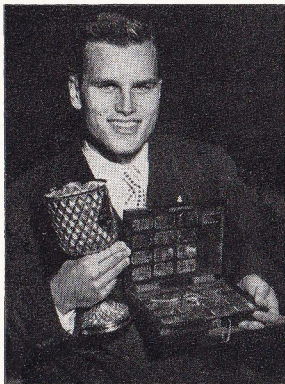

Kelly Awarded Sullivan Trophy

John B. (Jack) Kelly, Jr. of Philadelphia, the world's premier oarsman, was the 1947 winner of the James E. Sullivan Memorial Trophy, the award presented annually by the Amateur Athletic Union of the United States to the amateur athlete who, by performance, example and good influence did most during the year to advance the cause of good sportsmanship.

The selection of Kelly, who captured the Candian single sculls title and England's famed Henley Regatta, marked the second time in eight years that a rower has won this award, considered the highest honor that can be attained by an amateur athlete. Joe Burke, another single sculls champion, was named in 1939.

In a nation-wide poll of sports leaders, Kelly received 663 points. This total gave him a narrow edge over Harrison Dillard, the record-smashing hurdler from Baldwin Wallace College and Irving (Moon) Mondschein, New York University's three-time national decathlon champion.

The electoral contest was one of the closest in history. Dillard collected 608 points and Mondschein 572 on the 5-3-1 tally of first, second and third place votes.

Kelly was first choice on seventy-seven ballots, Dillard being favored by seventy-one selectors and Mondschein by sixty-two. All eight final contestants were honored by first-place mention.

Four swimmers and a skier followed the three leaders. In order they were Joseph Verdeur, breast-stroke marvel from Philadelphia with 418 points; William Smith, Ohio State's great free-styler (who was runner-up last year to Arnold Tucker, Army quarterback); 407 points; Miss Zoe Ann Olsen, 16 year old diving prodigy from Oakland, California; 358 points; James McLane, multiple long-distance champion from Akron, Ohio 262 points and R. L. (Barrey) McLean of Denver, an outstanding member of the Olympic skiing team, 13 points.

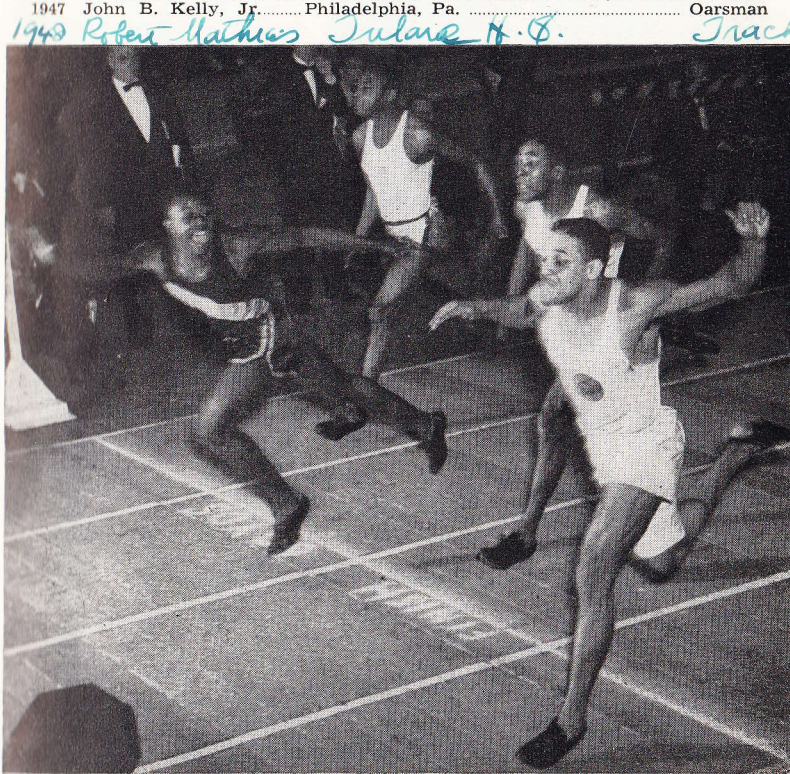
Young Kelly is following the course of his father, a prominent civic and political figure in Philadelphia, as a champion oarsman. Kelly Sr. won the Olympic single sculls title in 1920 and shared the Olympic double-sculls crown with Paul V. Costello in 1920 and 1924. In four years of competition, interrupted by wartime service in the Navy, Kelly has been beaten only twice in thirty-three races. He is the leading hope of the United States in the rowing at the 1948 Olympics. A student at the University of Pennsylvania and captain of the Vesper Boat Club, he has won numerous awards for sportsmanship and leadership.

Candidates for the award were originally submitted by the forty-three district associations in the A.A.U., who considered in making their choice acts of sportsmanship, qualities of leadership, excellence of performance, strength of character, force of personality and high ideals of amateurism.

The Sullivan Committee studied the original list carefully then pared it down to the eight athletes they considered most worthy. The names of these eight, together with a summary of reasons for each selection, then were submitted to the tribunal, whose membership of 500 includes the nation's leading sports authorities, for a final vote.

