DONALD LASH WINS SULLIVAN TROPHY



Donald R. Lash, Indiana University alumnus and now a member of the Indiana State Police, was named winner of the 1938 James E. Sullivan Memorial Trophy that annually goes to the athlete who "by his performance, example and influence as an amateur and a man, has done most during the year to advance the cause of sportsmanship."

The decision was made by a tribunal of 600 outstanding sports leaders from all sections of the country who had been polled by the Amateur Athletic Union in its search for the No. 1 sportsman of the year. The balloting was on the same basis as in the past. The tribunal was asked to name candidates, along with the reasons for each choice.

Twenty-seven names were submitted for the honor and the Sullivan Committee pared the list to the ten considered most worthy. These ten were resubmitted to the tribunal, which was asked to rate the best three after studying the summary of reasons that accompanied each choice. The final tabulation was on a 5-3-1 basis.

Runner-up to Don Budge in the 1937 balloting, Lash drew 459 points to take the lead in the 1938 poll. The Hoosier won top honors by a comfortable margin over Mrs. Katherine Rawls Thompson, versatile swimming star from Miami, and Joe Burke, oarsman, who captured the Diamond Sculls. Their respective totals were 371 and 318.

The summary of qualifications of the first three choices sent to the tribunal by Daniel J. Ferris, secretary-treasurer of the national A.A.U., contained the following tribute to Lash:

"Member of the 1936 Olympic team and best distance runner from one to five miles that America has ever known. Holds the American record for two miles and has been a member of three world record relay teams. Won A.A.U. national cross-country championship five times.

"Modest and unassuming, he works in an ideal manner with his coaches and teammates. Possesses great courage, character and sportsmanship and has upheld the amateur code at all times. He is an inspiration to high school boys all over the country, and is an excellent leader and a fine moral influence to his associates.

"Unselfish and self-sacrificing for the good of his teammates. At Randalls Island in the 5,000-meter Olympic tryouts, after leading the race, he dropped back to lend encouragement to a teammate in order to help him to place in the event and make the Olympic team. He was successful but almost lost the race in making this fine gesture to a teammate."

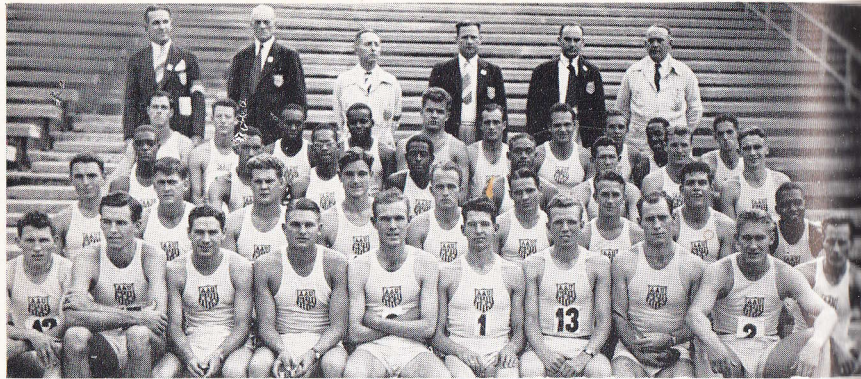

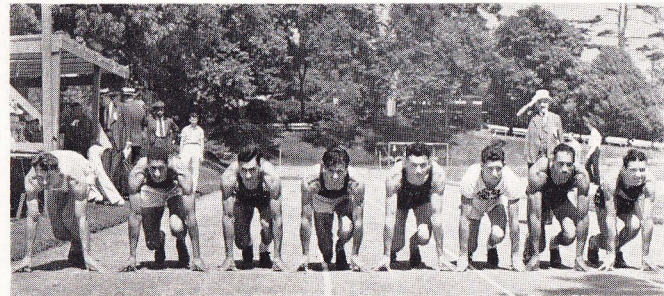
