

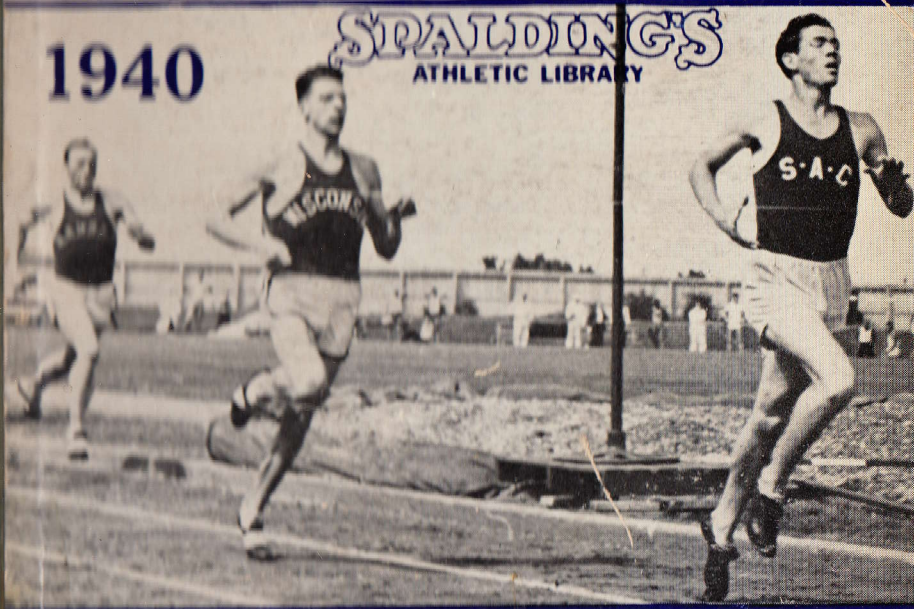

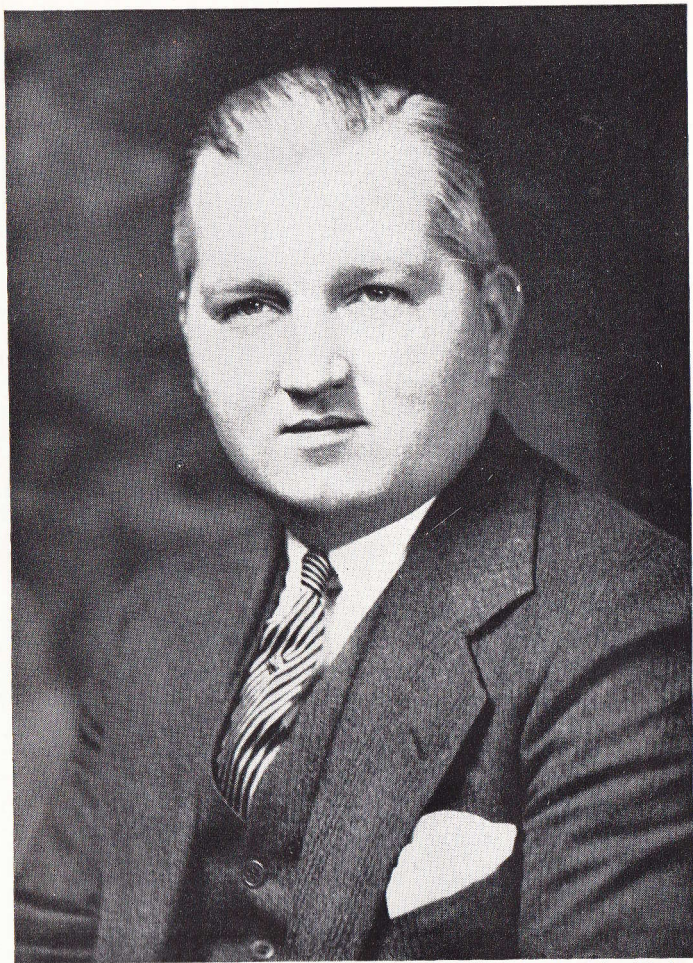

JOSEPH BURK WINS SULLIVAN TROPHY

Joseph W. Burk, oarsman, of the Penn Athletic Club, Philadelphia, was named winner of the 1939 James E. Sullivan Memorial Trophy that annually is awarded to the athlete who "by his performance, example and influence as an amateur and a man has done most during the year to advance the cause of sportsmanship." As usual, the selection was made after the votes of a tribunal of 600 outstanding sports leaders had been polled by the Amateur Athletic Union.

