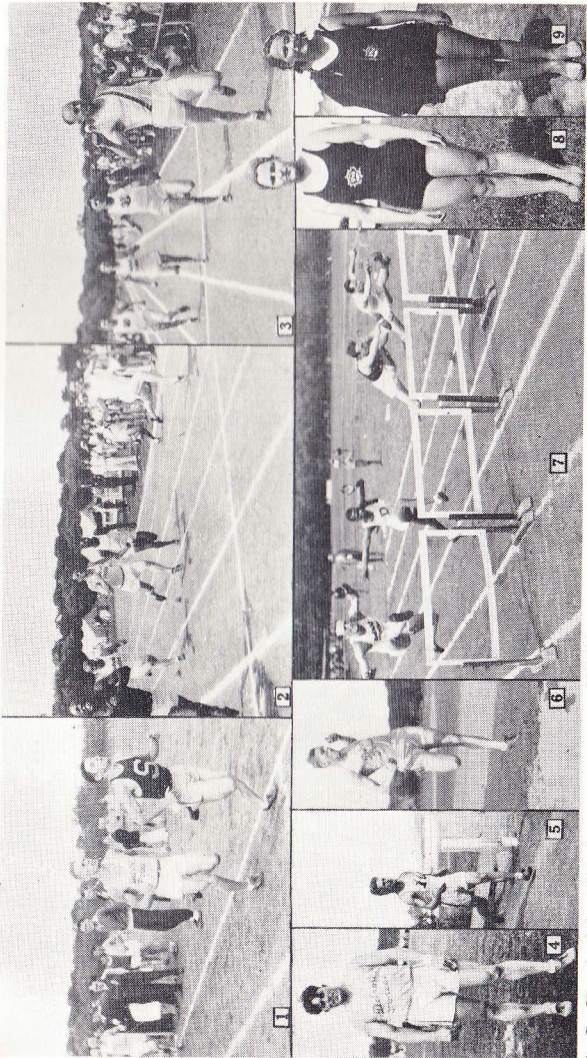

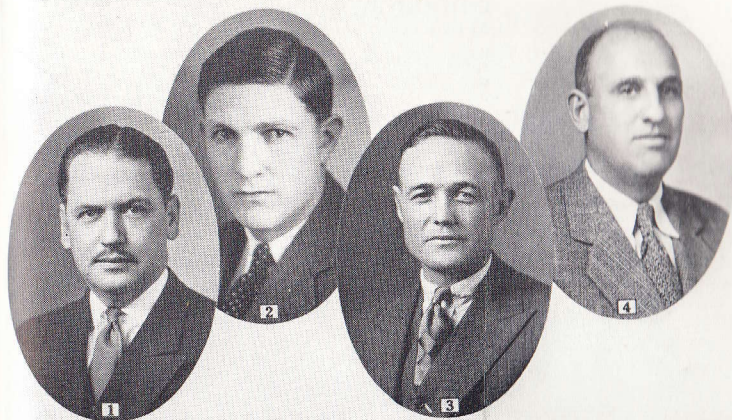

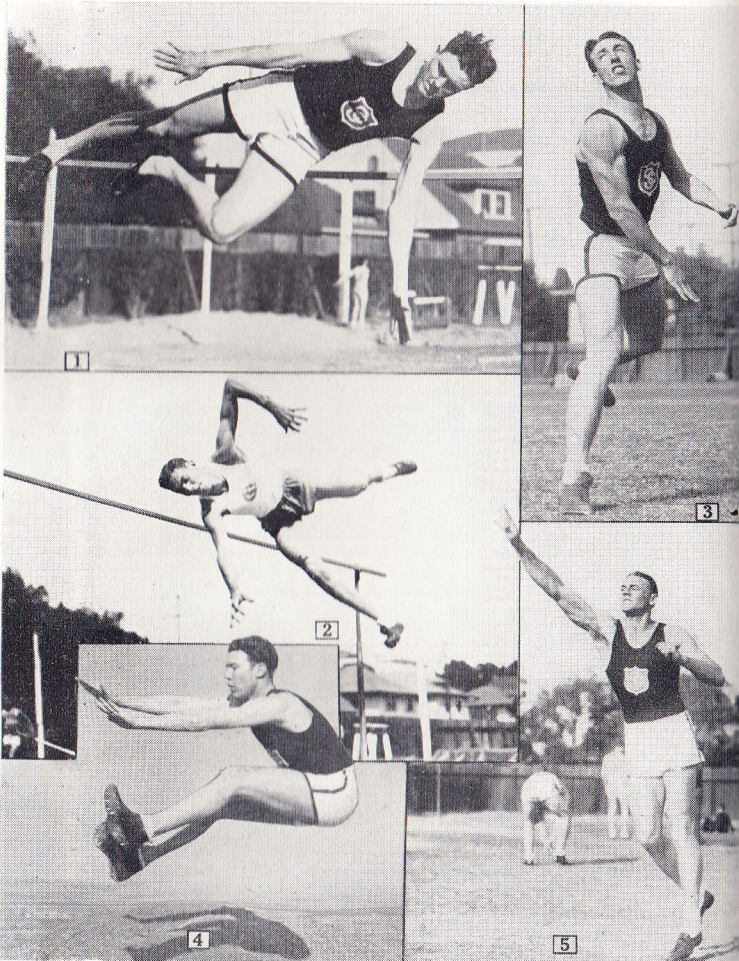

BRITISH EMPIRE GAMES

Three hundred thirty athletes representing eleven nations—Newfoundland, Bermuda, British Guiana, Australia, South Africa, New Zealand, Wales, Ireland, Scotland, England and Canada—competed in the British Empire Games at Hamilton, Canada, the week of August 16 to 23, 1930. The opening ceremony, including the parade of the athletes, was very impressive. Viscount Willingdon, Governor General, formally opened the Games after extending a welcome to all competitors. In Viscount Willingdon's party in the vice regal box were Count Baillet-Latour, President of the International Olympic Committee; E. W. Beatty, Sir Alfred Currie and other prominent guests.

King George sent a message extolling the inception of the Games and adding: "Whatever may be the result, I am sure that this friendly competition cannot fail to foster a spirit of brotherhood and sportsmanship amongst all taking part in the Games, for the success of which I send my best wishes." The Prince of Wales also forwarded a message which was read to the athletes. An average of 15,000 spectators per day attended the stadium events.

England with a total of twenty-five championships captured the principal honors. Canada's athletes contributed seventeen titles and enabled the Dominion to finish second in the standing. South Africa with six first places made the next best showing.

Percy Williams of Canada, the Olympic 100 and 200 meters champion, won the 100-yard dash in 9.9 seconds, despite the fact that he completed the race with a pulled muscle on the left leg near the groin.

Mr. M. M. Robinson, Honorary Manager of the 1928 Canadian Olympic Track and Field Team at Amsterdam, organized the Games. The next Games will be held at Johannesburg, South Africa, in 1934.

CUBAN AND MEXICAN SWIMMING TEAMS AT CENTRAL AMERICA GAMES.

CENTRAL AMERICA GAMES

March 15 to April 5, 1930.

