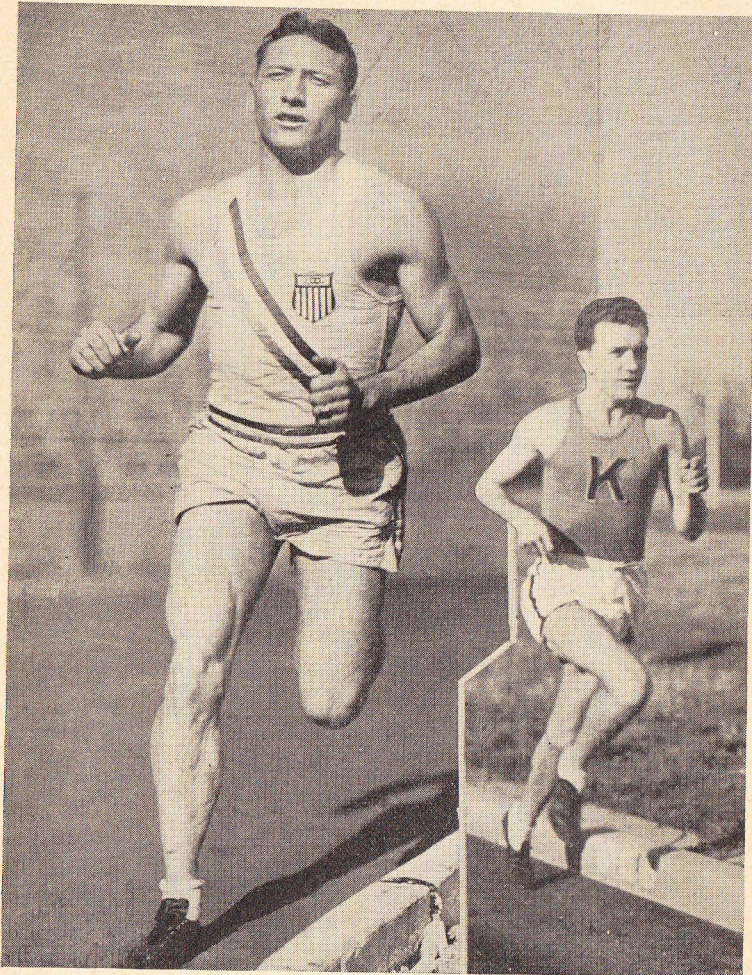

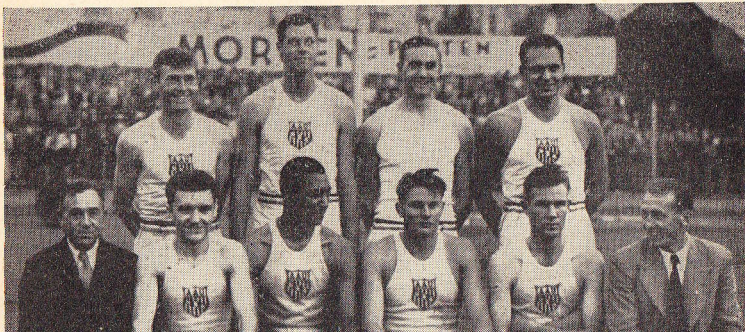

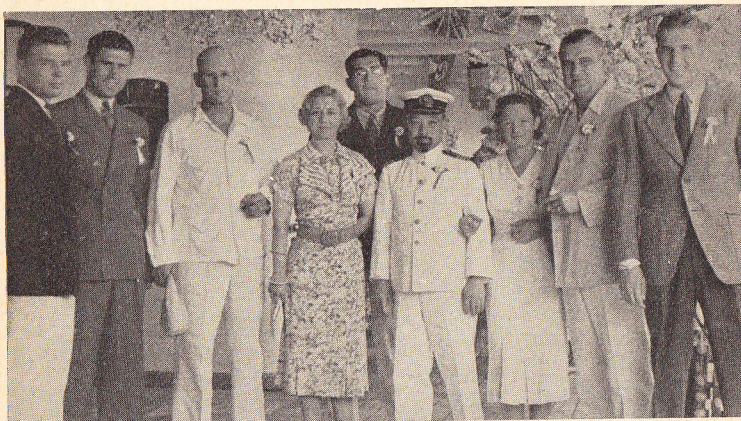

Morris Fleischer of St. Anselm's won the fast time prize with 1:24:15 as against the winner's 1:35:20. Sam Scott of the Pastime A.C. finished first among the veterans. Sid Abramowitz, winner of the walk, was awarded the James E. Sullivan Memorial Trophy. St. Anselm's won the team trophy with low total of 26 to 29 for the 92d St. Y.M.H.A., these two being the only clubs to have five men entered.

ROBERT ANDERSON, WESTERN AUSTRALIA CLUB-SWINGER

Robert Anderson, seventy-one-year-old amateur club-swinger of Albany, West Australia, gave a brilliant exhibition of his skill in the Town Hall of his native city, November 8, 1937. Mr. Anderson, who served with the Western Australia Police for thirty-eight years and retired from the force with the title of Sergeant, has been an ardent club-swinger for the greater part of his life. The records which he made at the exhibition are as follows:

1. Performed 912 distinct and separate combinations or exercises, each combination being executed four times, with two clubs, each club weighing two pounds, in one hour.

2. With six clubs (three held in each hand), weighing six pounds in the aggregate, performed the feat of looping the loop 94 times in two minutes. This exercise is based on the performance of an aeroplane or glider in flight looping the loop.

3. With two clubs, each weighing one pound, performed 1,248 separate combinations, each combination executed four times, in 1 hour 5 minutes 14 seconds. This was 6 seconds less than one-third the time required to execute 1,240 separate combinations, each four times, with three-pound clubs, when he made his record of 3 hours 16 minutes in 1895.

4. With two clubs, each weighing one pound, performed 7,840 separate combinations, each combination being done twice, in 9 hours 39 minutes.
