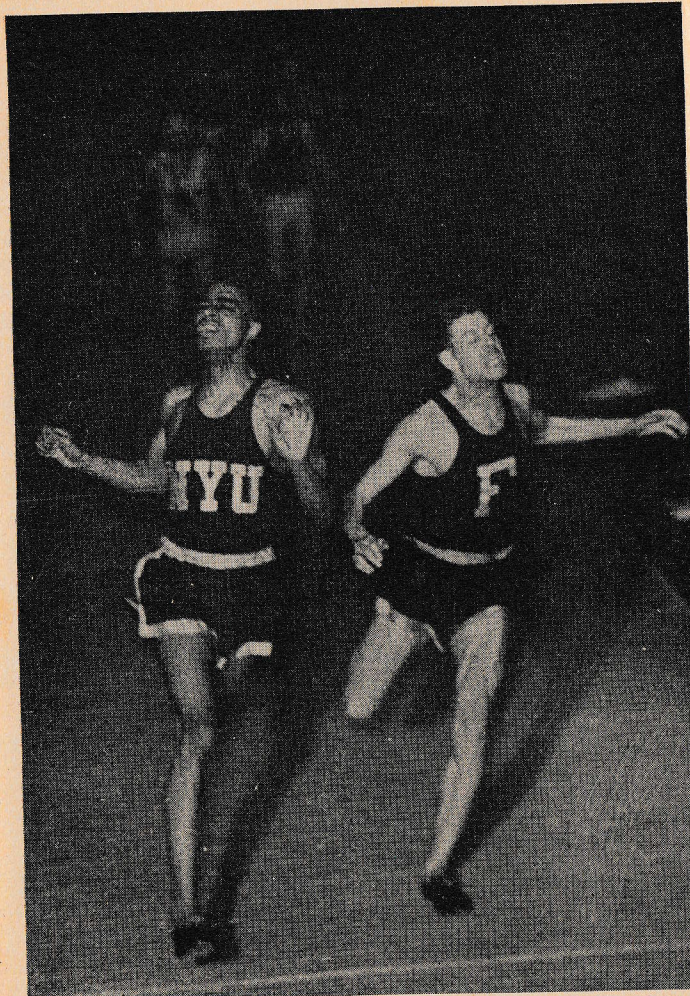

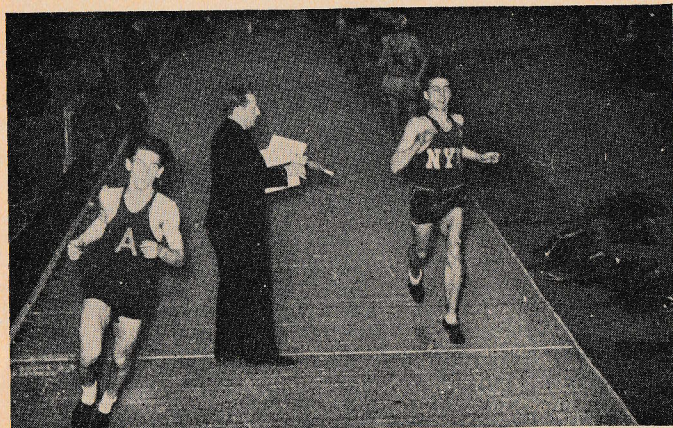

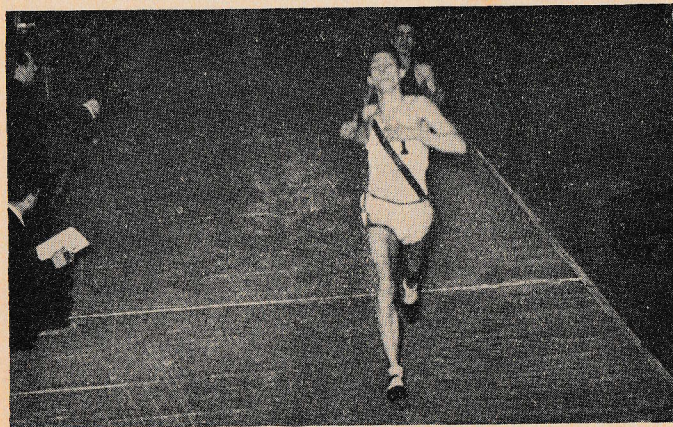

