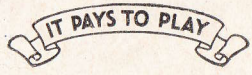

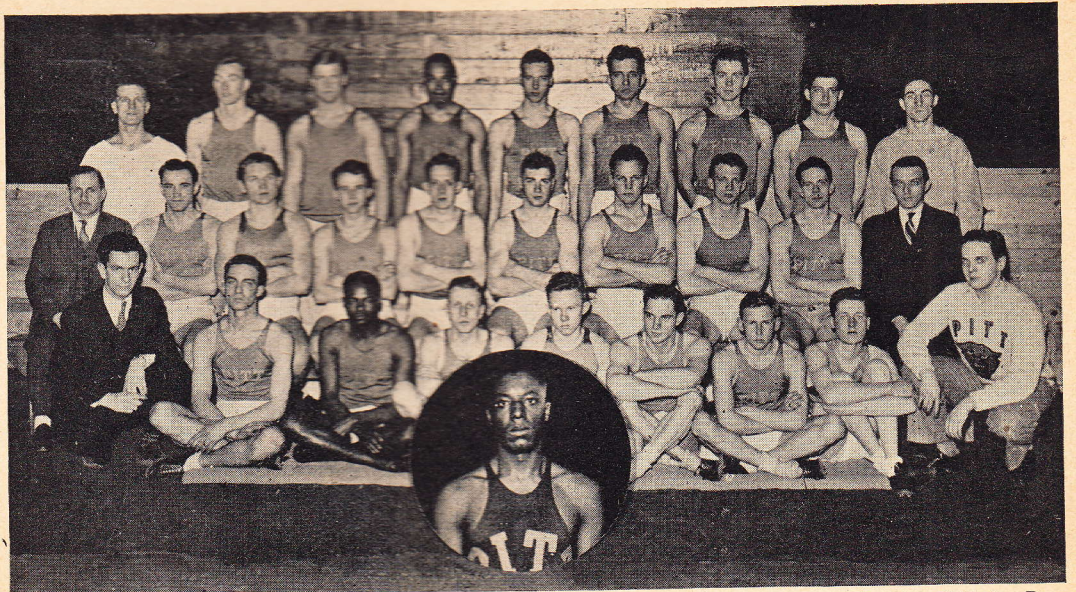

## SIXTY-FIRST ANNUAL TRACK AND FIELD CHAMPIONSHIP MEET, 1937.

The Sixty-first Annual I.C.A.A.A.A. Outdoor Track and Field Championships were held at Randall's Island Stadium, New York City, on May 28 and 29, 1937. Not since the memorable contests at Berkeley Oval, Morris Heights, New York City, in 1903, had the games been held in the metropolis. Most painstaking efforts had been made to publicize the games and to insure the successful conduct of the meet at the new site. However, despite these efforts and the good weather the fact that they were held at a holiday time resulted in an attendance that was below expectations.

The games were well conducted in a stadium especially adapted for track meets and resulted in unusually fine competition. University of Pittsburgh won, with 30½ points, one-half a point over Columbia. This has happened only twice before in the history of the championships. In 1903 Yale won over Harvard with 43½ over 43 and in 1921 California won over Harvard with 27½ over 27. Pittsburgh scored in nine events and Columbia in five. Cornell, with two first places, scored in five events for a total of 23. Michigan State, with two men in the 100, two in the mile and two in the two-mile run, a fifth in the 220 and a tie in the pole vault, was fourth with 20½. Rhode Island State, with two first places, scored 17½ with four men and was in fifth place. Twenty-one teams scored. Marquette, in their first I.C.A.A.A.A. competition, landed two championships, the high jump and the javelin.

The championship was decided in the last event on the program when Edgar D. Mason of Pittsburgh placed second in the 220-yard dash. The meet was filled with unsets, surprises and "ifs." Only three out of the ten defending champions came through in their events. Columbia failed to score the one extra point in three different events—in the broad jump, the shot put and the pole vault. In the latter Standish Medina of Princeton defeated Richard Ganslen of Columbia on his third try, with the bar jumping and vibrating.

To publicize the games two special events were introduced. One of these was an unusual event to compare the performance of spiked shoes and a crouch start with flat soled shoes and a standing start. Both events were won by Eulace Peacock of Temple, with Edward O'Sullivan second, Robert Rodenkrehen third, and James McPoland fourth, and in each case the four performers came in in the same order. The time of the event with spikes was 10.1 and without the spikes 10.4. The other special event was a three-mile bicycle race, followed by a bicycle pageant illustrating bicycles from the earliest date to the present time. The bicycle events were given on both days following the conclusion of the standard events.

