Al Hall of Cornell made the team on his last throw in the hammer, going from 4th to 1st place. Marty Engel was on the team until the last round when Hall and Cliff Blair passed him, moving him from 2nd th 4th.

Although the actual measured height of Charles Dumas winning jump was 7 ft. 5/8 in. it will be listed as 7 ft/ 1/2 in. since all track and field rules specify that 1/4-inch units be used for measurements below 100 feet and 1/2-inch units be used above 100 feet.