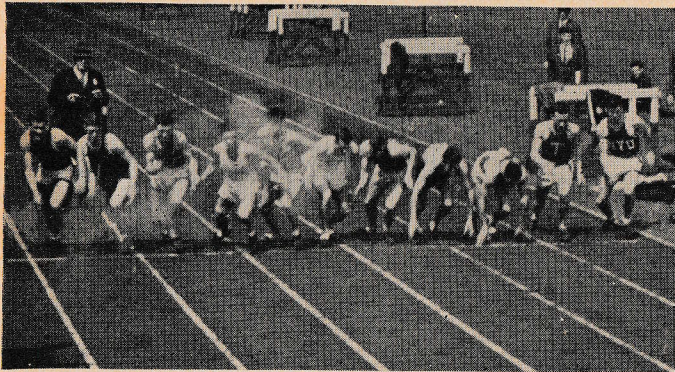

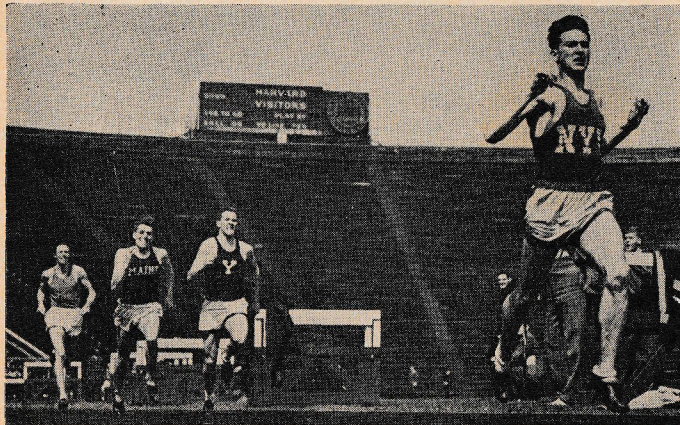

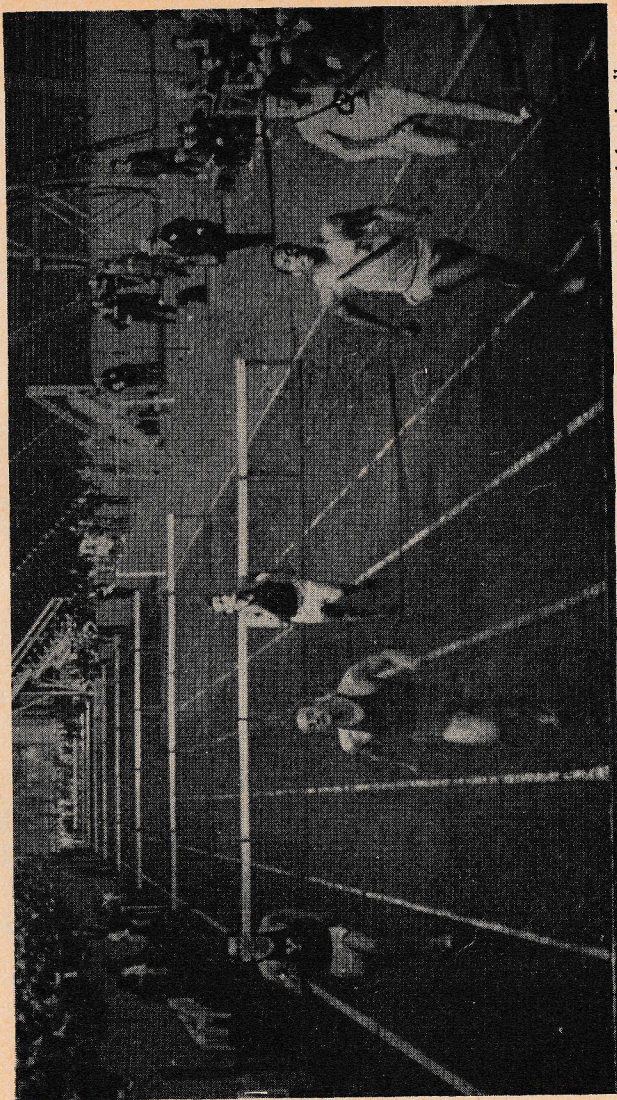