Burk is a graduate of the University of Pennsylvania, where he rowed in the eight-oared crew and was captain of the varsity crew in his senior year. Three times he has been winner of the single sculls championship at both the American national and Canadian national regattas—1937, 1938 and 1939. Twice he has won the famous Diamond Sculls at Henley Royal Regatta, England, 1938 and 1939, and in 1938 he made a new record at Henley of 8 minutes 2 seconds, which is 8 seconds better than the former record that stood for thirty-three years. Burk is the first American to win the Diamond Sculls twice. Since 1937 he has compiled a total of thirty-seven consecutive rowing victories, a record never before equaled by an oarsman.

A leader among oarsmen, Burk's demeanor and the manner in which he has achieved international fame excite the admiration of all who follow his sport. His example to the youth of America, particularly those interested in aquatic sports, has created a deep impression of high sportsmanship. He has indomitable perseverance, self-discipline and an ability to take victory without conceit, and he possesses leadership to a marked degree.

After his Diamond Sculls victory he was tendered a welcome home reception at City Hall in New York and Philadelphia, and was greeted by the mayors of both cities. He has upheld the amateur code in the face of offers to broadcast over the radio, write newspaper and magazine articles, and make public appearances.

Burk has shown a willingness to make any sacrifice in training and practice in order to prepare himself for his contests. He is natural, unaffected and unspoiled—a fine example of young American manhood.

Charles (Chuck) Fenske, the University of Wisconsin miler, was runner-up for the award and third place went to Miss Alice Marble, United States and Wimbledon tennis champion. Marvin (Bud) Ward, golfer, was fourth and Al Patnik of Ohio State University, national diving champion, fifth. The final tabulation of the vote on a basis of 5—3—1 gave Burk 1,063 points; Fenske, 851; Miss Marble, 826; Ward, 255; Patnik, 243. In all, the names of seventeen athletes were submitted by members of the tribunal, but after considerable study the committee pared down the list to five.

