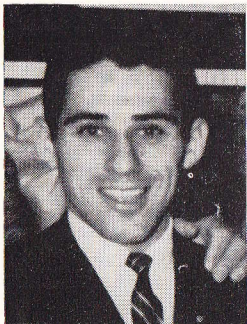

# JIM BEATTY WINS 1962 A.A.U. SULLIVAN AWARD



James Tully Beatty, fastest miler in the United States track history, was voted the 1962 A.A.U. James E. Sullivan Award.

The 27-year old public relations executive for an insurance company now resides in Los Angeles and is a graduate of the University of North Carolina in 1957. He has been chosen as "the amateur athlete who, by performance, example, and good influence did the most to advance the cause of good sportsmanship during the year." The award is made annually in memory of James E. Sullivan, a founder and former president of the A.A.U.

Beatty completely dominated the balloting conducted among a blue ribbon tribunal of amateur sportsmen, former winners of the award, sports-writers and radio and television sportscasters. He was named first on 329 of 636 ballots, second on 111, and third on 74 for a total of 2,459 points based on a 5-3-1 scoring system. This ranks among the three highest point totals accumulated by the winner in the 33 years of balloting.

For the second straight year the runner up was Tommy Kono of Honolulu, holder of more world records than any other weightlifter in the history of the sport. A seven-time nominee for Sullivan Award honors, Kono was named on 116 first place ballots, second on 104 and third on 120 for 1,007 points.

He is married to the former Barbara A. Harmon. They have no children.

The other six nominees finished as follows, with the number of first place votes for each indicated in parentheses:

Chet Jastrowski, Toledo, O., and Indiana University, winner of four National A.A.U. swimming titles and holder of three world marks in the breaststroke (95), 935 points; Carolyn House, Los Angeles, 17-year old distance freestyle swimmer and winner of three National A.A.U. individual titles (30), 545 points; Gary Gubner, New York, 19-year old National A.A.U. indoor and outdoor shot put champion and runner up for A.A.U. heavyweight weightlifting laurels (27), 414 points; Bob Hayes, Jacksonville, Fla. and Florida A&M track and football standout (12) 215 points; Vivian Brown, Cleveland, O., and Tennessee State's National A.A.U. indoor and outdoor 220-yard champion (16), 205 points; and Barbara McAlister, Phoenix, Ariz., National A.A.U. diving champion (12), 153 points.

Beatty's performances in 1962 are without parallel in American track history. He was credited with seven American records (six outdoor and one indoor), including a world mark of 8:29.8 for the two miles in the Southern Pacific A.A.U. championships at Los Angeles, June 8, 1962.

Other American records set by Beatty, all established on a European trip with his teammates from the Los Angeles Track Club this summer, included a 3:39.4 clocking for the 1500 meters at Oslo, Norway, Aug. 9; 3:56.3 for the one-mile run at Helsinki, Finland, Aug. 21; 7:54.2 for the 3000 meters at Avranches, France, Aug. 15; and at Turku, Finland, Aug. 24 he wound up his tour by setting two records in a single race by covering three miles in 13:19.2 on his way to a 13:45.0 effort for the 5000 meters.

Beatty is the first runner to hold simultaneously all American records from 1500 meters through 5000 meters.

His seventh and final American mark was a 3:58.9 performance at Los Angeles, Feb. 10, when he became the first man to break the four-minute barrier for the mile run indoors.

Other honors garnered by the peerless runner include the L. di Benedetto Award from the A.A.U. Track and Field Committee for the outstanding performance at home or abroad for any American track and field performer and selection by the Junior Chamber of Commerce as one of the ten outstanding young men of 1962.

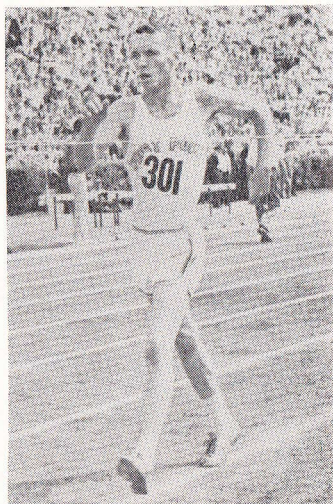
Hayes Jones, 60 yard high hurdles winner.

