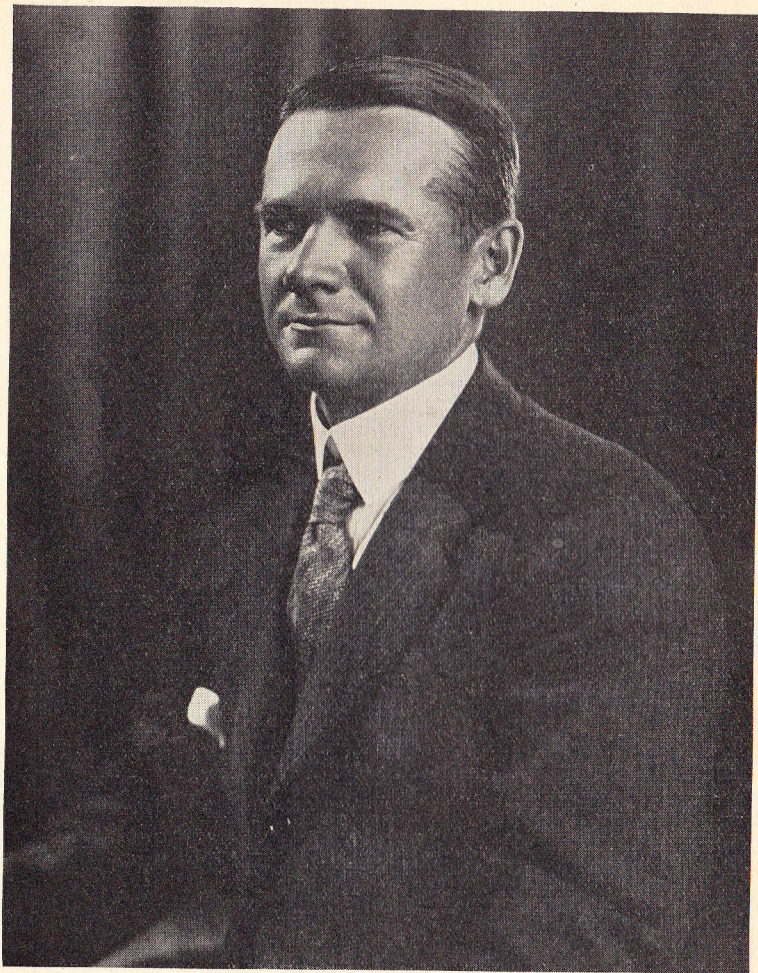

BONTHRON AWARDED SULLIVAN TROPHY

Tops Ben Eastman in Balloting of Sports Leaders to Determine Outstanding Amateur Athlete of the Year.

William R. Bonthron, former Princeton star and now a member of the New York Athletic Club track team, was the 1934 winner of the James E. Sullivan Memorial Trophy, annually presented by the Amateur Athletic Union. Second a year ago to Glenn Cunningham of Kansas by the scant margin of a single point, Bonthron showed the way for 1934 by leading Ben Eastman of the Olympic Club, San Francisco, the world's greatest middle distance runner, 1,072 to 929. The two completely dominated the competition. The final standing follows:

This annual award, begun by the Amateur Athletic Union in 1930, goes to the competing athlete "who by his performance, his example and his influence as an amateur and as a man has done most during the past year to advance the cause of sportsmanship." The winner is determined by a tribunal of 600 sports leaders throughout the United States.

The first move of the A.A.U. in the balloting is to request the members of the tribunal to choose three candidates together with the reasons for their selection. From the names turned in, the committee select the ten considered most worthy, resubmit them to the tribunal, and three names are picked in order of preference by the sports leaders. First place counts five points, second counts three, and third one.

There were only seven finalists in 1934 instead of the usual ten, but in every other respect the competition adhered strictly to the manner in which it was held in former years.