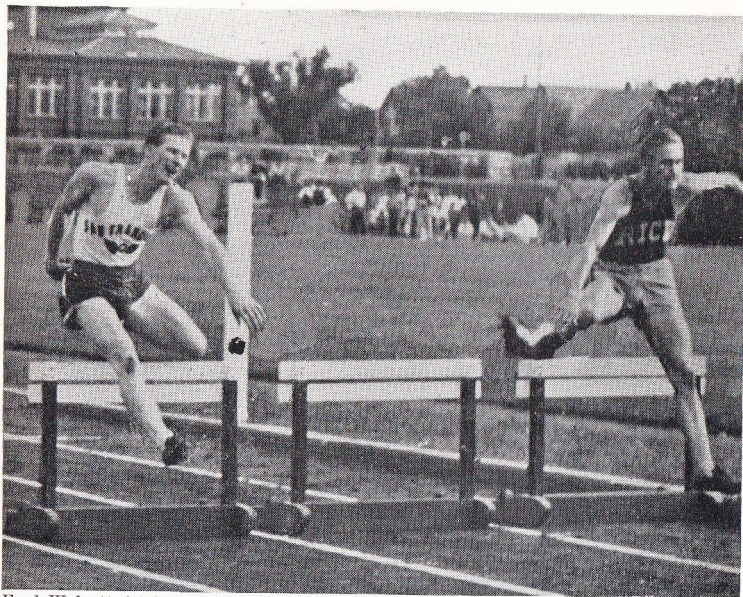

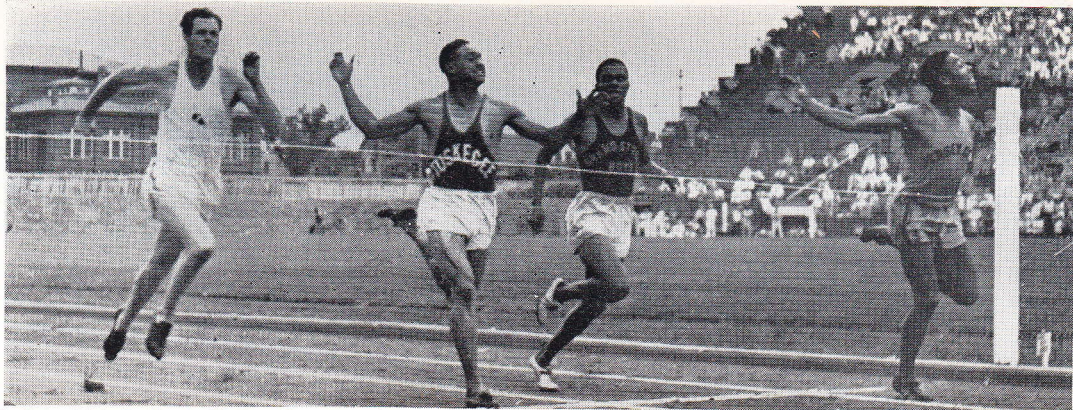

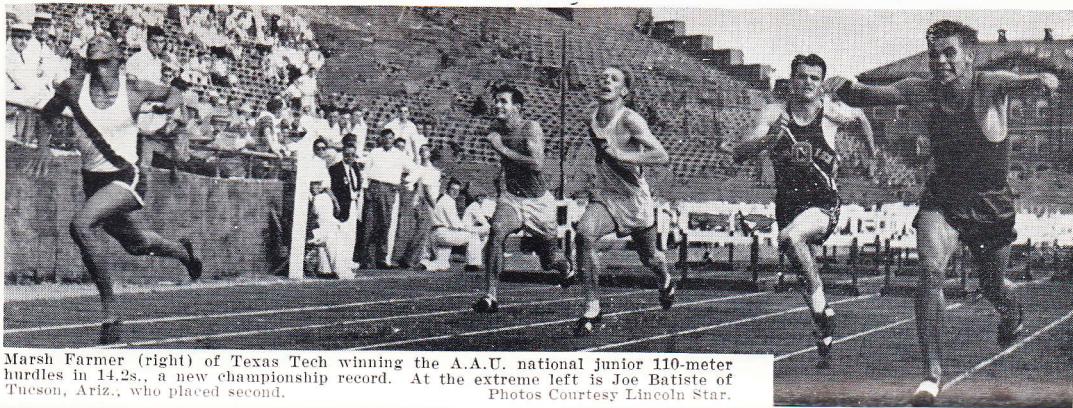

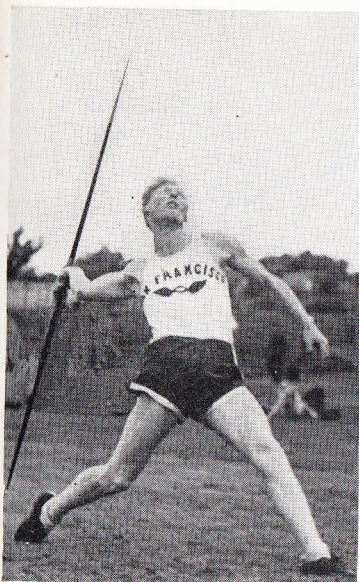

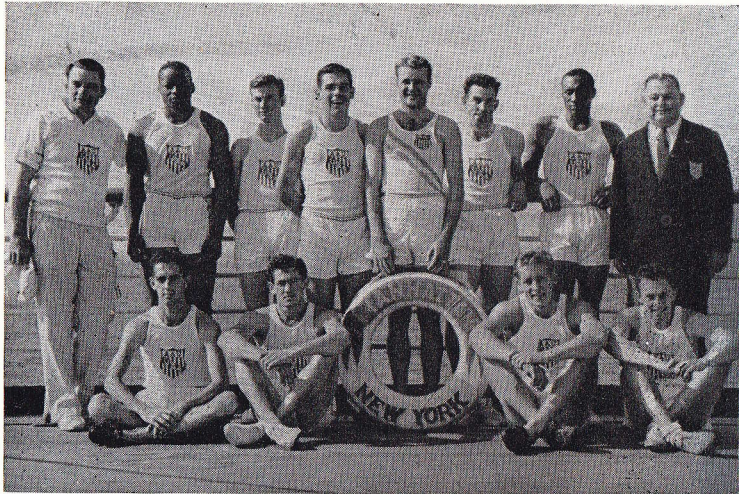