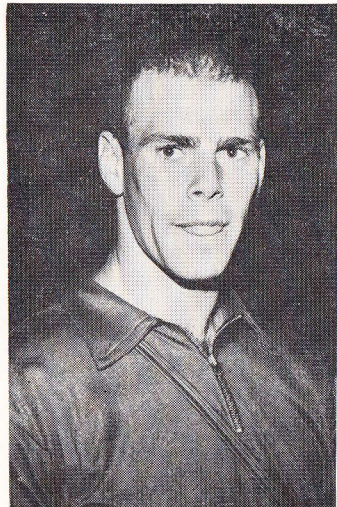

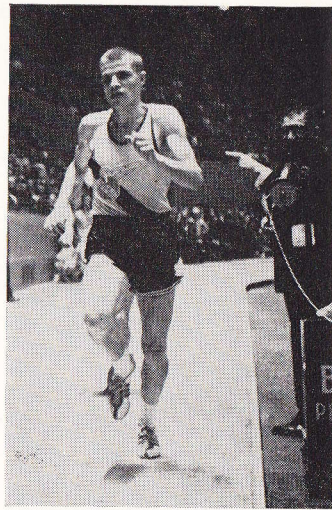

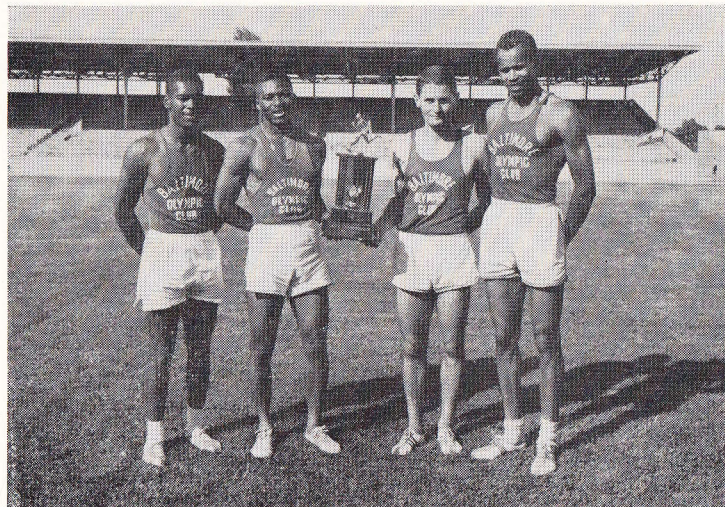

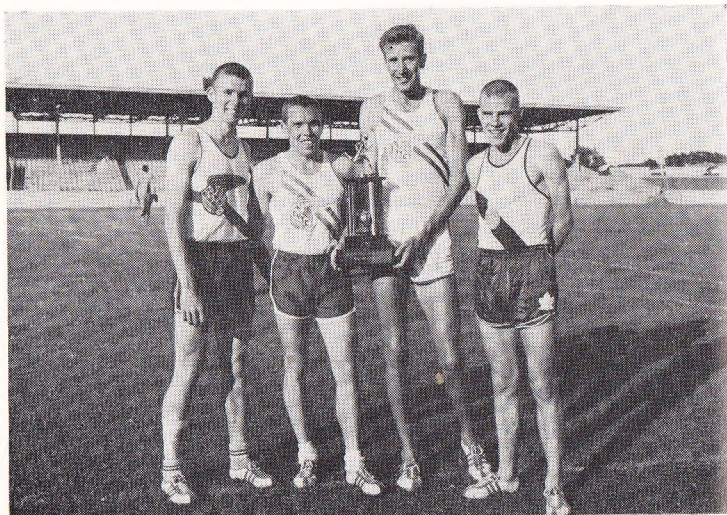

## WOMEN'S TRACK AND FIELD

The basic rules for Women's Track and Field are the same as Men's Rules with the following exceptions:

### RULE LXI

1. In order to be eligible for participation in any A.A.U. sanctioned track and field competition (local, regional or national) an athlete must be 14 years of age or older on the date of competition.

2. Girls' competition is open to all registered athletes 14 to 17 years, inclusive.

3. Women's competition is open to all registered athletes 14 years or over.

4. Competition for girls under 14 years of age is restricted to the age group program. (See Rule LX-F).

Note—For Junior Olympics refer to A.A.U. Junior Olympics section of Track and Field Handbook.