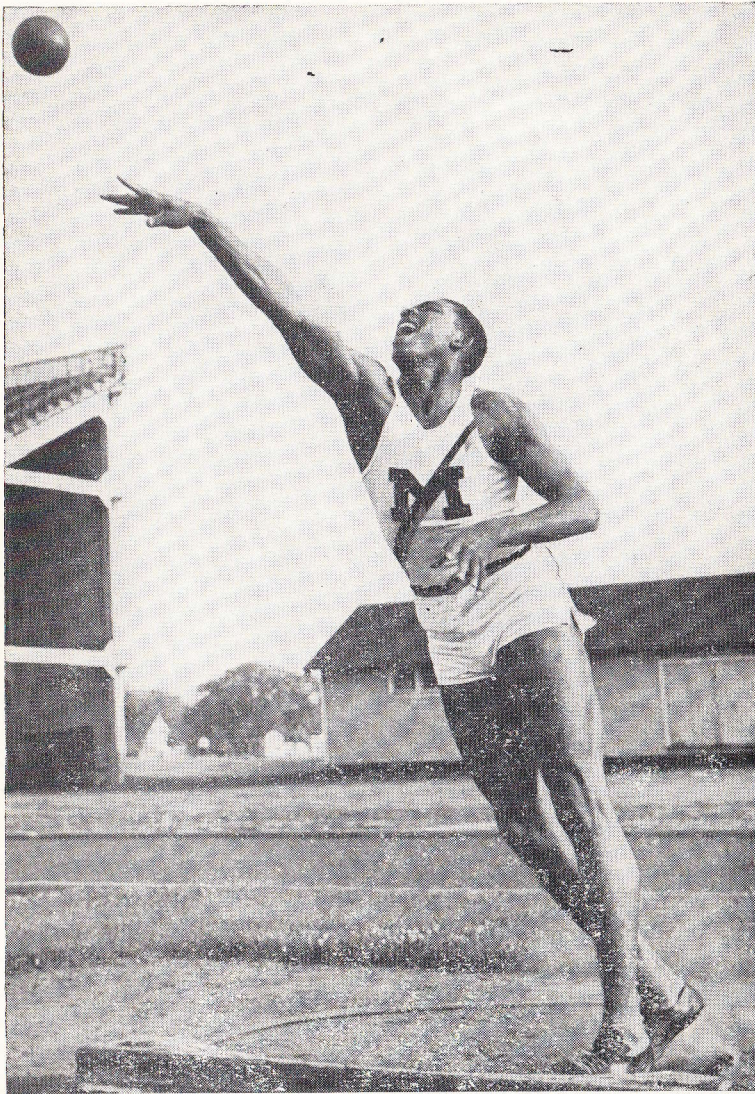

In the 400 meters and 440 yards races the hurdles must be 3ft. high, placed 35 meters apart, with the first hurdle 45 meters from the scratch mark. In all these races the distance from last hurdle to finish shall be the distance remaining to be run to complete the race which in races under 120 yards shall not exceed 10 yards.

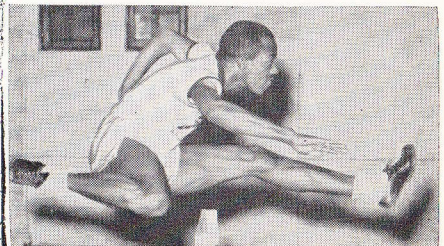

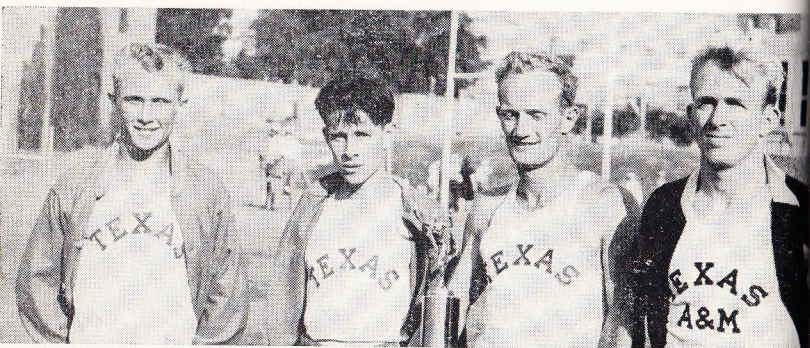

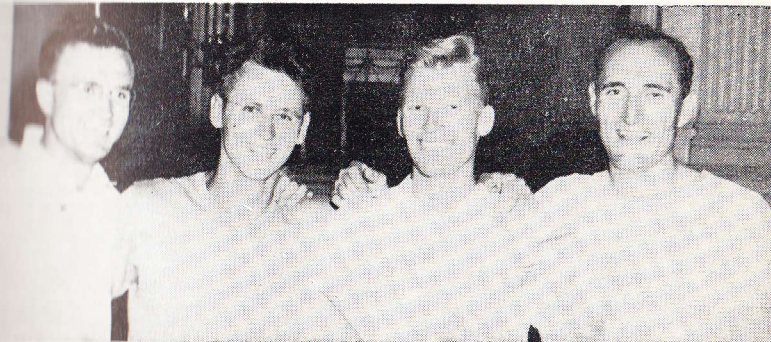

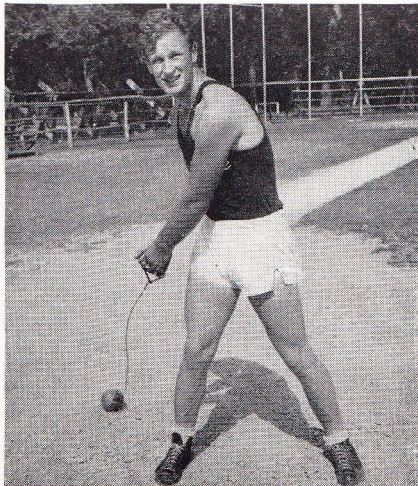
