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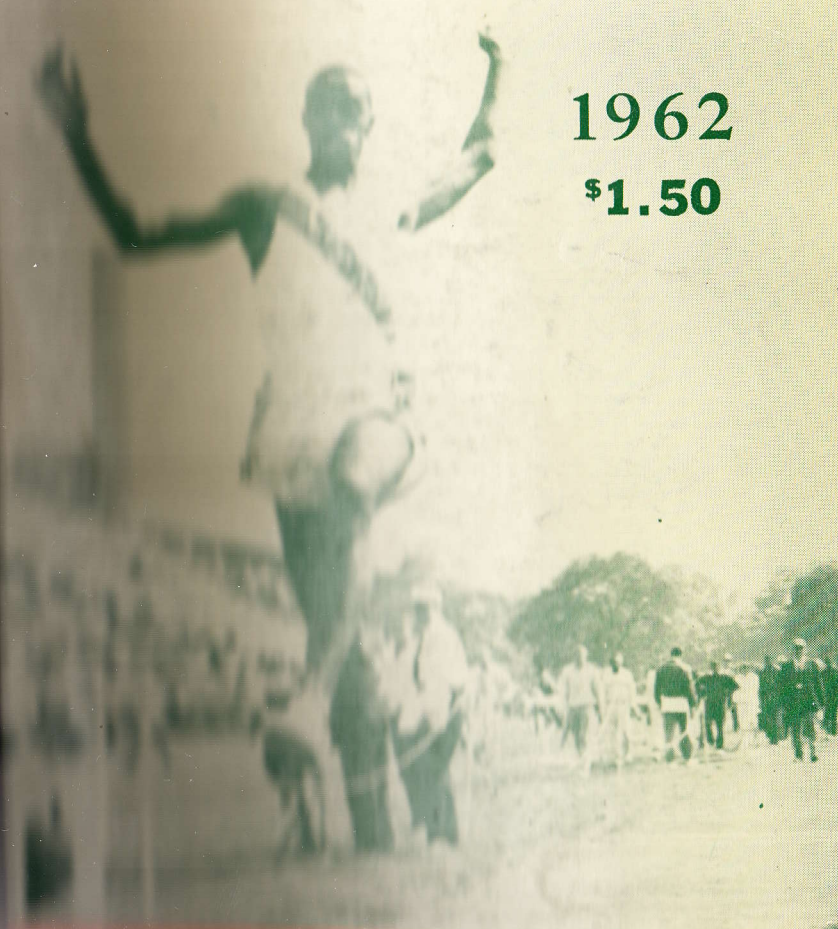

WILMA RUDOLPH WINS SULLIVAN AWARD



Wilma Rudolph Ward, 100-meter world record-holder and the outstanding woman track athlete in the United States, was voted the 1961 James E. Sullivan Award.

A senior at Tennessee State, Wilma is a native of Clarksville, Tenn.

The Sullivan Award is presented annually by the Amateur Athletic Union of the United States to "the amateur athlete who, by performance, example and good influence did the most to advance the cause of good sportsmanship during the year." It is in memory of James E. Sullivan, a founder of the A.A.U. and a leader in its activities for over a quarter of a century.

The former Wilma Rudolph who recently announced her marriage, was named first on 205 of 676 ballots, second on 161 and received 119 votes for third for a total of 1627 points, based on 5-3-1 scoring. Her total was the fourth highest number of points accumulated in the 32 years of balloting

among former Sullivan Award winners, amateur sportsmen, sportswriters and sportscasters.

A year ago Wilma was runner-up to Rafer Johnson, 1960 Olympic decathlon champion. She is only the third woman to earn the nation's most coveted award for amateur athletes. Ann Curtis, a swimmer, was named in 1944, while Mrs. Patricia Keller McCormick earned the award five years ago.

Tommy Kono, world champion weightlifter from Honolulu and a six-time nominee for the Sullivan Award, was runner-up after finishing fifth in 1960. He received 149 first place and a total of 1104 points.

In third place was the world broad jump champion, Ralph Boston, Laurel, Miss., 113 first place votes and 1068 points, followed by All-American basketball player from Ohio State, Jerry Lucas, Middletown, Ohio, 77 first place votes and 739 points; Chet Jastremski, an Indiana University swimmer from Toledo who holds four world breaststroke records, 60 first place votes and 569 points.

Sixth was Frank Budd, new world recordholder for the 100 yards sprint and a student at Villanova University who lives in Asbury Park, N. J., 44 first place votes and 491 points, followed by Donna de Varona, Lafayette, Calif., holder of two world records in swimming for the individual medley, 15 first places votes and 190 points, and finally Barbara Jean Galleher, Dallas, Texas, a national gymnastics champion, 13 first place votes and 140 points.

Miss Rudolph equaled the world record for 100 meters in winning her specialty against the USSR at Moscow, July 15, and then four days later in Stuttgart, Germany, was clocked in 11.2 seconds for a new record. She also anchored the United States women's 440-meter relay team to a world record of 44.3 seconds in defeating the USSR at Moscow.

In the National A.A.U. championships, Wilma won the 100 yards dash crown both indoors and outdoors in 1961 after winning both the 100- and 200-meter sprints and anchoring the winning United States 400-meter women's relay team in the 1960 Olympic Games at Rome.

Earlier this year Miss Rudolph was awarded the 1961 Columbus Award of the City of Genoa, Italy, for her outstanding contribution to athletics. The only other individual athlete to have been selected for this trophy was the Russian distance runner, Vladimir Kuts in 1958.

In an Associated Press poll this year, Wilma Rudolph was named Woman Athlete for 1961.

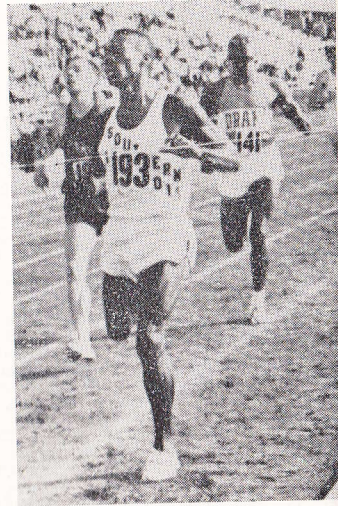

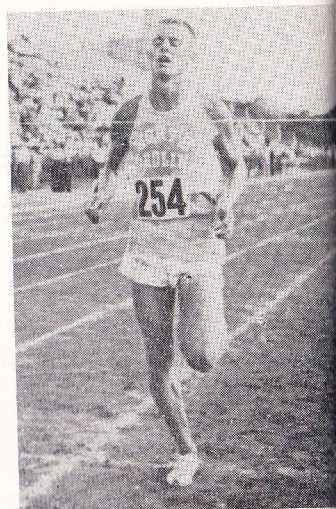
