## WILT 1950 SULLIVAN TROPHY WINNER



Fred Wilt of the New York Athletic Club, whose consistently fine performances over the last three years did so much to stimulate distance running in this country, was elected to receive the James E. Sullivan Memorial Trophy for 1950. This award is presented each year by the A.A.U. to the "amateur athlete who, by performance, example and good influence, did most to advance the cause of good sportsmanship during the year."

Winner of five national titles at distances ranging from one mile to 10,000 meters flat and cross-country and an internationally respected competitor in the distance-running field, Wilt was first choice of 166 of the 479 ballots cast in a nation-wide poll of sports authorities.

On a 5-3-1 tally of first, second and third-place votes, the 30-year old graduate of the University of Indiana amassed a total of 1197 points. This gave him a substantial

edge over the six other candidates considered for the Sullivan Trophy, highest honor available to an amateur athlete in this country. Holding a responsible position with the FBI, it involved great personal sacrifice for him to keep active in athletics. Obligated to train on a catch-as-can basis, early in the morning and late at night, he nevertheless raced gallantly against the strongest available opposition on every possible occasion.

His sportsmanship was conspicuous in victory and defeat. He made an exhaustive study of training methods and running form employed by the leading European distance specialists and unselfishly made available to the coaches and other competitors the results of his research and experience, thus helping to improve the general standard of distance running here.

On the competitive side, Wilt was consistent at 4:12 or better for the mile, nine minutes or better for two miles and ran 3000 and 5000 meters faster than any other American. He is the twelfth track athlete to win the Sullivan Trophy.

## U. S. A. ATHLETES STAR IN PAN - AMERICAN GAMES

Other outstanding U.S.A. performers were Dick Attlesley, who took the 110 meter high hurdles in 14 seconds flat, and Bob Richards, who set a South American record of 14 feet 9 1/4 inches in the pole vault.

Titles also were won by Browning Ross, 1,500; Henry Laskau, 10,000 meter walk; Virgil Severns, high jump; Gay Bryan, broad jump and the 400 meter relay of Don Campbell, Attlesley, John Voight and Arthur Bragg.

Argentina won five events, Cuba two and Colombia, Chile and Brazil one apiece.

The most striking performers from other countries included Rafael Fortun, who scored a sprint double for Cuba, twice beating Bragg, U.S. 100 meter champion; Ricardo Heber, Argentina javelin thrower whose 223 foot toss bettered the best effort of U.S. champion Steve Seymour; Ademar Ferreira da Silva, Brazil hop, step and jumper, who achieved 50 feet, and Delfo Cabrera, Argentina's 1948 Olympic champion, who ran off with the marathon in 2 hours and 35 minutes.

In the women's division, Jean Patton of Tennessee State accounted for the U.S.A.'s only individual triumph, in the 200 meter run. The U.S.A.'s 400 meter relay team of Dolores Dwyer, Janet Moreau, Nell Jackson and Miss Patton also came through. Argentina and Chile were the only other double winners.

Considering that the games were held during the North American winter and that many of the athletes selected did not have much opportunity to sharpen their form in pre-meet competition, the U.S.A. team did exceptionally well.

It was a representative squad, selected on the basis of performances in the National A.A.U. championships, with the highest available place-scorer in each event making the trip. In only eight events was it necessary for the Olympic committee to go below the title-winner (or first U.S.A. native) in making its selections and in most cases the alternate choice was of approximately equal ability.

Against opposition that proved stronger than had been generally anticipated, the United States track and field squad came through with flying colors in the first Pan-American Games, successfully staged at Buenos Aires, Argentina, February 25 to March 8.

Led by Mal Whitfield, Curtis Stone and Jim Fuchs, double winners, the twenty-two man U.S.A. team won fourteen of the twenty-four men's track events. The U.S.A. women's squad added two more titles for a total bag of sixteen.

Besides leading home a 1-2-3- U.S.A. sweep in the 800 meters and capturing the 400 meter crown, Whitfield anchored a U.S.A. 1600 meter relay quartet which won in the dazzling time of 3:09.9.

Also competing in three events, Stone won the 10,000 meter run and the 3,000 meter steeplechase and then came back to place fourth in the 1,500 meter run.

In addition to dominating his shot-putting specialty with a good toss of 56 feet 7 1/4 inches, Fuchs annexed the discus title.