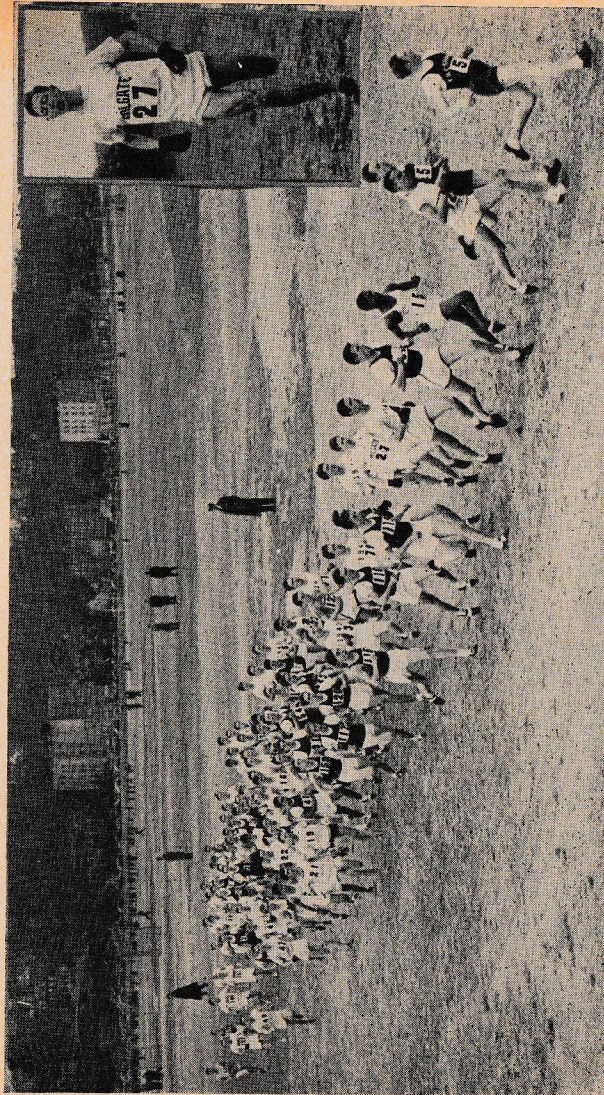

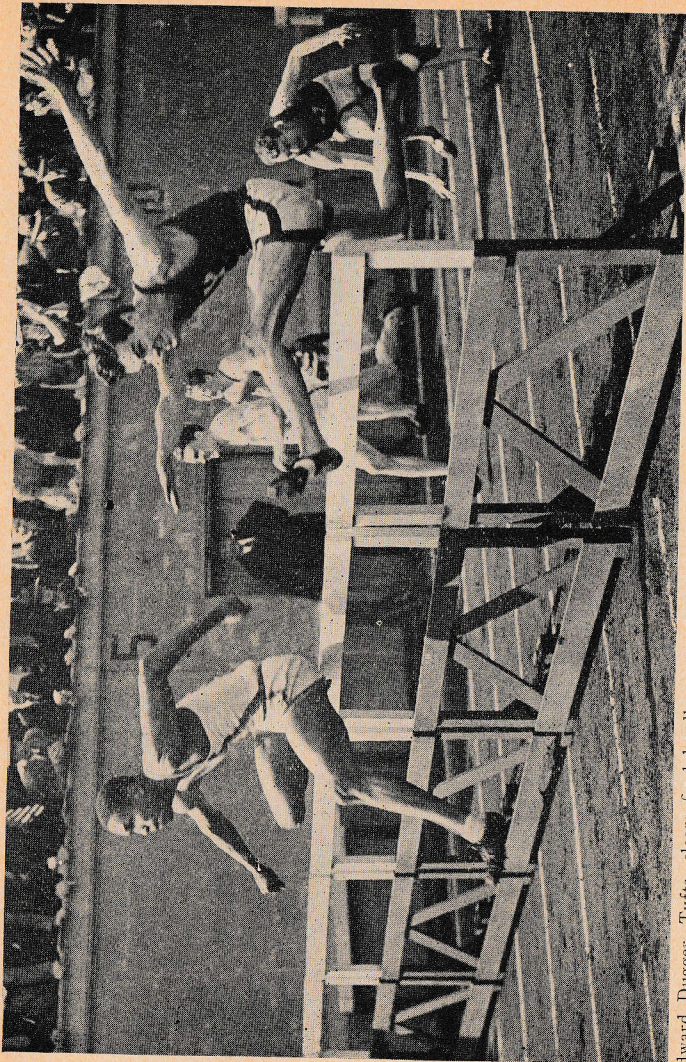

TWENTY-YEAR-OLD RECORD