## HARRISON DILLARD WINS 1955 SULLIVAN AWARD

Harrison Dillard of Cleveland, 1948 Olympic sprint champion and 1952 Olympic hurdles titlist, is the 1955 winner of the James E. Sullivan Memorial Trophy.

This award is presented annually by the Amateur Athletic Union of the United States to "the amateur athlete who, by performance, example and good influence, did most to advance the cause of good sportsmanship during the year."

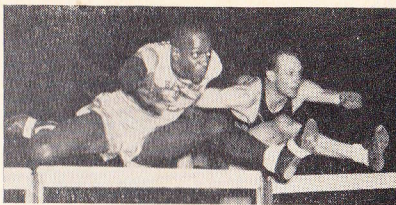
A final tally showed Dillard to have been first choice on 173 of the 658 ballots cast by the nation-wide tribunal of sports authorities participating in the twenty-sixth annual Sullivan Award poll.

On a 5-3-1 count of first, second and third place votes, the one-time Baldwin-Wallace College star amassed a total of 1,375 points.

This gave him an edge over the eight other athletes who figured in the final balloting for the Sullivan Trophy, regarded as the top honor that can be bestowed on an amateur athlete in this country.

Mrs. Patricia Keller McCormick, Los Angeles Athletic Club, who scored a springboard-platform diving double in 1952 Olympics, finished second for the third straight year with 144 first-place votes and 1,264 points.

Howard "Hopalong" Cassidy, Ohio State All-American football back, ranked third with 154 first place votes and 1,058 votes.

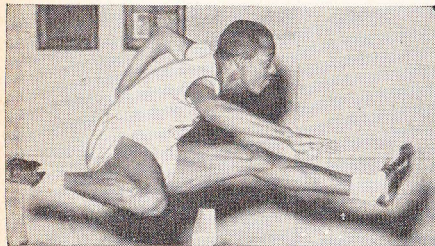

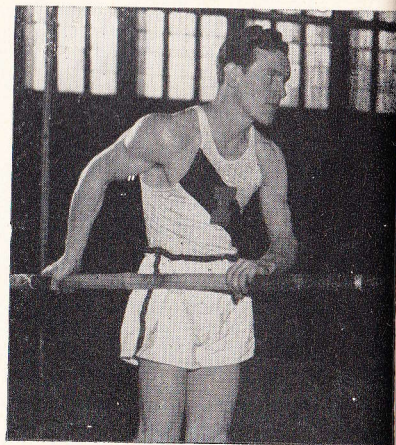

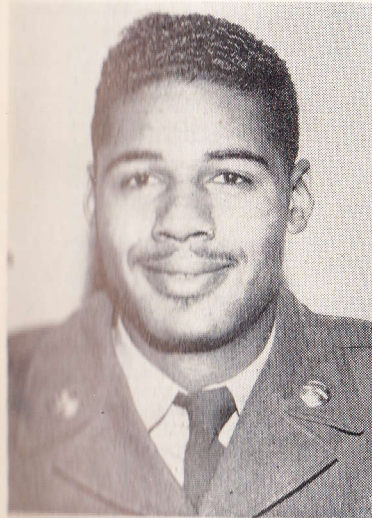

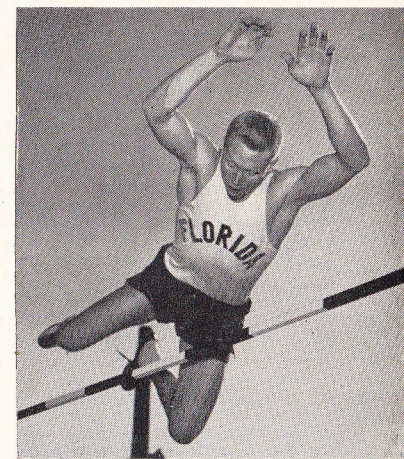
