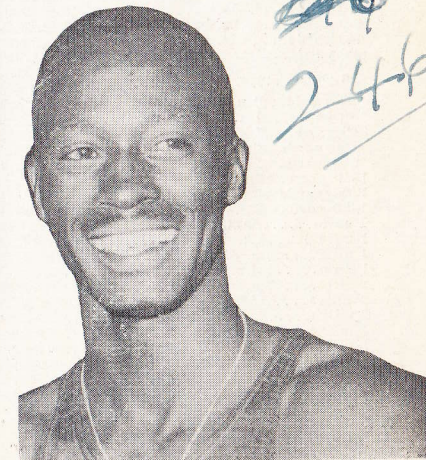

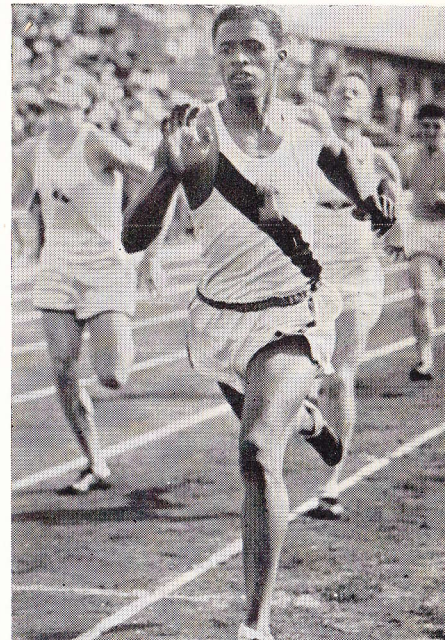

PREPARATIONS FOR A TRACK AND FIELD MEET

All athletic meets or games, large or small, require the general supervision of some one individual, usually referred to as the manager, director, chairman of games committee or supervisor.

If the program is to run smoothly and successfully, it is necessary that this individual, to be hereinafter referred to as the manager, be in direct contact with all arrangements for the meet. It is, therefore, imperative that he have a thorough understanding of the problems involved and the details which will require attention. It is also important that he be generally conversant with the rules governing the competitions so that he can make certain that proper arrangements for the various events are made.

Making proper arrangements for good officiating and for suitable conditions for the athletes in competition are far from being the manager's only responsibilities. He must also have the program so arranged and conducted that events will run off promptly and smoothly. A track meet which progresses slowly because of unnecessary delays in starting events and (particularly in the case of field events) in conducting them is uninteresting to the spectators and unsatisfactory to the athletes. In other words, such a meet is not a success.

The purpose of this article is to offer suggestions for managers concerning advance arrangements for the meet as well as preparations for conducting the events.

Selection and Announcement of Date

The date of the meet must be chosen long enough in advance to give the organizations and athletes interested a chance to include it in the club's calendar for the season and in the athletes' training schedule and plans. The date must be so chosen as to avoid conflict with any other meet or meets which would normally draw its entries from the same section or group of athletes. Information concerning the schedule of national meets (whether or not they are conducted by the A.A.U.) may be obtained from the national A.A.U. office. Information concerning the schedule of local meets may be obtained from the secretary of the district association of the A.A.U. As soon as the date has been definitely settled, notice of it should be sent to athletic clubs, colleges, universities, schools and athletes in the area from which it is expected the entries will come. It will be well to send a preliminary notice to all athletic clubs in the section, followed a little later by entry blanks. It is also advantageous to send entry blanks, if not notices, to individual athletes. The large meets usually are given notice through newspapers, radio, and posters.