FALLS IN HIGH HURDLES



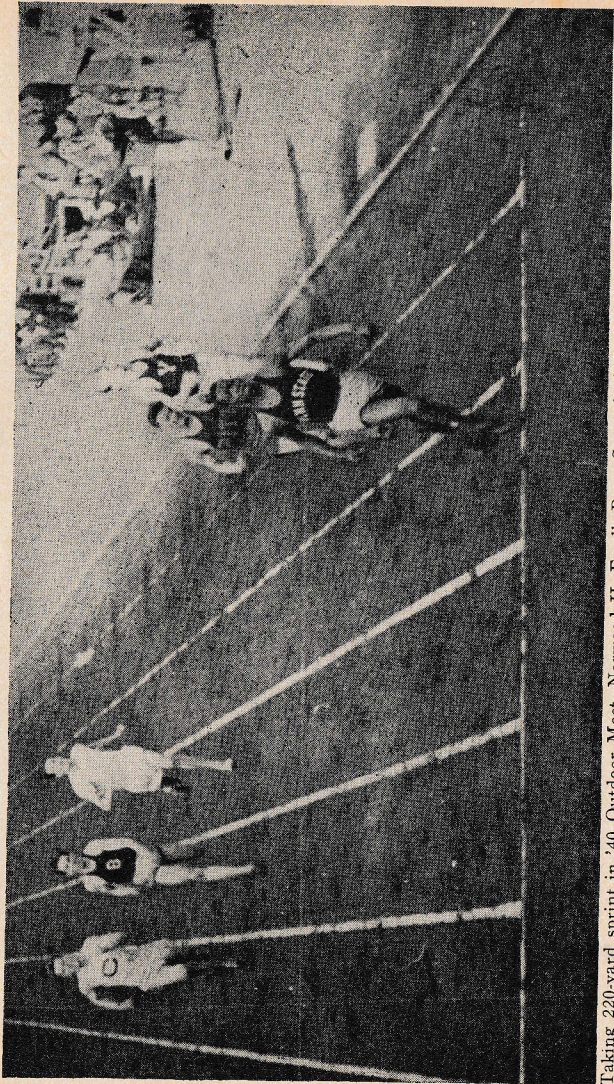

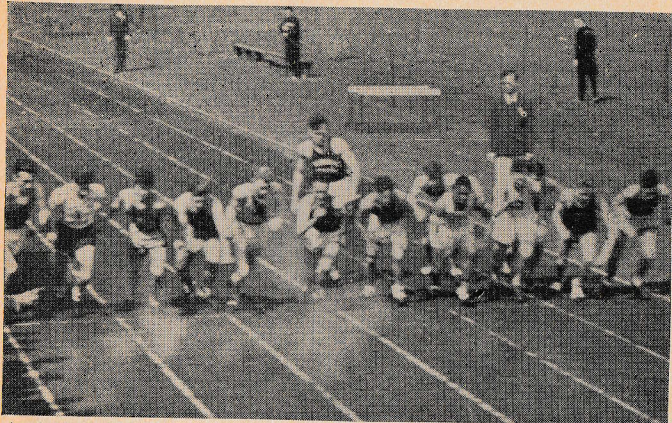

