FROM REPORT OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE TO THE ANNUAL MEETING, 1932.

The Executive Committee, after its election, and pursuant to Article XVI of the Constitution, selected Mr. Gustavus T. Kirby, Columbia, as Referee and Mr. J. Horace Churchman, Pennsylvania, as Manager of the Fifty-Fifth Annual Track and Field Championship Meeting, and also appointed the officials for such meeting.

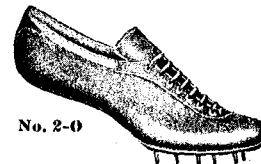

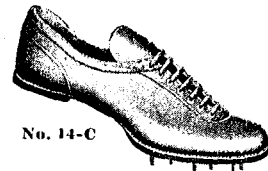

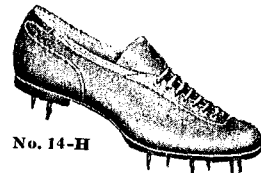