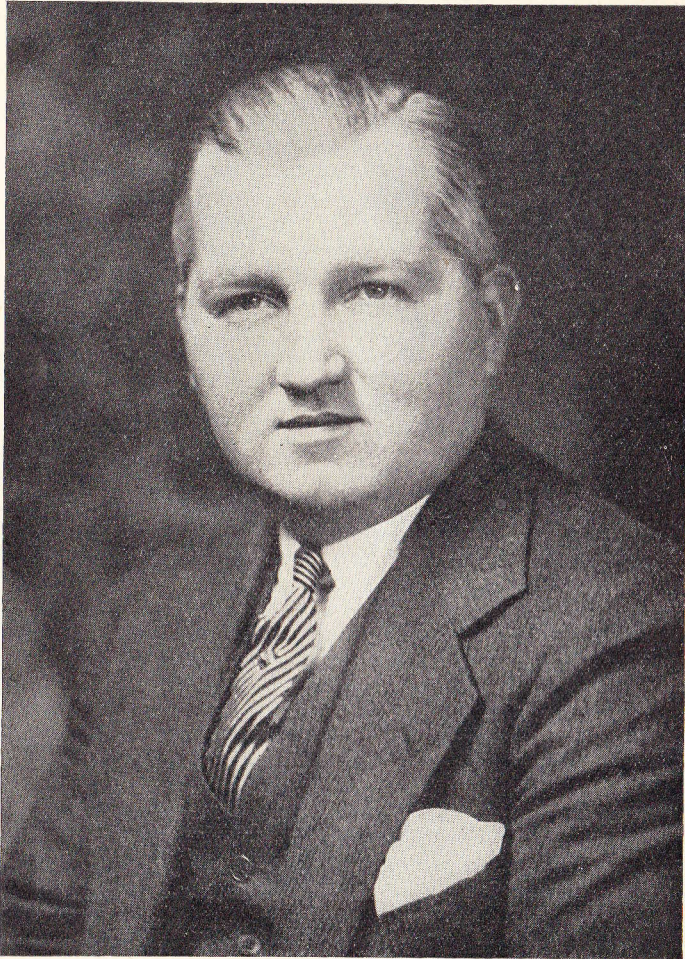
Although Glenn Cunningham was named by the tribunal in the initial list of thirty-five selections, the committee ruled him out of the final in order to establish a precedent that all winners are automatically barred from future consideration. Other outstanding champions were eliminated when the committee was presented with information which disqualified them for the award.

Both Bonthron and Eastman were well matched in achievement over the past year. The ex-Princetonian set a world 1,500-meter record and beat Cunningham in three of their five races. Eastman established world records nearly every time he ran abroad. They were teammates, incidentally, on the European trip and Eastman was captain of the American squad.

Of the two leaders the Sullivan Award Committee had this to say, in part:

"Bonthron—In college competitions he showed his willingness to make sacrifices for the benefit of other members of his team by competing in relay races instead of individual events and also by competing in two and three events in dual meets to enhance the success of his team. A fine example of unselfishness and team spirit. A sportsman of high caliber, courageous and modest to a fault, fine personality and typifies the highest type of amateur athlete."

"Eastman—Holder of more world's records than any other American. A modest, clean-living, quiet, unassuming gentleman. A fine influence for amateur sport. By precept and example has upheld the ideals of amateurism. On and off the field he symbolizes a fine spirit of sportsmanship. His successful comeback in 1934, after his unfortunate injury in 1933, exemplifies great courage and determination. He accepts his honors with splendid grace, modest in

victory, courageous in defeat and always considerate of his opponents. "An inspiration not only to athletes but to all followers of American youth."

Ralph Metcalfe of Marquette University, winner for three consecutive years of the two national sprint championships in both the A.A.U. and National Collegiate Athletic Association meets, finished third in the voting. He was followed by Glenn Hardin, hurdler, Louisiana State University; Miss Lenore Kight, swimmer, Carnegie Library Club, Homestead, Pa.; Jack Medica, swimmer, Washington A.C., Seattle; Miss Katherine Rawls, swimmer, Fort Lauderdale, Fla. With the exception of Miss Rawls all of these athletes are world record holders in their specialties.

AVERY BRUNDAGE PRESENTED WITH SERVICE TROPHY

Avery Brundage, president of the American Olympic Committee, who turned over the reins as president of the Amateur Athletic Union to Judge J. T. Mahoney at the recent convention at Miami, Florida, after serving that organization for the past six years, has been chosen to be the recipient of the James E. Sullivan Service Trophy for 1934.

This award annually goes to the one, irrespective of nationality or residence, who through service, either of leadership, of organization, of administration, or in any other manner, has so furthered amateur games competition, sports participation and the building of character, sound, strong, and sturdy which comes therefrom, as to merit on the part of the Amateur Athletic Union the presentation of this trophy, which bears the name of that great leader, James E. Sullivan, who above all others pointed the way towards the benefits, national and international, to be derived through friendly competition on this especial field of honor.

The James E. Sullivan Memorial Committee has named the ex-president of the A.A.U. to receive this award because, not only during the year 1934 but throughout the past six years, he has proven himself a great leader, a fine executive and administrator, and the one largely responsible for bringing together the several warring factions in amateur sport, which has resulted in the harmonious relations which exist at present between these amateur sport bodies.