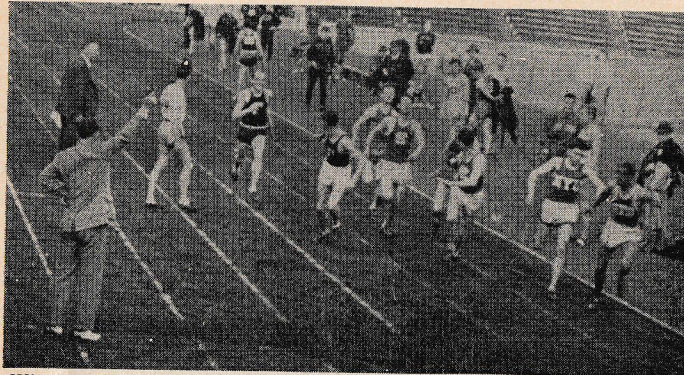

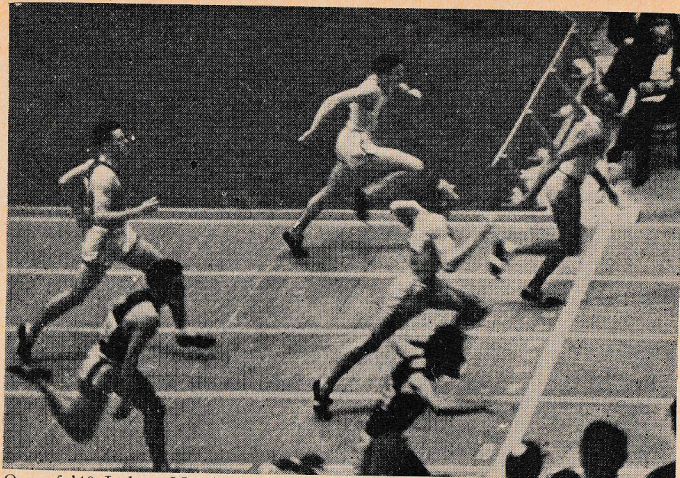

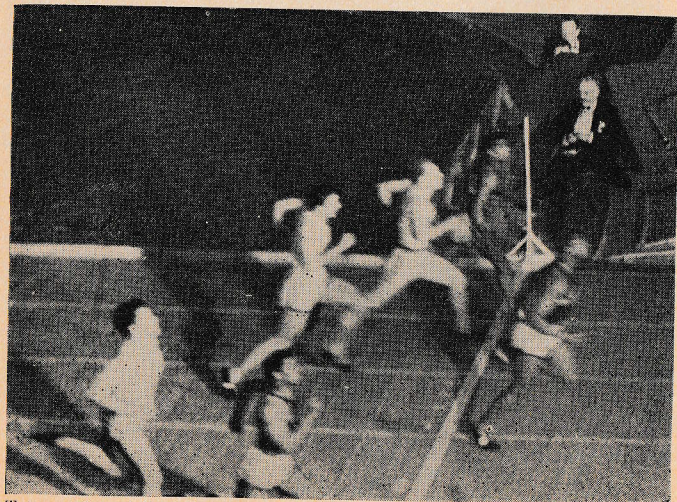