There were two outstanding performers, Benjamin W. Johnson of Columbia, who won three events, the 100, the 220 and the broad jump, and John Woodruff of Pittsburgh, who won the 440 and 880. Not since the days of Alvin C. Kraenzlein of Pennsylvania, in 1899 and 1900, has a triple winner appeared. The feat of Woodruff was a superlative one, primarily because of the time. In the quarter he equaled the Intercollegiate record of William Carr of 47 seconds flat and in the half he turned in the splendid time of 1 minute 52.1 seconds. Both of these times were better than the famous performance of Ted Meredith in 1916, who also won both events, but the times were actually not so good as those of Ben Eastman in 1932, when he created the present half-mile record and was second to Bill Carr in the

actual time of 47.19 seconds. One record was broken, by James H. Hucker of Cornell, when he won the 220 hurdles in 23.2 seconds. This performance wiped off the longest standing record on the books, that of Alvin C. Kraenzlein, who ran the hurdles in 23 3/5 seconds in 1898. Hucker also holds the 200-meter hurdle record in the same time which he created in 1935 in a fifth-man heat. The meter distance is approximately 1/4 feet shorter than that in yards.

Under the new constitution the championships were conducted by a committee of the Board of Directors. Mr. Stanley del. Osborne, Harvard, manager of the Fiftieth Anniversary Meet, was the Chairman and was assisted by a committee of sixteen.

29th ANNUAL VARSITY AND 18th ANNUAL FRESHMAN CROSS-COUNTRY RUNS

The twenty-ninth annual Varsity and eighteenth annual Freshman Cross-Country Runs of the Association were held over the Van Cortlandt Park course, New York, on November 15, 1937, under pleasant weather conditions. Not in many years had the championship meant so much nor had the standing and choice of the teams been so close and interesting. Michigan State, Penn State and Syracuse, had each won the cup four times and permanent possession hung on the winner of the day. Not until the complicated checking and scoring was finished was it known that Michigan State was the winner, for the fifth consecutive time, and therefore permanent owner of the cup, with the net score of 59 points. Syracuse had 69 points, with runners in second, third, twelfth, thirteenth and thirty-ninth positions. The position of the fifth man decided the event. The handicap of Syracuse's fifth man in thirty-ninth place was too much to overcome. Manhattan, with 75 points was third. Penn State scored 126 for fourth place. Cornell was fifth, with 136. Nine-teen teams and 128 individuals finished.

Howard Welch of Cornell, outdoor two-mile champion, finished first. Charles S. Southard, Syracuse, for the last half mile of the race, repeatedly challenged Welch; but the latter managed to finish with a lead of 6 yards, or exactly one second ahead of Southard.

The Freshman Run was won by Pittsburgh, with the low score of 40 points, secured through taking second, third, fourth, thirteenth and eighteenth places. Alfred William J. Smith, Penn State, who was second in the Junior National 10,000 meter run, finished first.

SEVENTEENTH ANNUAL INDOOR TRACK AND FIELD CHAMPIONSHIP MEET.

The Seventeenth Annual Indoor Championships were held at Madison Square Garden, New York, March 5, 1938. The meet was the first to be held under the direction of Mr. Asa Bushnell, the Association's new Executive Officer. Columbia retained its team championship with a total of 27 points, all but nine of which were scored in the field events. These nine points resulted from a first and second place sweep in the 60-yard dash. The surprise element of the team competition, however, was furnished by Manhattan, whose amazing surge, including three individual championships (high jump, 600-yard and two-mile runs) brought her three individual points of the leaders. No other college reaped as many titles, though Columbia, Princeton and Yale each scored two. Twenty-nine colleges actually competed in the various championship events, and nineteen of them shared in the scoring. Six new records were established during the day's competition, divided equally between the track events and the field events. John Donovan's year-old record of 7.3 seconds in the 60-yard high hurdles was surpassed by Yale's surprising Ted Day, who defeated Donovan in the final in 7.4 seconds, after having tied the old mark in the semi-finals. Ben Johnson, Columbia captain and the sprint sensation of the year, clipped a tenth of a second from his own 60-yard record in winning his semi-final heat. His time of 6.2 seconds equals the listed world's record for the event. Probably the outstanding performance of the entire meet was the smashing victory of Manhattan's Edgar (Howie) Borek, who shattered Eddie O'Brien's 1937 record of 1 minute 13.1 seconds in winning the 600-yard run from New York University's Jim Herbert in 1 minute 12 seconds.

Francis Ryan, Columbia's national champion, bettered the shot-put standard set jointly by Dimitri Zaiz of Boston College and Danny Taylor of Columbia in 1937. Ryan's performance of 51 feet 10 1/2 inches added more than a foot to the old mark of 50 feet 9 1/2 inches. Ben Johnson lost both his record and his championship in the broad jump to Anson Perrina, Princeton sophomore, who leaped 24 feet 2 inches, to better Johnson's old figures of 24 feet 3/8 inch. One of the older records of the meet was surpassed by Manhattan's Arthur Byrnes, who erased George Spitz's 1934 high jump mark of 6 feet 5 1/2 inches from the books, lifting the record to 6 feet 6 inches.

An innovation was the holding of elimination trials in high jump and pole vault during the afternoon, reducing the fields for the evening's competition to nine and ten men, respectively. This served to speed the evening program, and made it more attractive to the spectators. For the first time in some years the finals in the shot-put were returned to the Garden floor. The complete absence of unnecessary officials and athletes from the floor while the events were in progress elicited considerable favorable comment.