About 800 athletes represented nine nations in the Second Central America Games, which were held successfully at Havana, Cuba, from March 15 to April 5, 1930. The competing nations were Costa Rica, Cuba, Guatemala, Honduras, Jamaica, Mexico, Panama, Porto Rico and Salvador. Cuba was the winner by a decisive margin, followed by Mexico in second place and Panama third. A number of the events, particularly the opening ceremonies, were witnessed by 50,000 persons, the largest number of spectators in the history of sporting events in Cuba. The Third Central America Games will be conducted at San Salvador in 1934. Following is a summary of the 1930 meet as compiled by J. M. U.S. TEAM SUCCESSFUL IN EUROPE

A track and field team from the United States composed of Steve Anderson, University of Washington, hurdler; Pete Bowen, University of Pittsburgh, sprinter and quarter-miler; George Bullwinkle, College of the City of New York, half-miler and miler; Ed Hamm, Georgia Tech, Olympic champion in the broad jump, and Tommy Warne, Northwestern, pole vaulter, made a successful invasion of Europe last summer. In addition, Crosby Pendleton, a sprinter from the University of Washington, elected to accompany the team and compete in the meets.

The boys arrived at Köln, Germany, the day before the first meet and with only one day's training competed against some of Europe's finest athletes. Anderson defeated Peterson of Sweden in the hurdles in 14.6. Bullwinkle defeated a fine field in the 800 meters and turned in the time of 1:52.8. Hamm and Bowen both ran in the 100 meters and were beaten by Lammers, one of Germany's best, in the time of 10.78.; Bowen ran second, Hamm, third. At the finish the track turned and Hamm and Bowen collided, causing Ed to fall and inflicting some painful cinder burns and a slightly strained muscle. As a result he was defeated in his specialty, the broad jump. Bowen easily won from a mediocre field in the 400 meters in 48.78., and Warne was an easy victor in the pole vault with a height of 13ft. 1in. Pendleton failed to place in the 200 meters. A relay team composed of Anderson, Pendleton, Hamm and Bowen defeated the Charlottenburg Club in the 400 meter relay—time, 42s.

