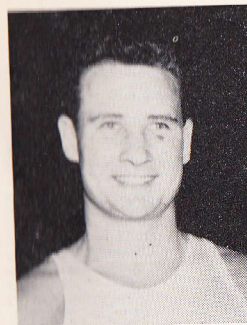

PARRY O'BRIEN WINS SULLIVAN AWARD



Parry O'Brien, 1952 and 1956 Olympic and 1955 and 1959 Pan American Games shot put champion, is the 1959 winner of the James E. Sullivan A.A.U. Memorial Trophy. O'Brien was selected by a nationwide tribunal of sports authorities participating in the 30th annual Sullivan Award poll.

The award is presented annually by the Amateur Athletic Union of the U. S. to "the amateur athlete who, by performance, example and good sportsmanship most to advance the cause of good sportsmanship during the year". It is in memory of James E. Sullivan, a founder of the A.A.U., and leader in its activities for over a quarter of a century.

The final tally of votes showed O'Brien, who represents the So. Calif. Striders, to have been first choice on 176 of the 622 ballots cast with a total of 1318 points.

Tommy T. Kono of Honolulu, 1952 Olympic 148 pound and 1956 Olympic 181 pound weightlifting champion, was runner-up with 113 first place tallies and 976 points.

Following in order were Chris von Saltza, Santa Clara S.C., with 73 firsts and 710 points; John J. Kelley of the Boston A.A., with 74 firsts and 632 points; Ray Norton, Santa Clara Youth Village sprinter, with 65 firsts and 617 points; Frank McKinney, Indianapolis A.C. backstroker with 47 firsts and 394 points; Gregory Bell, Olympic broad jump champion who represents the Fort Wayne, Indiana A.C. with 28 firsts and 316 points; Thomas Murphy of the New York A.C. with 15 first and 201 points; Terrence J. McCann of the Tulsa, Okla. Y.M.C.A., with 21 firsts and 180 points and Lucinda Williams of Tennessee A. & I., with 10 firsts and 124 points.

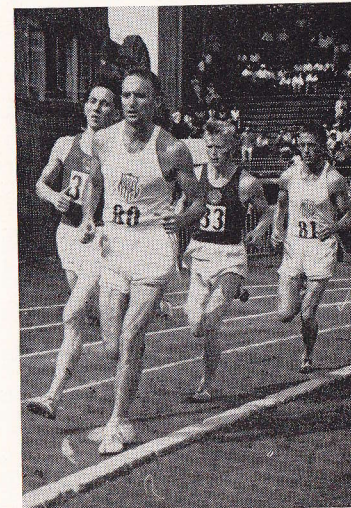

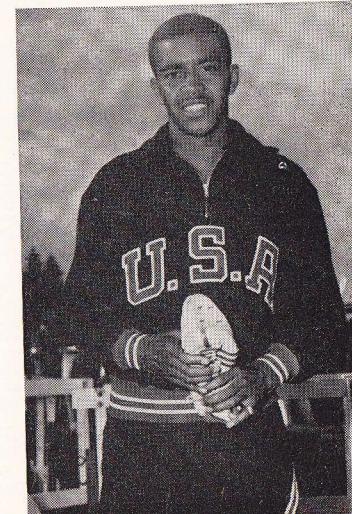

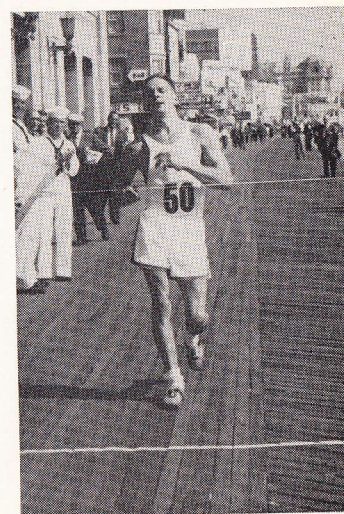

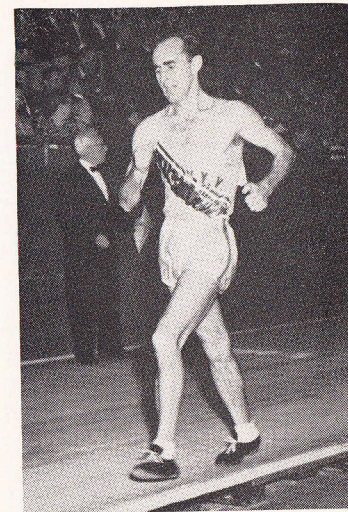

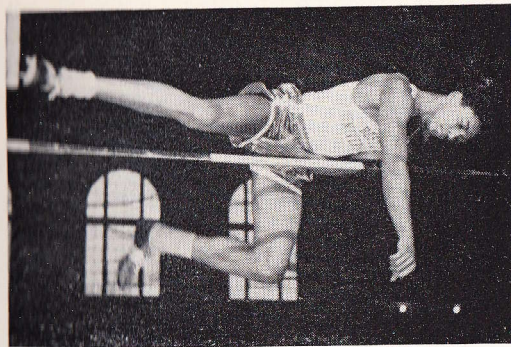


Villanova's 1960 indoor one mile relay titlists.

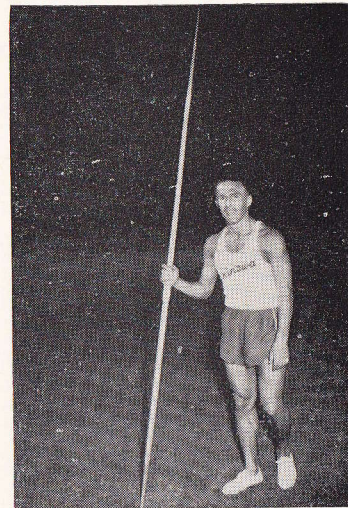