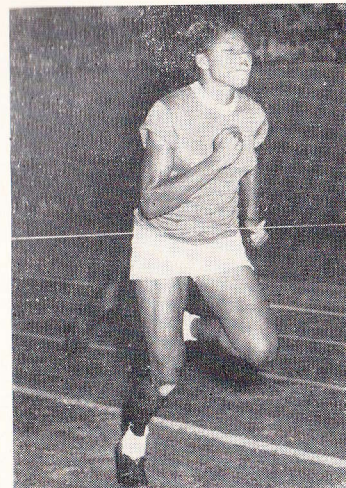
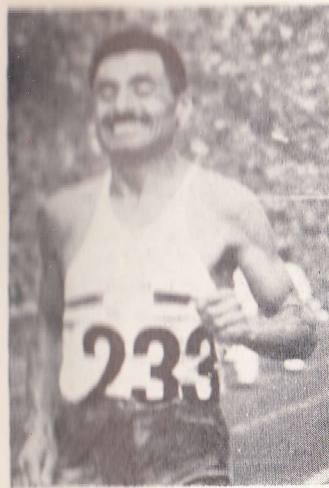

# 1952 Olympic Preparations

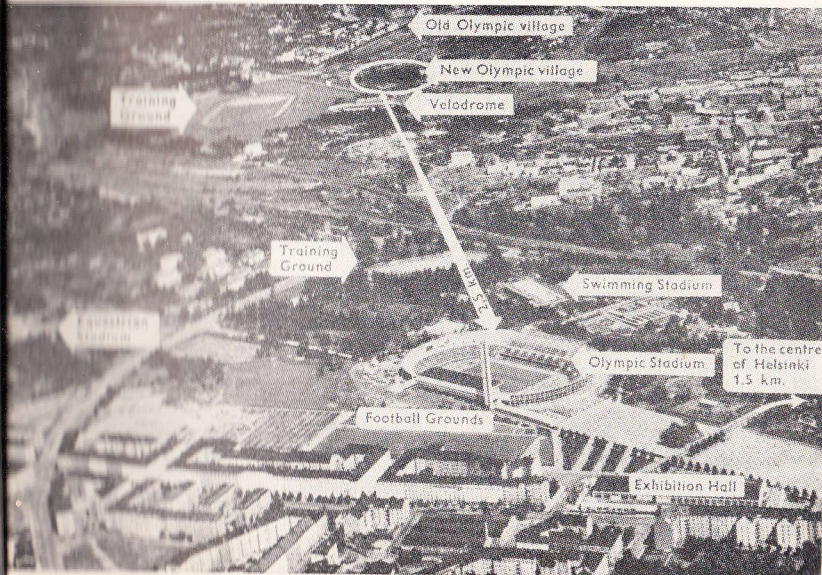
Finland has taken another forward stride in its well-advanced preparations for staging the 1952 Olympic Games by naming as sports director of the Helsinki meet Major General Yrjo Valkama, director of the Finnish Cadet School, a man who has long distinguished himself in the service of Finnish sport.

As a youth, General Valkama was Finland's best diver, winning the Finnish high diving title eight times. He competed twice in diving at the Olympics in 1920, when he placed fifth, and 1924 and served as a diving judge at the 1928 Olympics. He also was an outstanding football player, twice being a member of teams that won the Finnish championship.

General Valkama's career as a sports leader is long and glorious. He was a member of the Finnish Olympic Committee for the first time as early as 1927 and since 1941 has held a position on it annually. During preparations for the 1940 games he acted as director of the Olympic Village Department. Since 1949, he has been a member of the organizing committee for the 1952 games.

Having represented Finland at numerous international sports congresses, General Valkama knows and is known by the sports leaders of other countries. Expert at overcoming difficulties and an energetic leader, he was an ideal choice as sports director for the XVth games.

For the 1940 games, advance sale of tickets commenced in the summer of 1939. By the end of August, 416,171 tickets had been sold, 86,646 to purchasers from abroad. According to usual practice, half the tickets were reserved for sale to other countries. Demand in Finland was so great that to meet it, the stadium should have been five times larger than it was.

The 1952 ticket bureau is preparing at present for the sale of tickets along the same lines.