His leadership qualities and his courageous stand for amateurism have extended to international athletic councils, where his ability was recognized last summer by his election as an officer of several of the international amateur sport governing bodies or by his appointment on many of the most important committees of these federations.

The award of this trophy is a recognition on the part of the A.A.U. of the United States of an eminent leader in the world of amateur sport, and one who has performed outstanding service in the cause of amateurism and good sportsmanship.

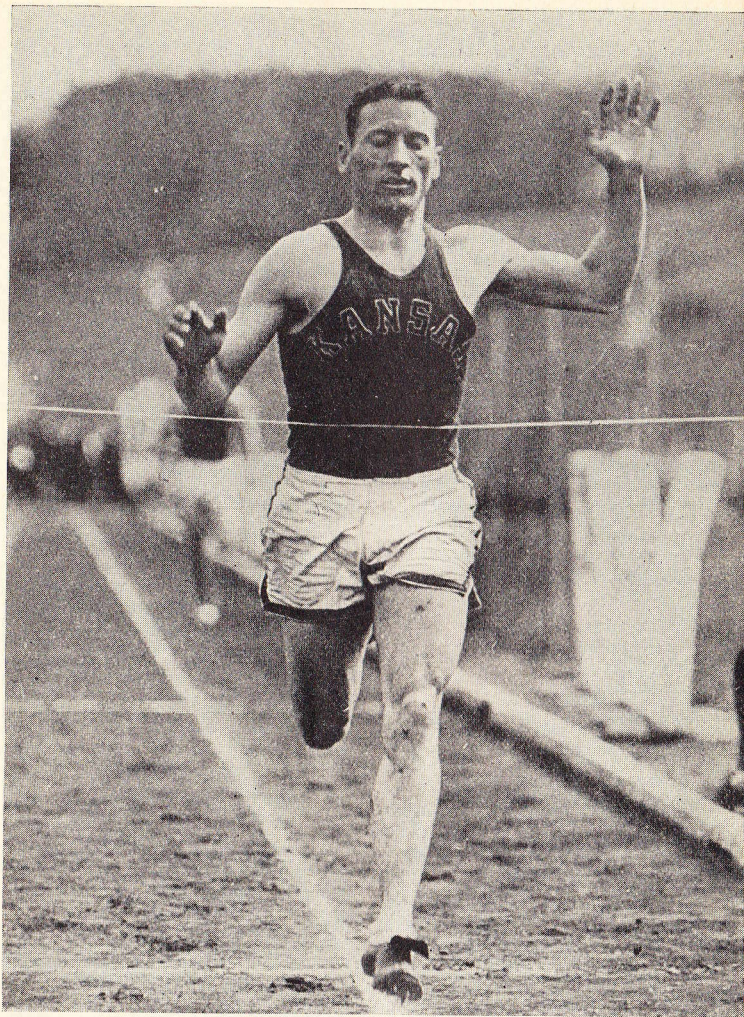

AMERICAN SWIMMING RECORDS

The Amateur Athletic Union shall recognize records over the following distances:

FREE STYLE—100, 150, 200, 220, 300, 400, 440, 500, 880 and 1000 yards, $\frac{1}{4}$ mile and 1 mile; 100, 200, 300, 400, 500, 800, 1000 and 1500 meters.

BACK STROKE—100, 150, 220 and 440 yards; 100, 200 and 400 meters.

FRONT STROKE—100, 200, 220, 440 and 500 yards; 100, 200, 300, 400 and 500 meters.

MEDLEY—300 yards and 300 meters.

RELAY RACING—200, 400, 500, 600 and 880 yards, 1 mile, 400 meters and 800 meters free style; 600 yards back stroke, 880 yards breast stroke and 300 yards medley. In all relays except medley, which is for teams of three, teams shall consist of four, five or six contestants swimming equal distances.

There shall be three records for each distance in yards, recognized as American amateur records. They shall be (1) 20-yard pool records, (2) short-course records (made over courses 25 yards up to 50 meters, approximately 55 yards), and (3) long-course records (made over courses 50 meters and up).

Only long-course records shall be accepted as records for distances exceeding 500 meters. Twenty yard pool records shall include all records made over any course less than 25 yards, but at least 20 yards in length.

The A. A. U. Record Committee is authorized to examine any performance made under other than record conditions, and in its opinion it is worthy of being recorded it will be listed under "Noteworthy Performances."