It was a tired bunch of athletes who rode down to Dusseldorf for another meet the following night. Anderson again whipped Peterson in 14.9s. Bowen eked out a win in 49.2s. and Bullwinkle, running in the 1000 meters, won easily in 2:30.2. Hamm jumped but was still suffering from his injury and took a beating from Müller of Dusseldorf. Warne was again an easy victor in the pole vault with the same result as in the evening previous. The Charlottenburg relay team were revenged for the defeat of the night before, but failed to make good time.

After a day's rest in Dusseldorf, the team moved on to Berlin and had the benefit of two workouts and another day's rest before competing again. The track at the Charlottenburg stadium was slow and unkept and the time suffered accordingly. Anderson again took Peterson's measure with a 15s. performance. Bowen easily defeated Englehardt, formerly Germany's best at the middle distances, in 49s. flat. Warne defeated the German champion, Wagner, with a vault of 13ft. 3in. Hamm was beaten by the German champion, Meier, who leaped less than 24 feet to win. Bullwinkle, running with the express intention of making exceptional time on such a slow track, ran himself out at 700 meters and was barely able to stagger in and failed to place. The relay team, this time running 4x200 meters, defeated the Charlottenburg Club in the fine time of 1:27.

Entraining for Copenhagen the day following the meet, the team worked out one day and with another day to rest, competed in a meet which turned out to be a two-day affair. The first day Anderson won the hurdles with no dangerous competition against him in 14.8s. Bowen won the 100 meters in 10.7s. Hamm won the 200-meter in 22.6s., with Pendleton second. The relay team, running this time at the 1000 meter medley—Hamm, 100 meter; Anderson, 200 meter; Pendleton, 300, and Bowen, 400—won easily in 2m. flat. The second day Hamm jumped 24 feet to win the broad jump; Bowen was an easy victor in the 400 meter with 49.6s., Warne vaulted 13ft. 1in. to win easily, and Hamm won the 60 meters, with Pendleton second, in 6.9s.

From Copenhagen the teams moved to Stockholm for the Stockholm Meet, which was extended over three days. Competitors from fourteen countries were gathered to compete in the various events and it promised to be an interesting meeting.

The first day, Sunday, Anderson competed in the invitation hurdle race against Peterson and Wennstrom of Sweden, Facelli of Italy, Wellsley of Austria and Sjøsted of Finland. This was to be the feature event of the meet, especially the meeting again of Anderson and Peterson. The arrangement was such, however, that there was to be another hurdle race the next day, which was open but of course included the same men. Whatever the

cause, however, Peterson failed to leave his mark and Anderson was the winner in 14.7s., a remarkable performance for such a slow track. The widely-heralded track of Stockholm proved to be a myth. It was soft and spongy and dug up easily. In an invitation 100 meters Bowen placed second to Germany's finest, Kornig, who equaled the world's record of 10.4 seconds in winning. Bullwinkle, running in the 800 meter, again set too fast a pace and without finishing. With less than 100 meters to go Bullwinkle was leading by 15 meters and it is likely that with a normal finish he would have bettered 1:51 for the distance. Kraft, the winner, was clocked in 1:54 and was well behind when Bullwinkle collapsed.

The relay team was broken up when Hamm pulled a muscle in his leg that had previously been strained while warming up. Hamm was advised to rest by a physician and left for America shortly after, his competition over for the summer because he failed to shake off a jinx which seemed to follow him.

On the second day Anderson ran into a snag. With a hard race behind him on the previous day and a heat to eliminate one man from the field, Steve was forced to bow to Peterson, who had rested since the Berlin meet and who, as previously stated, had not competed the previous day. The time was 14.8 seconds. In the 400 meters, the talent of Europe had been gathered. Büchner, Germany's champion; Riners, champion of Austria; Hambergren, the Swedish champion; Astrom, Finland's best, were arrayed against Bowen, who defeated them by seven meters in the time of 48.2s. The third day of the meet was Warne's day. He defeated the Swedish champion at 13ft. 3in. and in his next vault easily cleared 13ft. 9½in. Bullwinkle tried a comeback at the 1000-meter, and despite the pain caused by his fall on the first day, ran a better planned race to finish second to Kraft. Pendleton ran much better than in any previous race and placed second to Gillmeister, the German, in the 200-meter.

To give an idea of the enthusiasm displayed toward track and field sports in Scandinavia, it might be said that the three-day meet attracted 54,000 spectators, and their appreciation of the events was whole-hearted.

The rest of the meets came in quick succession. In an exhibition the following evening the boys all let down and in winning made very mediocre times. Bullwinkle's jinx followed him and in jockeying for a position in the 800 he was badly spiked in the heel and ankle. He placed second in the race, but it was his last effort. Upon examination it was found that he would be unable to compete for some time and his trip was ended.