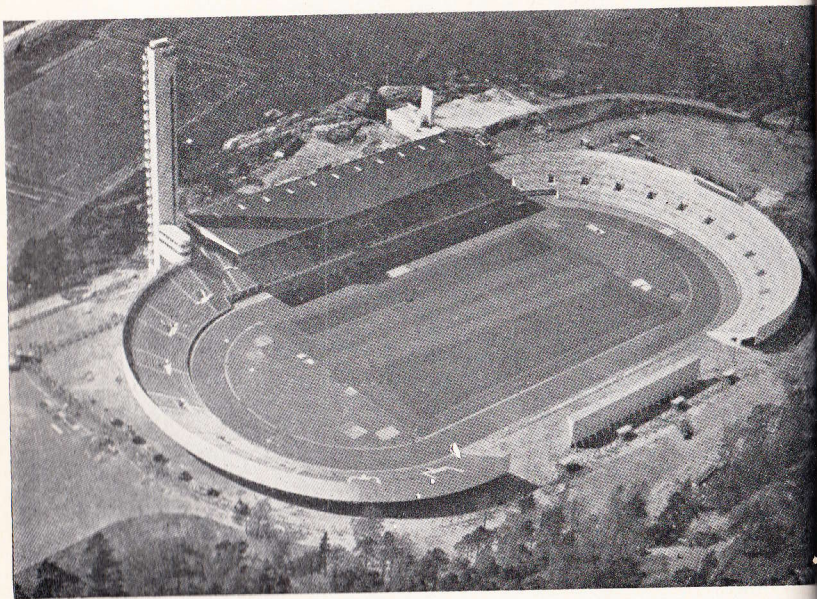
The ticket sale for the 1952 games is scheduled to begin in the autumn of 1951, both in Finland and abroad. Nearly 70,000 spectators can be seated daily at the stadium. Accommodations also will be made available for an estimated daily total of 5,000 active athletes, press representatives and guests of honor.

When Helsinki prepared for the 1940 Olympic Games, an Olympic Village comprising twenty-three stone buildings was constructed to accommodate about 3,200 athletes and officials. When the 1940 games were cancelled the village was handed over for private use.

For the 1952 games entirely new accommodations will be provided. The new Olympic Village will be built beside the old one, south of Koskelantie Road. This site has been selected because of its close proximity to the Kapyle training grounds (five fields for footballers and one for track and field athletes with a 400 meter track) and the cycling velodrome. The village is only 2.5 kilometers away from the Olympic Stadium, Swimming Stadium and Exhibition Hall (site of wrestling, gymnastics, boxing and weightlifting) and 3.5 kilometers away from the Canoeing Stadium.

In all probability, the Technical High School Students' Home, in the beautifully situated Otaniemi, will be chosen for an additional Olympic Village. Six buildings will be completed here by 1952, providing accommodation for about 500 participants. Otaniemi lies on the seashore about 8 kilometers to the west of the center of Helsinki.

It is planned to erect fifteen three or four-storied buildings with about 2,000 rooms. Approximately 5,000 athletes and officials will be accommodated within the village. The buildings will be furnished with baths in the basements and also with shops providing barbering and shoemaking service, etc. A restaurant will be erected with special eating rooms for the different nations. It is expected that this work will be completed by the spring of 1952.

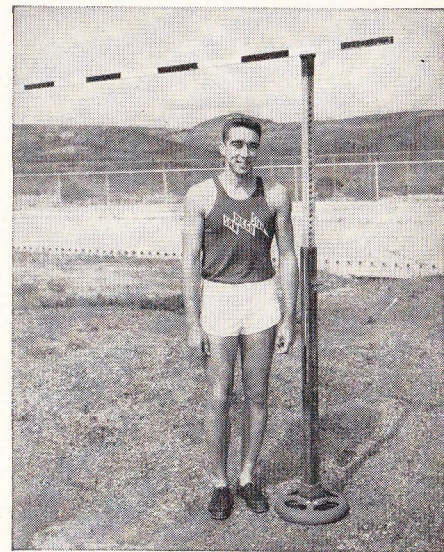

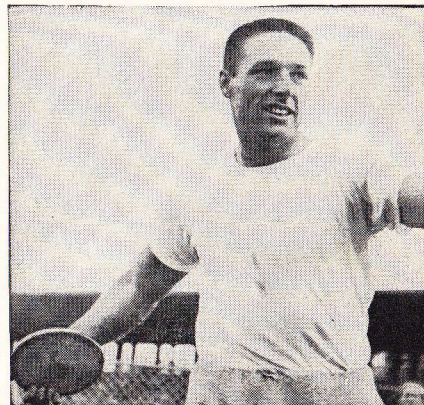