The remaining four men left immediately for Abo, Finland, and carried on successfully. Bowen won the 100 meter in 11s. and the 400 meter in 48.4. Anderson beat Sjøsted in 15.1; Warne vaulted 13ft. 1in., and Pendleton won the 200 in 22.6. Here they were treated by a spectacle in the javelin when Mutti Jarvinen hurled the spear 230 feet. His brother Aki was second to Bowen in both the 100 and 400 meters.

At Helsingfors, two days later, Bowen had a field day, winning the 100 meters in 10.6, the 200 in 21.6, and the 400 in 48.1. The track at Helsingfors is hard and fast, and fast times could be expected. Anderson again was too good for Sjøsted and his winning time was 14.8. Warne was again in fine form and vaulted 13ft. 9in., with nobody close to him.

A plane trip from Helsingfors to Stockholm and an all night train ride landed the boys in Oslo, Norway, for the finale, which was also a three-day affair. Besides the best Norwegian athletes there was present the student team from Japan, which included a fine vaulter and several other good athletes.

The Japanese vaulter gave Warne a nice battle, but Tommy again cleared 13ft. 9in. against 13ft. 6in. for his Oriental competitor. The feature of the entire trip was Anderson's great hurdle race against the Swede, Peterson, who had been sent up after having had a good rest. Steve was much too good this night and his winning time equaled the world record of 14.4s. It was sweet revenge for Steve. Bowen was an easy winner in three events—the 100 meter in 10.6, the 400 in 48 flat, and an added 100 yards in 9.9.

Pendleton won the 200 in 21.8s., beating one of the Japanese boys handily. It was a fitting close to a tough trip in that each one did as well or better than in any previous start on foreign soil. Immediately following the meet the team sailed for home from Bergen to get set for the national championships in Pittsburgh.

Finland took a firm grip on first place in all-round competition in 1930 with new world records for the Decathlon and Pentathlon. Paavo Yrjola, holder of the existing Decathlon record, made at the Olympic Games in 1928, increased the point total for this event to 8187.30, only to see his new mark shattered a few weeks later by a compatriot, A. Jarvinen, who raised the figure to 8255.475 points. Tolamo, another Finn, established a new world record of 4011.37 points for the Pentathlon. A glance over last season's European meets will show many new national records and worthy achievements. The nations of the world continue their diligent preparations for the Olympic Games at Los Angeles in 1932, and the track and field competition should produce the best results ever recorded for this historic athletic meet.

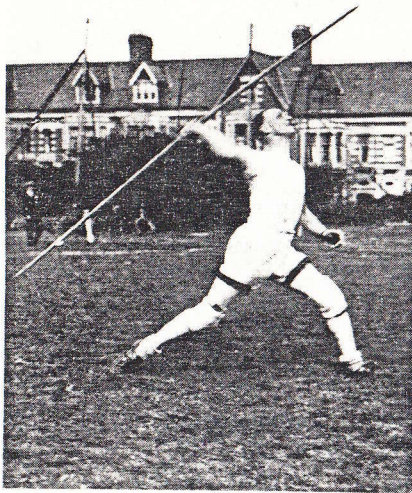

Captain F. A. M. Webster (at left), South Staffordshire Regiment and King's African Rifles, Eastern Command (Army) champion, 1906-07-08 at 100 yards, high hurdles, broad jump (22ft.7 3-4in.), high jump (5ft.10 1-2in.) and 440 yards. English national javelin champion, 1911 and 1923; runner-up in English discus championship, 1923; former Midland District javelin and discus champion and record holder. Captain of Bedfordshire County track and field team, 1925-30; county discus champion and record holder, 1925-28. Author of "Athletics of To-Day for Men" and "Athletics of To-Day for Women." Has coached most of Great Britain's leading athletes in field events. F. R. (Dick) Webster, fifteen-year-old son of Captain Webster, began his competitive career in 1927 by winning the Bedford County hurdles championship in 188, and the pole vault at 7ft. for boys under fourteen (colts). In 1928 he again won the pole vault for colts, this time at 8ft. 6in., and in 1929 he vaulted 9ft. to win both the under-fourteen and under-seventeen junior titles and establish a new record for colts. He was awarded Bedford County senior colors in 1929 and represented Bedfordshire in the English inter-county open championships. In 1930 he again won the County junior championship with a vault of 9ft. 6in., and later cleared 10ft. 3 3-4in. for a new County junior record in a match between British Universities and Bedfordshire. Both father and son are members of the County team, and at forty-four the Captain still retains his ardent enthusiasm for athletics.
